Officer Qualifications for Acceptance into Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program

- 1. Meet the following requirements:
 - a. Be a sworn officer who is off probation and in good standing with his/her agency.
 - b. Have a minimum of two (2) years of law enforcement experience after graduation from law enforcement basic training.
 - c. Not under any pending disciplinary action or have any Brady/Giglio violations.
 - d. Have departmental support of the officer and Ky Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program.
- 2. Submit a letter of recommendation from current agency supervisor, Chief or Sheriff.

Process for Applying

- 1. Complete and submit this application along with items 2, 3 and 4 below.
- Provide a current CV documenting all impaired driver training and other training pertaining to the Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program. Examples include EMT training, Paramedic training, etc.
- 3. Provide results from a criminal background check.
- 4. Provide a current certificate of immunizations show proof of a recent flu vaccine, proof of a TB test or chest X-ray within the last year, sign a waiver or show proof of a recent Covid vaccine and Hepatitis B injections.
- 5. Provide a copy of the agency standard operating procedures which state a trained and active law enforcement phlebotomist is acting within his or her official duties when performing acts consistent with law enforcement phlebotomy training.

Forensic Phlebotomy Program

Those accepted into the Ky Law Enforcement Phlebotomy Program must successfully complete the phlebotomy program provided by Kentucky Healthcare Training in Lexington, Kentucky. This is a 2-week, 60 hours in person course provided at the KHT campus. Classes will run from 8 am until 5 pm Monday through Thursday. After the completion of class work, students must then complete 40 hours of clinical training and pass the National Certification Examination to earn a certificate in Forensic Phlebotomy. Students completing the program will also receive a two-year certification in First Aid, CPR through the American Heart Association, and a one-year certification in Blood Born Pathogens.
