Team Kentucky, Federal Highway Administration Seek Public Input on Historic Preservation Act Agreement Draft for Federal Highway Projects

Interested parties have until July 16 to view and make comments

FRANKFORT, Ky. (June 16, 2026) – The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is seeking public comment on the draft Kentucky Section 106 Programmatic Agreement that guides how federally funded transportation projects comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

Section 106 requires agencies to consider the effects of federally funded highway projects on historic properties that may include buildings, structures, sites, districts or objects significant because of their association with important events, people, architecture, engineering, archaeology or other aspects of shared history. Many of these resources are listed on or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The draft Kentucky Section 106 Programmatic Agreement establishes the process used to identify historic properties that may be affected by projects, evaluate potential impacts, and determine how any adverse effects can be avoided, minimized or mitigated.

Because Kentucky's historic and cultural resources are important to communities across the commonwealth, FHWA and KYTC are inviting the public to review the draft agreement and provide comments.

The draft agreement, as well as the categories of project types and forms used to document project review, coordination and compliance are available online at [KYTC's Division of Environmental Analysis website](#) under the Cultural Resources section. The public has 30 days to review and make comments.
