The free format page in your response should be used for information pertaining to the inspection fee.</p> <p>The inspection fee must be one (1) hourly rate, which includes visual inspection and testing. The rate is to be</p>

the same for straight time and overtime. The rate should also include all overhead, travel and per diem expenses. The rate will apply to travel time and inspection at the bridge. Note, the rate will apply to one time round trip travel from home or office to job site and return. Daily or weekly commuting time will not be paid.

The inspector must be qualified by successfully completing the Kentucky Qualified Bridge Coating Inspector Training and show experience and understanding of surface preparation, coating applications, and workmanship in regard to bridge painting inspections.

It is preferred that the inspector be:

- SSPC Protective Coatings Specialist (PCS) trained,
- SSPC C3 (Supervisor/Competent Person Training for Deleading of Industrial Structures) trained,
- Trained in OSHA requirements for, but not limited to: fall protection, horizontal lifelines, lead abatement, and respiratory requirements,
- Familiar with environmental regulations.

Note: Individual inspectors who have equivalent training and experience may be authorized to perform QA inspections. The Division of Construction, Central Office, will make this authorization on an individual basis.

This contract will be in effect for one year, with the option to renew said contract for a second year.

SCOPE	<p>It is estimated that there will be four to ten steel bridges at various locations throughout the state which will require approximately 5000 man/hours of inspection.</p> <p>The consultant will provide complete quality assurance (QA) field inspections of specified bridge maintenance coating projects for the 2002 painting season. The inspections will include, but are not limited to: inspect all work for acceptance, document work activities and complete daily reports, provide visual and instrument inspections of surface preparation and coating applications to ensure conformance to applicable specifications, containment and emissions monitoring, monitor work for compliance with KYOSHA, OSHA, EPA and state guidelines as specified.</p>
