METHOD OF DESIGN	The selected consultant shall utilize the CADD Standards for Highway Plans (version 2.04) policy in the development of the Highway Plans.

SCOPE The selected consultant will be required to provide engineering services for an access management study and Phase II final roadway design, including the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans and cost estimates.
