Kentucky has a mandatory seat belt law so please buckle up!

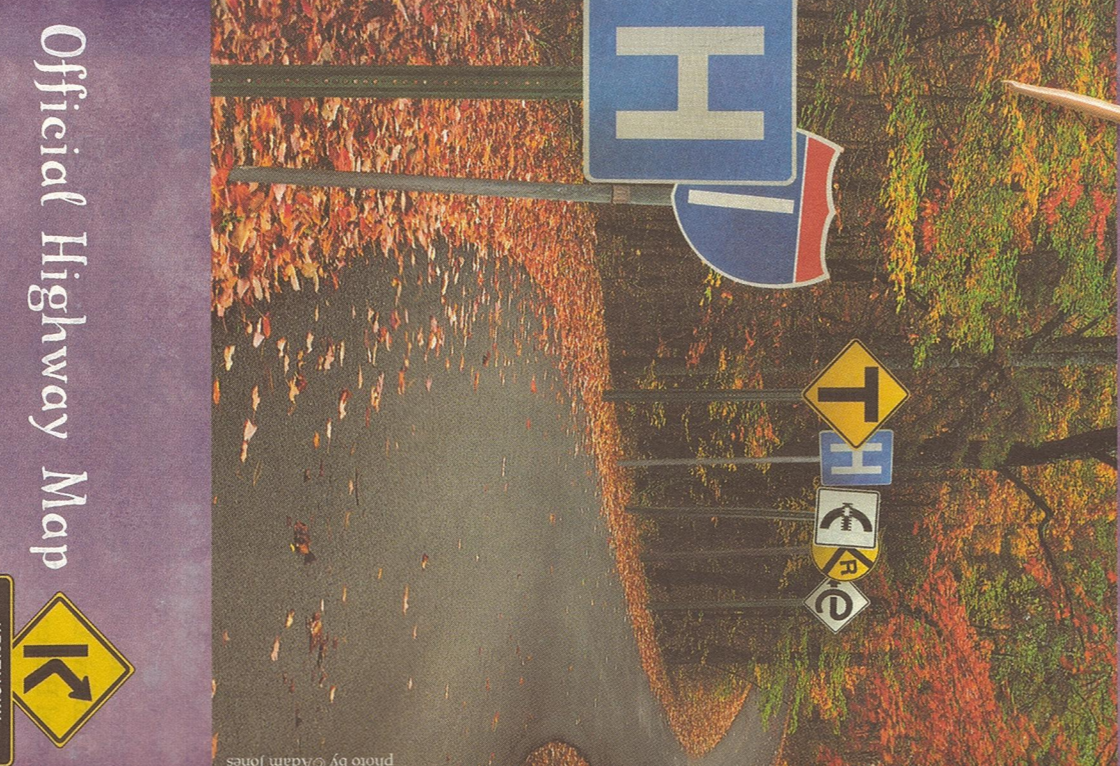
Turning

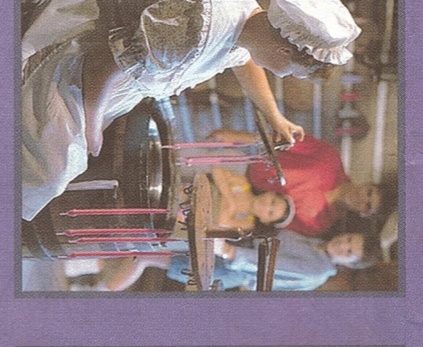
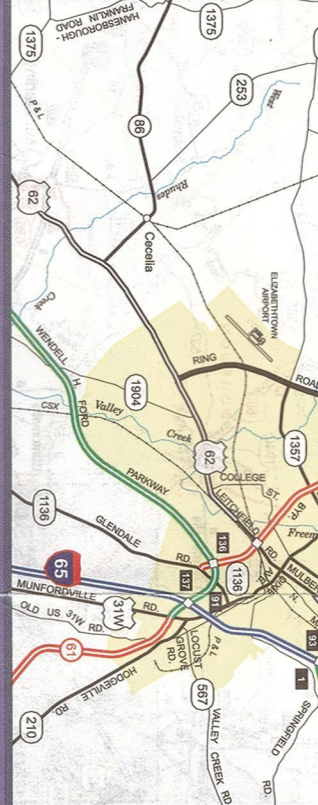
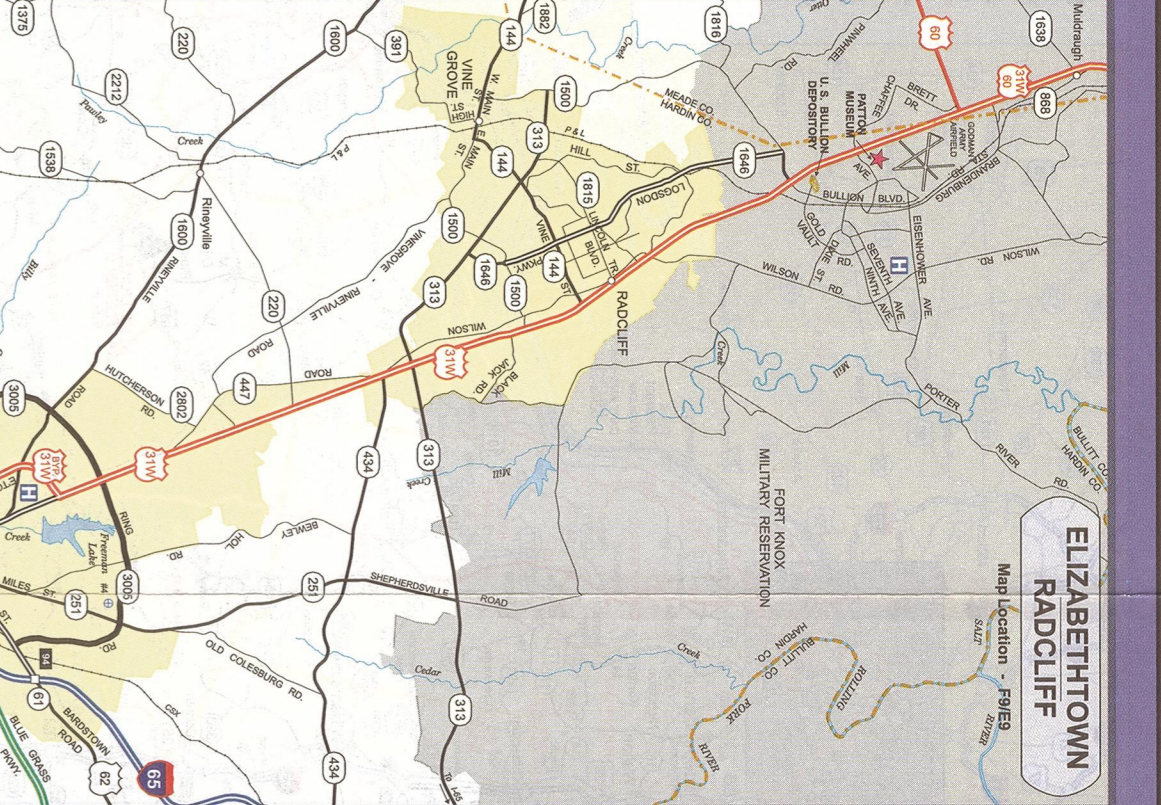
