Re: Old Henry Road Extension

Dear Mike:

Since about 2000, there has been active discussion and planning by the Cabinet for a road around Crestwood, linking Old Henry Road in Jefferson County to Hwy 224 in Oldham County. This road has been variously known as the "Old Henry Extension" or the "Crestwood Bypass". In fact, when Bill Monholland started with the Transportation Cabinet as a young engineer, his first job was to begin discussions with Crestwood leaders about this road. Bill has been retired from KYTC for about 7 years.


The cost of that project and activity that has taken place in the intervening years (e.g., placement of property on the National Historic Register) combine to make it unlikely that the project will be funded or completed in the near future. That is unfortunate because the road would result in a major traffic improvement for Oldham County commuters. But in the meantime an interim proposal has presented itself and the purpose of this letter is to ask you to consider it seriously. The proposal is to extend the present Old Henry Road in Jefferson County to Ash Avenue in Oldham County. This would siphon traffic from Hwy 146 and from shortcuts that drivers are presently using through crowded subdivisions. It would also provide needed relief for the commercial development taking place in eastern Jefferson County.

We would be glad to meet with members of your staff to provide specifics for this proposal which is so important to both our communities.


Here is what we left the meeting hoping were our action items:

1. You will look into what we can do to create a two lane road to connect the approximate 2000' between Old Henry and Hawley Gibson Road. All we are looking for now is the simplest thing that would open up a couple of lanes connections as soon as possible.
2. MOA to allow creation of an east bound passing lane at Hwy 146 and Hwy 393 along the area known as the Buckner Mall.
3. A stop light at KY 22 & KY 329 (Waldeck Farm).
4. You will set an appointment for us with Brian Meade to review our pending road projects.

We also discussed the turning lane work at KY 22 and KY 146 in Crestwood.

We are looking forward to your annual visit to Oldham Fiscal Court to review our rural and secondary road plans and appreciate all the help you have given me thus far and as both magistrate and county judge.
