# About the Dry Stone Conservancy's Referral List of Professional Drystone Masons

The mission of the Dry Stone Conservancy is to revive and promote the ancient craft of dry stone masonry and to preserve existing dry stone structures. The Referral List is provided to assist contractors, agencies and the public in locating qualified dry stone masons, and thereby to reinstate public confidence in the use of drystone masonry, the technology of building in stone without mortar.

In May 1995, the Dry Stone Conservancy began registering drystone masons who had taken a two to five-day training course and later had their independently built work inspected and approved by an examiner.

In November 2001, to address faults and weaknesses in the registration process, the Conservancy replaced registration with certification by developing the multi-level Certification Program for Professional Dry Stone Masons© and establishing the Referral List of Certified Professional Dry Stone Masons©. Certified status is more difficult to achieve than registration, requiring a rigorous training period and fully monitored and regulated timed examinations.


The *certification* process includes examinations at three levels of certification: Basic Drystone Mason, Journeyman Drystone Mason and Master Drystone Craftsman (see page two and three for detailed requirements). All certification exams include building a specified length of freestanding rock fence (stone wall) within 8 hours in the presence of the examiner(s) as well as additional un-timed special features and written/oral sections that assess the candidates' knowledge of structural theories. Accredited examiners judge all certification requirements according to internationally accepted standards in drystone construction.

Conservancy certified (and registered) drystone masons are considered "specialty contractors" by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet and are pre-qualified to bid drystone specialty work for state highway projects.

The Dry Stone Conservancy does not manage or employ masons; all are independent craftsmen. Before hiring, clients are advised to check the masons' previous work, contact their references and inquire about insurance coverage.

Please let us know if any of the masons do not respond in some way to your inquiry.

A Note About Conservancy Project Partnerships

A major goal of the Dry Stone Conservancy is to provide immediate as well as long-term options for the

conservation of Kentucky's historic rock fences and America's drystone heritage. One of the means by which this is accomplished is through skills training to develop professional dry stone masons. We encourage you to contact the trained and certified dry stone masons above for your project, keeping in mind that many are quite

willing to travel and will team up with other masons for larger projects.

For unusually large and complicated projects, especially those involving important historic resources and structural drystone masonry, you may be also interested in talking with the Conservancy about the possibility of a training project partnership. The Conservancy typically undertakes restoration projects for governmental agencies at publicly-owned historic sites and occasionally with private owners for projects that fit our training program objectives. These project partnerships are an important means by which aspiring masons involved in the Conservancy's certification process are able to gain work site experience under the direct supervision of master drystone craftsmen, journeymen and experienced drystone mentors. From a project management perspective, the Conservancy operates much like a design-build firm with consultation services that include condition assessment, project scope, construction design, specifications and cost estimates as well as project administration and construction.

Conservancy training project partners include the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, Kentucky State Parks, Louisville Metro Parks, the Olmsted Parks Conservancy, the Heritage Foundation of Franklin Tennessee, Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens of Akron Ohio, the City of Fredericksburg Virginia and the National Park Service at historic battlefields, canals, trails and parks in Maryland, Virginia, Washington DC, Maine, Colorado, Montana, Texas, Kansas and California, as well as many other dedicated individuals and organizations working to preserve America's drystone heritage.

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#### A Statement of Conservancy Goals

Dry stone construction, the ancient craft of building enduring stone structures without mortar, was widely practiced in frontier America. Skilled masons from across Europe built houses, barns, harbor piers, canal locks, and many other kinds of structures from local stone. In central Kentucky's Bluegrass Region, nineteenth-century Irish, Scots, and English masons quarried limestone to build many dry stone structures, including hundreds of miles of rock fences. They passed these skills on to African-American freedmen who after the Civil War contributed to rock fence construction across the region. Kentucky's rock fences became the region's hallmark—providing both practical and aesthetic enclosures while symbolizing the talented crafts work of revered ancestors.

Over the past century the dry stone craft has been nearly lost, as masons and builders have come to rely on cement mortars to build with brick and concrete block. Ironically, dry stone construction is often more durable than work that utilizes mortar, and is unquestionably more aesthetic. Few contemporary masons understand the art and science of dry stone construction and cannot properly repair old stone structures. Consequently, as the region's rock fences and other structures are threatened by deferred maintenance or suburban expansion, Kentuckians are at risk of losing these signature landscape features forever.

The Dry Stone Conservancy was formed in 1995 by a group of central Kentucky citizens concerned for the preservation of old stone structures. The Conservancy's primary goals are to: 1. Revive and maintain the lost craft of dry stone construction, 2: Conserve existing dry stone structures through repair and reconstruction, and 3. Advocate for public education on the craft of dry stone construction.

Within these primary goals, the Conservancy will strive to foster the following enabling objectives:

#### The Craft of Dry Stone Construction

- Identify master masons who are skilled in dry stone construction and who can train other masons in the
- Offer training and certification in dry stone construction in a manner similar to the Dry Stone Walling Association of Great Britain whose member masons practice the craft in the same tradition as that found in Kentucky.
- Educate the public and governmental agency officials in the merits of dry stone construction and advocate for the employment of trained and certified masons in all private and governmental stone construction projects.

#### **Conserving Dry Stone Structures**

- Identify dry stone structures in need of repair or reconstruction as sites for training and public demonstration projects.
- Provide guidance for property owners who wish to place their dry stone structures on the National Register for Historic Places.
- Advocate for legislation that will underwrite dry stone structure conservation and reconstruction through tax credits and other appropriate initiatives.

#### Advocacy for Public Education

- Research historic dry stone building traditions and techniques.
- Conduct public workshops, forums, lectures, and demonstrations that illustrate the durability and beauty of the dry stone craft.
- Consult with masons and interest groups locally, nationally, and internationally.