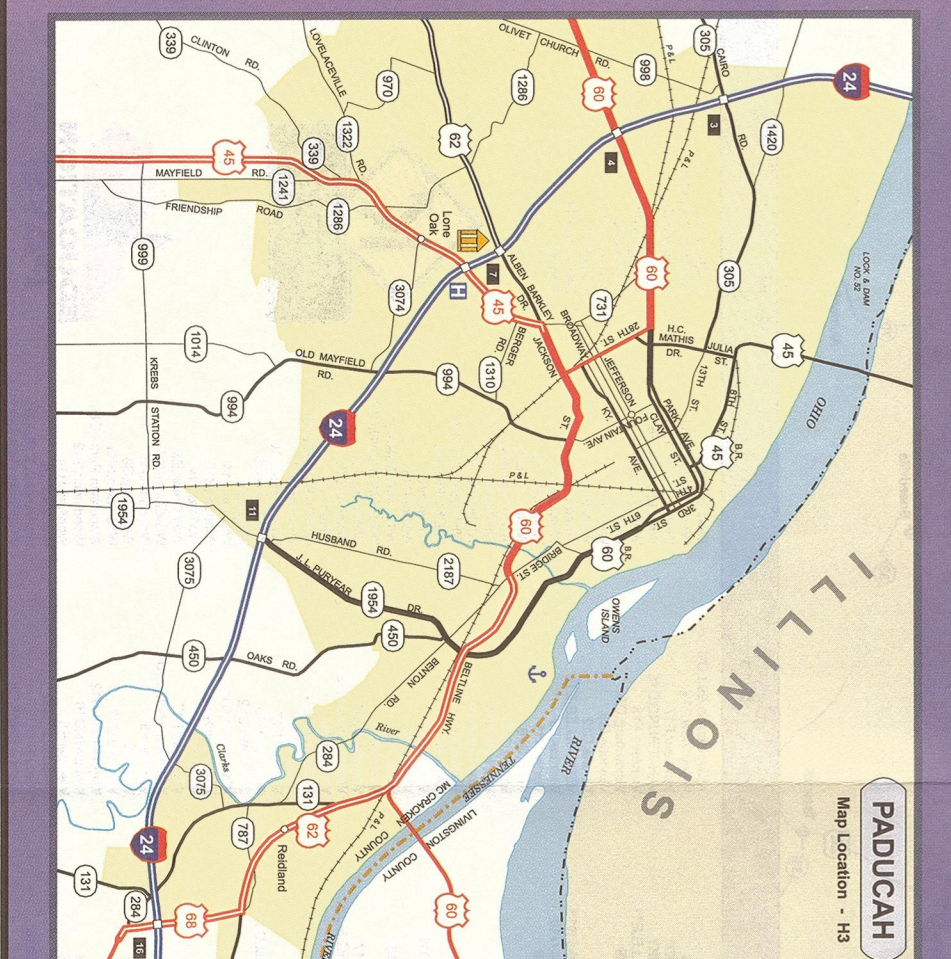
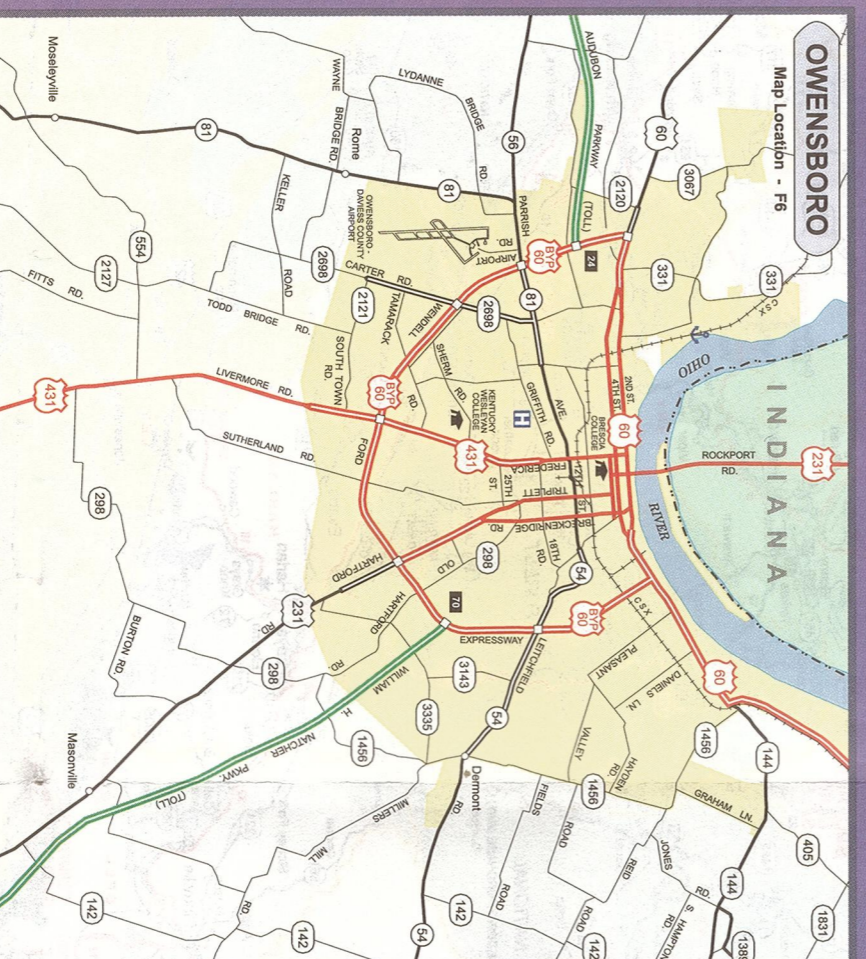
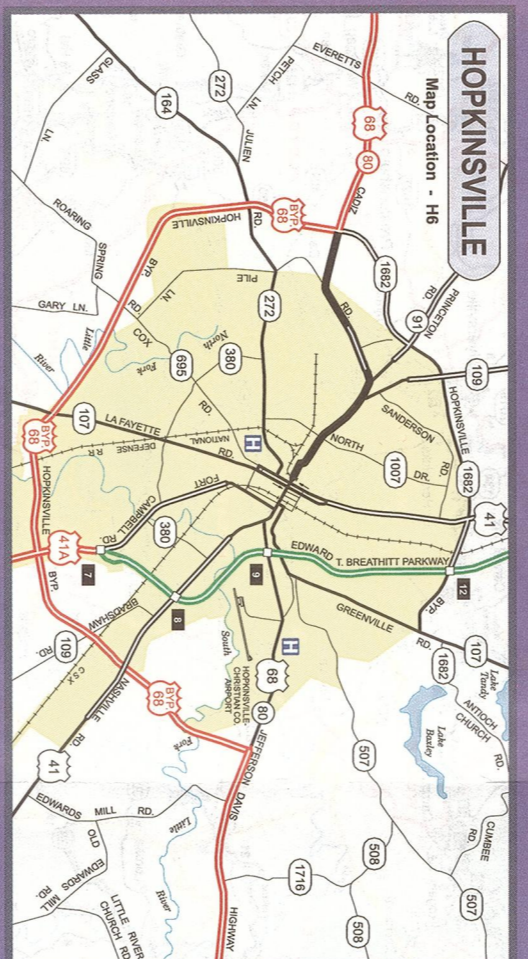
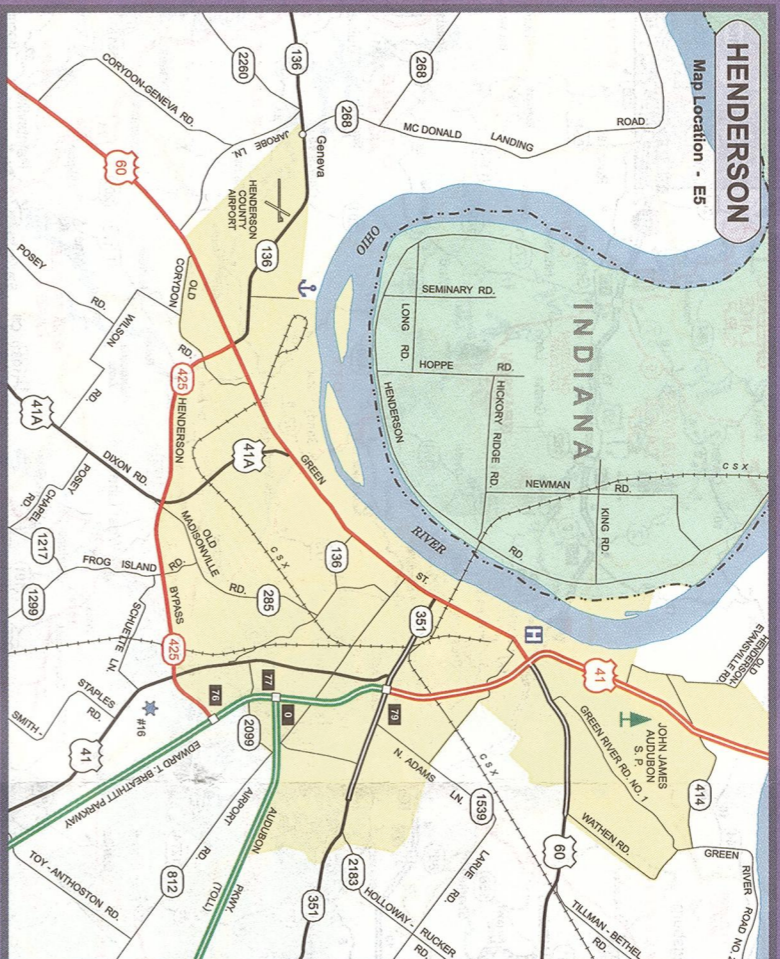
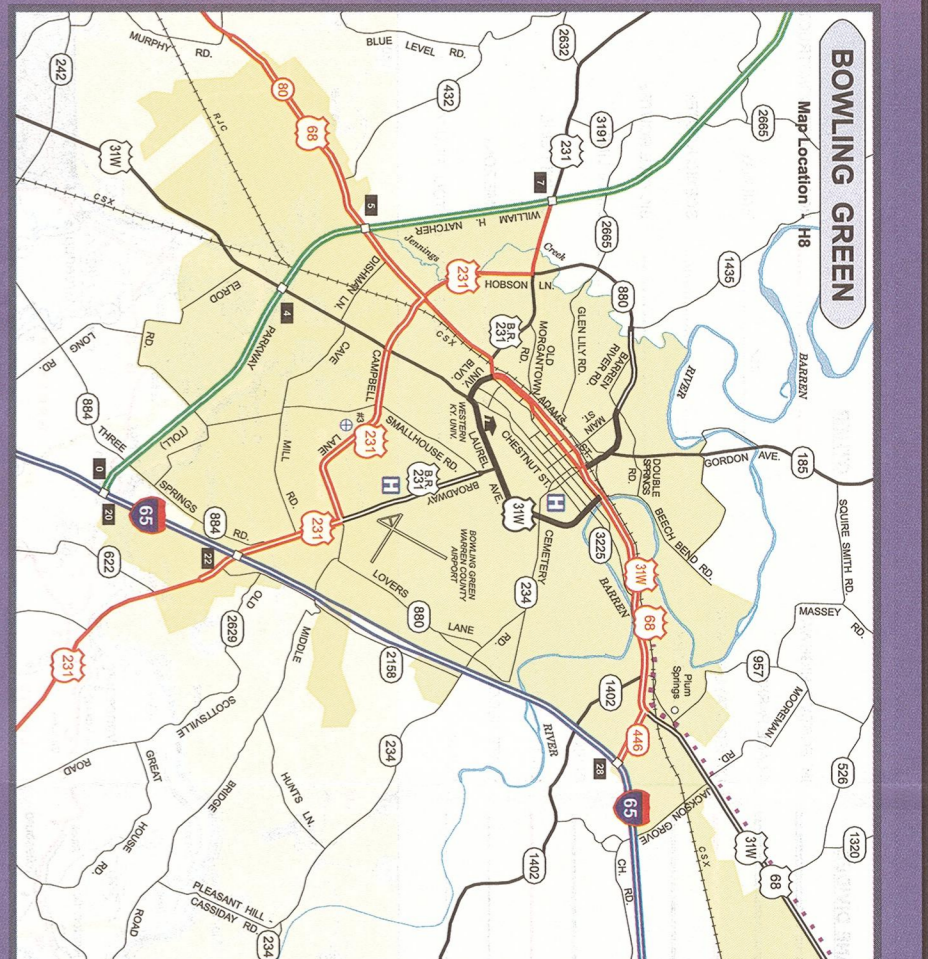


Official Highway Map

