Kentucky Roadway Prevention and Sediment Control – Roadway Inspectors Course

(KEPSC-RI)

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) has recently adopted the Kentucky Erosion Prevention & Sediment Control – Roadway Inspectors (KEPSC-RI) training course for individuals inspecting highway construction projects to ensure compliance with the Kentucky Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (KPDES) General Storm Water Permit, KYR10, or individual construction storm water permits.

All KYTC employees and contractors performing erosion prevention and sediment control inspections under the KYR10 permit or an individual construction storm water permit must successfully complete the KEPSC-RI training course. However, individuals having an active KEPSC basic qualification may continue to use the qualification until it expires. After the KEPSC basic qualification expires, all KYTC employees and contractors performing erosion prevention and sediment control inspections will be required to obtain the KEPSC-RI training course.
