# **Grant Funding Application**

Grant funds will be applied for the purchase of a used 15-ton Mobile Crane.

# Qualifications and eligibility

Paducah-McCracken County Riverport Authority (PMCRA) was founded in 1964 by the legislative bodies of McCracken County and the City of Paducah. The operating facility is located on the Tennessee River between river mile marker 1.3 and 2.0 on the left descending bank, near the confluence of the Ohio and Tennessee Rivers.

The following picture provides an aerial view of the PMCRA facilities. These include a General Cargo facility with a separate river berth, a Bulk Commodity River berth, a 20-acre Bulk Commodity storage and transshipment yard and over 100,000 square feet of warehousing, office buildings and additional outdoor storage areas. The two current areas associated with the Port's Radioactive Materials License (RAM) that are utilized for UF-6-cylinder storage and transshipments are also identified in the picture.

# **Statement of Work**

PMCRA is equipped with nearly 3,000 feet of elevated fixed conveyors and three new radial stackers. This elevated conveying system, along with three new radial stackers which can only descend to 35' above ground level, has caused a renewed need for a mobile crane. In the recent past, PMCRA would be required to rent a mobile crane from a local vendor losing one day per event for transportation and set up of the rental equipment. The need to rent a mobile crane has an estimated impact of \$8,300 in expense and lost revenue per day.

Currently, PMCRA has a 1998 Galion 150FA mobile crane which has been out of service for an extended period due to multiple mechanical issues and failures. The cost of repairs to return this machine to safe operations exceeds the value of the machine in its repaired state.

PMCRA has evaluated the requirements necessary to provide a mobile crane model that would adequately meet the needs of all repair scenarios at the riverport. Due to the historical scope of repairs performed annually, a used machine was deemed acceptable for a period of up to 10 years.

## Scope of Work


If awarded a KY-2026 KRI Grant, PMCRA will purchase a used Mobile Crane less than 10 years in age. The specifications required are as follows:

- 15-Ton Loft Capacity
- 360 degree Boom Rotation
- Minimum Lift Height 60 feet
- Minimum Horizontal Reach 55 feet
- 4-Wheel Steering
- 4-Wheel Drive System

PMCRA has identified several equipment manufacturers with mobile cranes that will fit the above listed specifications including:

- Broderson
- Galion
- Groves

PMCRA has met with national equipment rental companies to measure the availability and costs of machines meeting the above listed specifications. Below is one example of a 15-ton Broderson mobile crane that meets or exceeds the specifications:



# **Project Purchase Quote and Cost Estimate**
