

Listed below are corrections and clarifications for projects included in the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Procurement Bulletin for Engineering and Related Services, Bulletin No. 2002-10 dated June 7, 2002.

Location Maps - Please click on the underlined text to view the project location maps.

Pendleton County, 6-1048

QUESTION: The project length is listed as 0.1 mile long although the Location Map shows a much longer corridor for the project area. Which is correct?

ANSWER: For the purpose of this ad, you should use the 0.1 mile. This may change after the consultant is selected at the Pre-Design Conference.

Ballard/McCracken County, 1-115

QUESTION: Does project begin one mile east of KY 310 as stated in the description or approximately one mile further east as shown on the location map?

ANSWER: Project begins one mile east of KY 310.

QUESTION: Is there a separate project between Bethel Church Road and the end of the existing 4-lane section of US 60 approximately one mile east of this point or does this project tie to the existing 4-lane section?

ANSWER: Yes, this project is Item No. 1-115.10 which is being designed in-house.

QUESTION: There is a conflict in the schedule milestone dates. What are the proposed dates for Preliminary Line and Grade Inspection and Final Joint Inspection?

ANSWER: PL&G - October 1, 2003 Final Joint Inspection - July 1, 2004

Carter County, 9-144

QUESTION: Prequalification Requirements list Rural Roadway Design but the project is located in an urban area with urban typical section. Should Urban Roadway Design be the

requirement?

ANSWER: Urban Roadway Design should be the requirement.

STATEWIDE Geotechnical Drilling Services

QUESTION: The question is in regards to line item 17 - Reclamation: Material Cost for all three regions. Since the bid specs specify that all reclamation materials are to be paid at cost, and list maximum amounts per item not to exceed. Should this item be left blank? There are no quantities listed, and honestly there is no way of even making an approximation since all jobs are different.

ANSWER: Yes, line 17 is to be left blank. Look under Evaluation Factors #1.
