The Indiana Department of Transportation and Kentucky Transportation Cabinet are excited to announce a partnership to allow certified Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) firms from each state to work on federally-funded projects in the other state without having to apply for an extra certification.

DBE firms must be pre-qualified in accordance with the requirements of the state where the project is located.

WHY FORM THIS PARTNERSHIP?

- To remove regulatory and administrative barriers to DBE participation on federally-funded projects
- To increase opportunities for DBE firms
- To bring together certified DBEs and prime contractors
- To create access to a larger pool of projects, ultimately helping DBE firms to become prime contractors

DETAILS OF THE DEAL

- The initial length of the agreement is one year, beginning July 1st, 2018, with the option to extend it for an additional four years
- All DBEs operating under the agreement are subject to all policies, statutes and regulations, including the DBE regulations under 49 C.F.R. Part 26
- The agreement does not grant interstate certification
- DBE firms must comply with all applicable local and state guidance, statues, regulations, and policies applicable to the work performed in the state where the project takes place

DBEs GET

- Access to bid on more jobs
- The opportunity to bid as a prime contractor
- Access to support from both states and DBE support services
- The opportunity to foster new business relationships
- Opportunities for growth

PRIMES GET

- The opportunity to reach DBE participation goals
- Reduced construction costs
- The ability to bid more projects knowing DBE firms with be available in each state
- A large pool of DBE firms to work with



Step-by-Step Process

Starting a New Application on DBE Online

- 1) Enter your Federal Tax ID
- 2) Enter Basic Contact Information
- 3) Prior Certifications and Applications
 - Have you ever applied for DBE/ACDBE certification?
 - If you are certified in your home state as a DBE/ACDBE, you do not have to complete this application for other states.
- 4) Supporting Documentation
 - i.e. Signed Affidavit, Resume, Up-to-date Personal Net Worth Statement, Licenses/Permits, Federal and Personal Tax Returns for over the past three years, and any other documents submitted to the home state for certification.
- 5) Submit all required documents. You will be contacted by a Program Investigative Officer.

Under Federal Regulation 49 CFR 26.83(j), you are required to submit an Annual "No Change Affidavit" verifying that no changes have occurred in your firm. Your Annual No Change Affidavit is due on or before your original date of certification each calendar year. The items required for submission include the "No Change Affidavit," a current list of NAICS business codes, previous year balance sheet, business license or certifications (if applicable), and previous year Federal Business taxes.



Kentucky Procurement Technical Assistance Center (KYPTAC) can help verify that a business is correctly registered in the government contract award system. The System for Award Management (SAM) allows qualifying companies to do business with the government. PTAC specialists can assist with registrations in other Federal, State, and Local government databases. PTAC also helps to determine eligibility for special certifications which may create unique work opportunities with government agencies.





Qualifying for PTAC

- Must be a KY-based business
- Have email/internet access
- Complete KYPTAC application
- Complete yearly surveys
- Desire to sell to the government
- Potential to sell to the government
- Must be in business 2 or more years

Services Offered

Determining Government Contracting Feasibility:

PTAC specialists can help assess a company's readiness for pursuing the unique challenges associated with federal, state, and local government contracting. Assessing a company's readiness allows them to better position the company for success.

Marketing Strategy:

PTAC can advise on developing an effective marketing strategy for getting contracts.

U.S. Small Business Administration

Prior to becoming a DBE you should consider contacting the Small Business Administration (SBA) for assistance.

In the Small Business Act of July 1953, Congress created the Small Business Administration, whose function is to "aid, counsel, assist, and protect, insofar as is possible, the interests of small business concerns." The charter also stipulates that SBA would ensure small businesses a "fair proportion" of government contracts and sales of surplus property.

SBA provides assistance primarily through its four programmatic functions:

- Access to Capital (Business Financing)
- **Entrepreneurial Development** (Education, Information, Technical Assistance & Training)
- Government Contracting (Federal Procurement)
- Advocacy (Voice for Small Business)

Small Business Loan Program

Criterion:

- Have 50 or fewer employees
- Businesses engaged in manufacturing, agribusiness or services and technology
- At least one new full time job must be created by the business within one (1) year of the loan closing
- Loan range \$15,000 \$100,000
- Loan terms are 3 10 years depending on the project
- Loans can be used for up to 100% of the project costs or be used in conjunction with other lenders