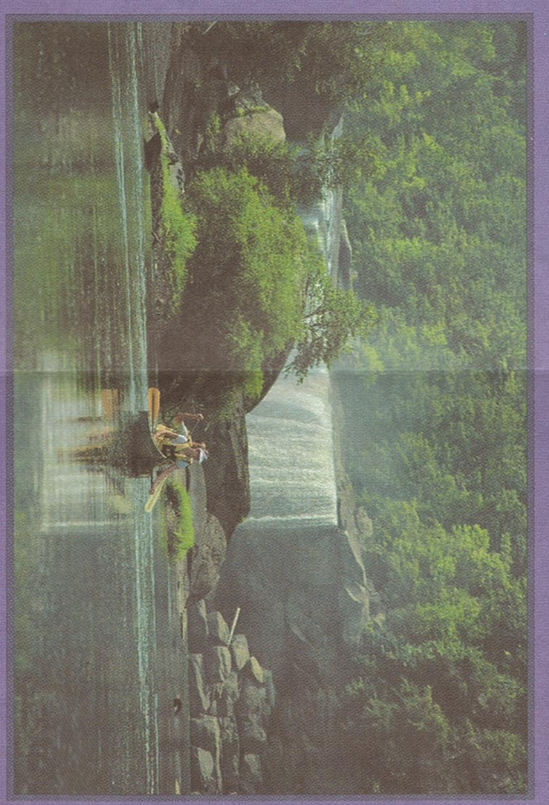
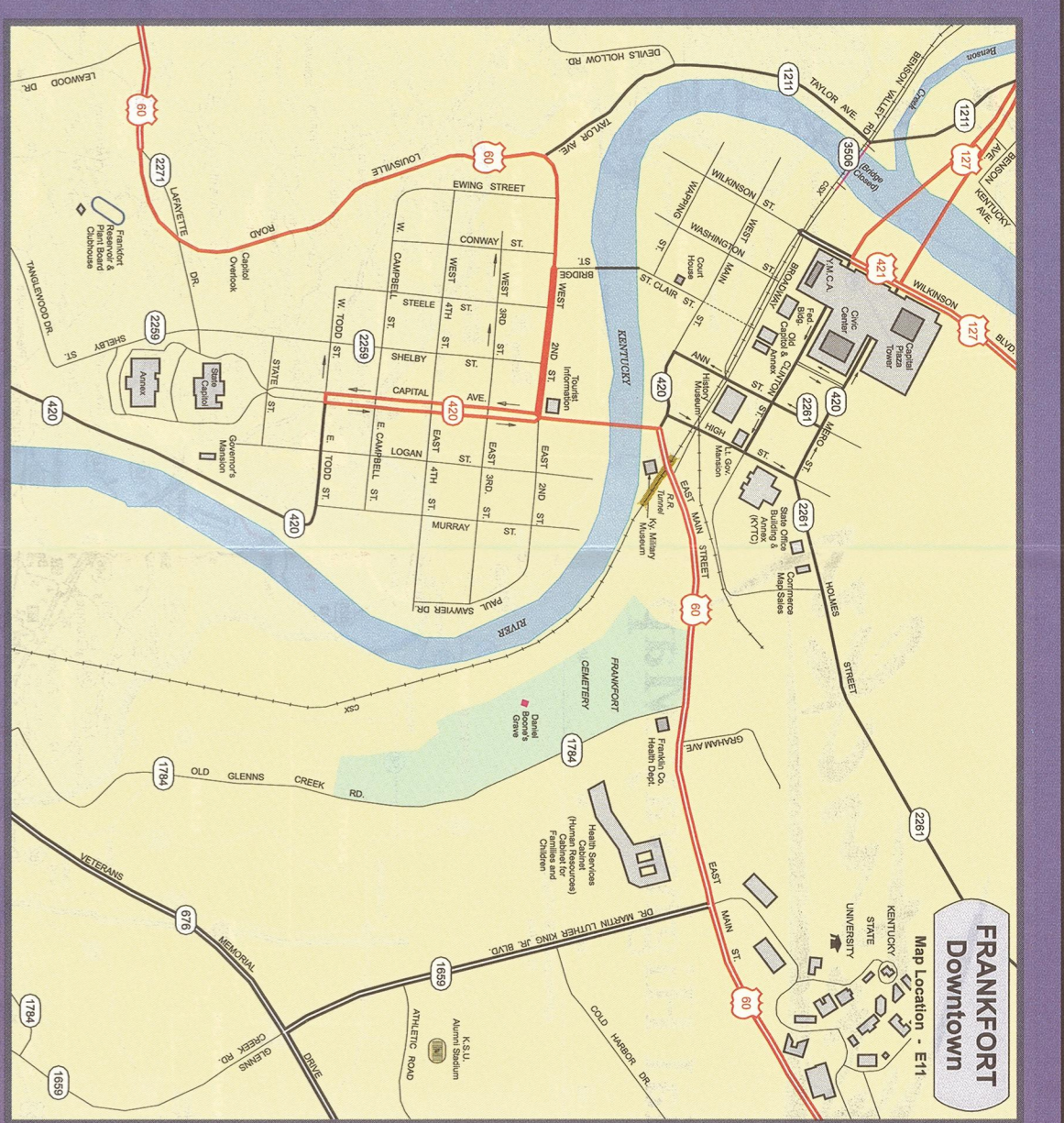

RULES FOR BICYCLISTS

- Bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as motorists.
- Wearing a bicycle helmet is strongly recommended.
- Ride a bicycle on the right side of the road in the same direction as other traffic - in the right side of your lane. Extreme caution should be used when moving out into the center of the road.
- Obey traffic signals and signs.
- Use hand signals to communicate your actions to motor vehicles.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks. Give an audible warning (bell, horn, or voice) before passing pedestrians, especially on a shared use path. Never park a bicycle on a sidewalk obstructing pedestrian traffic.
- A light - a bicycle must have a white light visible from the front and a red reflector or light visible from the rear. Reflector tape may be used for added visibility. Wear light colored clothing.
- Sidewalk bicycle riding is not recommended for adult bicyclists.
- It is recommended children and novice bicyclists ride on a bicycle path or bicycle lane adjacent to the roadway, where one is available.
- Never use interstate and Parkway systems for bicycling.

