FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received a subgrant application from the Kentucky Department of Transportation for the replacement of Perry County Bridge 097C002. Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published September 9, 2022, for DR-4663 Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project- specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within a Special Flood Hazard Area. FEMA has determined that the only practicable alternative is to fund the replacement of the Bridge ID 097C002, already located within the Floodplain prior to the event.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state, and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

Proposed Work and Purpose: Bridge ID 097C002e repairs consist of the replacement of a bridge back to its predisaster design. The Applicant will also repair the bridge approaches by replacing road surface material back to predisaster design and function using best management practices. Hazard mitigation was performed by constructing new abutments and wingwalls along the stream embankment, lengthening the bridge from 60 ft to 80 ft, and installing rip rap for erosion protection around the abutments.

Project Alternatives:

- (1) Relocation of facilities outside of the floodplain The relocation of the bridge outside of the floodplain is not a practicable alternative because the bridge functions as the only access route for homes and structures located west of the bridge. Emergency response would also be unable to access the area west of the bridge which would be a hazard to health and safety for the community. Floodplain avoidance by relocating the facilities is not a practicable alternative as the bridge provides the only access route for the Swan Court Road and the relocation of the bridge would adversely impact social or economic resources for the community.
- (2) No action alternative This alternative is not feasible as the repairs are necessary to ensure that the bridge remains operational in its current location to perform its designed function without being a hazard to human health and safety. The no action alternative would adversely impact social or economic resources for the community.
