


DPD offers data users more efficient and intuitive information exchange throughout a transportation asset's lifecycle.

Recent Policy Updates

Renewed emphasis on deliverables from Project Development translates to more reliable digital information, supporting Construction phase project management.

✓ DPD related changes to KYTC Final Plan Submittals became effective in March 2022. New include requirements zipcompressed keyhole markup language (KML) files viewable with geographic information systems (GIS) applications like Tablet-friendly Google Earth. KML files for both proposed and existing plan details support construction management tasks, without replacing contract plans.

Pilot Projects

District 3 will pilot Digital Project Delivery using a project bundle of Todd and Logan County bridge replacements fully designed by in-house staff. This brings the DPD pilot project total to nine. Project teams and DPD staff use project-specific details to choose objectives and to tailor an Implementation Plan. Project team feedback aids Cabinet-wide implementation of Digital Project Delivery and design modeling level of detail.