RULES FOR MOTORISTS CONCERNING BICYCLES

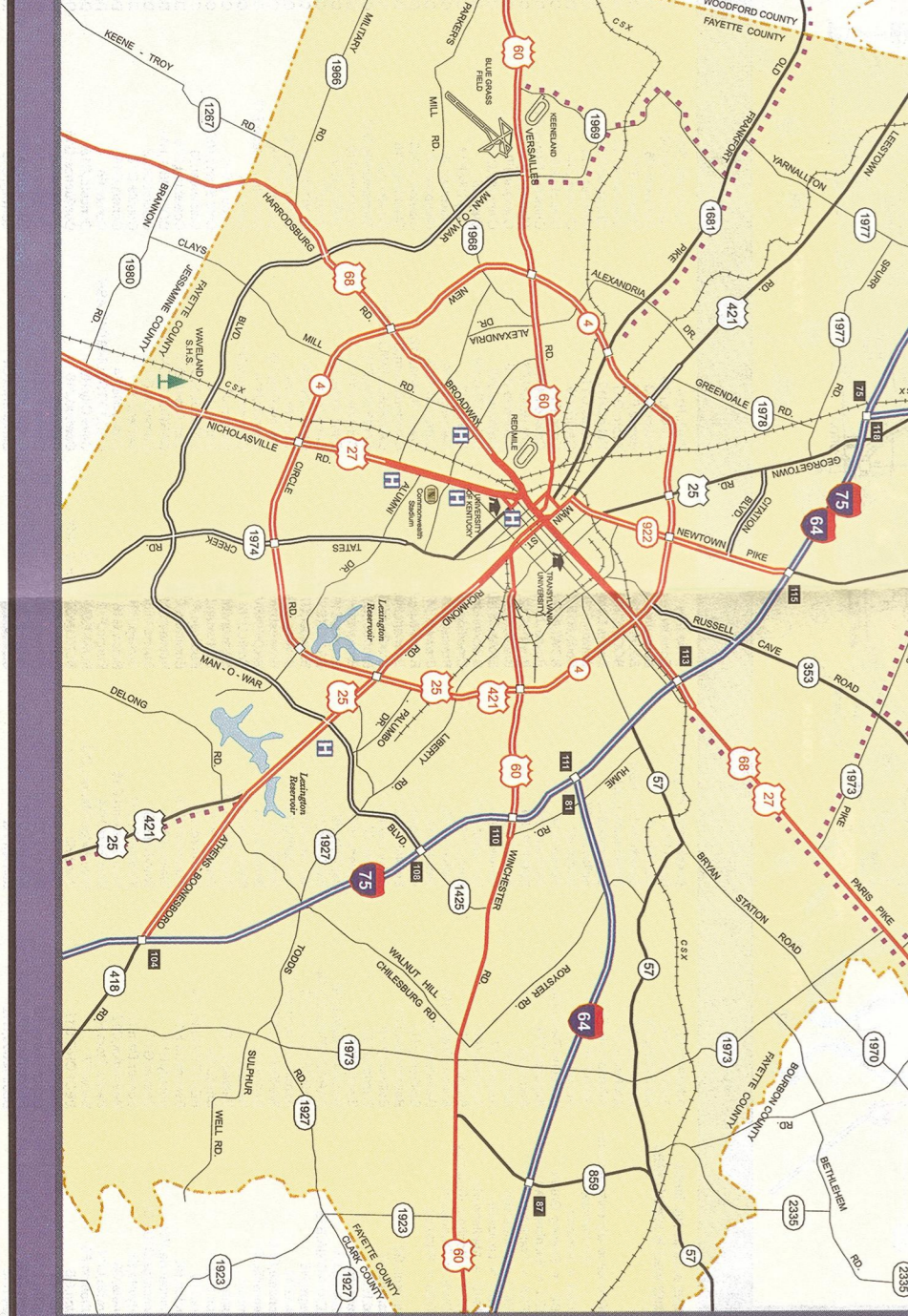
- Share the road with bicycles.
- Pass a bicyclist only when it is safe, giving ample room (three feet between your car and the bicyclist) and when there is no oncoming traffic.
- Look for bicyclists. Because of their narrow profile, you will need to develop your eye-scanning patterns to include bicyclists.
- When opening the door of your parked car, check behind for bicyclists.
- Remember: Bicyclists have the same rights, rules, and responsibilities as all other highway users.
