2021 Non-Metropolitan Local Officials Consultation Process

In 1995, Kentucky established a statewide transportation planning process in response to the directives of the Intermodal Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA). This process was later expanded to include more comprehensive public involvement and consultation with local officials following the directives of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) enacted in 1998. The statewide transportation planning process in the non-metropolitan areas of Kentucky is accomplished through a cooperative program with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) twelve Highway District Offices (HDOs), fifteen Area Development Districts (ADDs), Regional Transportation Committees, County Judges, City Mayors, other local officials, and often county transportation committees. Through this process, the Regional Transportation Committees establish regional goals and objectives, identify the current transportation system, research and analyze data, identify and prioritize transportation needs for input to the Long-Range Statewide Transportation Plan, Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, and the Recommended Highway Plan for consideration into the Enacted Highway Plan.

The major portion of the rural consultation process is accomplished through the fifteen ADDs. An Annual Work Program (AWP) is developed each year by both the KYTC and each ADD to define the guidelines and work elements of the Regional Transportation Planning Program. The ADDs are reimbursed on a quarterly basis for work satisfactorily completed as required in their AWP. Some specific work elements included in their AWP include: Allocation of Time and Timeline; Committee Activities and Presentations; Projected Training List; Bike/Pedestrian Plan updates; Regional Goals and Objectives; Transportation Committee By-Laws; Rural Consultation review; KY Highway Freight Network review; NHS Intermodal Connectors review; Truck Parking Inventory; List of Contacts and Resources; Regional Transportation Committee Membership; Rail Freight Loading/Unloading Locations; Socioeconomic Profiles; Title VI Accomplishments; Cost Allocation Plan; Major Traffic Generators review; Major Freight Users review; Public Involvement Plan review; Regional Transportation Asset review; Speaking Engagements; Regional Transportation Meetings; and participation in Project Identification, Data Analysis, Prioritization, and Ranking of Projects (Highway, Bicycle, Pedestrian and Intermodal Access.)

Local and regional committees are often involved with the ADD Transportation Planner in researching and providing environmental justice data for various planning studies, helping obtain local/regional input on planning studies conducted by consultants or KYTC central office staff, and reviewing numerous statewide documents such as the Statewide Rail Plan, Long-Range Statewide Transportation Plan, and the Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan for accuracy and input. The ADDs gather local input from rural officials and

regional transportation committees, and help the KYTC share important transportation information for our rural communities.

The Regional Transportation Committees (RTCs) are maintained by the ADDs, and meet at least three times per year to help accomplish the AWP tasks with the ADD transportation planners and the planning staff from the highway district offices. Each RTC elects a chairperson to conduct the meetings and the committee may meet more often if needed. The ADD planners and HDOs also meet one-on-one with each city/county at least once per year to identify and discuss transportation issues. The KYTC planning personnel meet quarterly with the ADD Transportation Planners and the Highway District Planning Staffs for training and discussion/exchange of ideas/processes on the statewide transportation planning program. The agendas include discussions of the various work elements of the program, new directions for the program, schedules for tasks and any schedule changes, the status of projects, any problems that may have arisen, and informational presentations for the group on various areas of interest. The ADD Transportation Planners then share this information with their committees in their meetings.

The ADDs are also responsible for coordination with Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and other agencies in the region, as appropriate. The ADDs adjacent to MPO areas coordinate their efforts with those of the MPOs as part of the statewide transportation planning process. The ADD Transportation Planners attend MPO meetings, review MPO materials, consider MPO plans in identifying and prioritizing needs, and providing input into the MPO process as needed. Some ADDs also function as MPOs. Some rural counties adjacent to some MPOs have become members of the MPO and have representation on its policy and technical advisory committees.

In 2017, the KYTC began using the Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) prioritization process as a data-driven and objective approach to compare capital improvement projects and prioritize limited transportation funds. The ADDs work with the twelve KYTC HDOs and nine Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) to update potential project lists from all sources into a Continuous Highway Analysis Framework (CHAF) database for SHIFT. Each ADD, HDO, and MPO gets a certain number of project sponsorships based on population, lane miles, and number of counties served. Specific projects are selected for sponsorship after consulting with the local elected officials. The sponsored project lists are reviewed and scored based on safety, asset management, congestion, economic growth, and benefit/cost. Statewide projects such as interstates, parkways, and other major connecting routes are scored first, and then the remaining projects are scored on a regional basis that includes points for local input. Projects are recorded in the KYTC's CHAF Database as the local and regional input for the project selection process. Their priorities and ranked projects are then considered for inclusion in the Recommended Highway Plan. Projects remain in the CHAF database until all

phases of a project have been added into the Enacted Highway Plan (six year plan used as the KYTC's programming document), or it is determined that the project is no longer needed. The identification and analyses process is an on-going process of studying the data and reviewing the needs and goals of the communities and regions. The local officials (and/or a local committee), the RTCs, and the HDO Staff prioritize the transportation needs in their respective area every two years. While local and regional priorities do not dictate final decisions in this process, all priorities and rankings factor in the selection of projects for inclusion in the Recommended Highway Plan. This information is also often consulted by elected state legislators to ascertain the priorities of their constituents.

The consultation process in Kentucky also covers all public transportation planning, including public and specialized transportation services in rural areas. The governing bodies and authorizing boards of the transit/specialized systems are comprised of local officials and citizens. Letters of support from local officials are required with each public transit grant application.

In 2020, the KYTC sent out a Rural Consultation Survey in accordance with 23 CFR 450.210 (a) and 23 CFR 450.210 (b) regarding the effectiveness of the cooperative process and any proposed changes. The Rural Consultation Survey history, questions, and summary of results are attached to this document as Appendix A.

It should be noted that there is not a state statute mandating a transportation-planning program through the local or regional units in Kentucky. However, the Kentucky Revised Statutes 147A.080 and 147A.090 establish the 15 Area Development Districts and authorize the ADDs to accept funds for specific purposes including planning activities throughout the state. The funds for the rural transportation-planning program are then authorized through the State Biennial Budget Process, approved by the Kentucky Legislature, specifically identifying funds to be used for the transportation planning process through the ADDs. A Memorandum of Policies and Procedures authorized by the Secretary of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet delineates the procedures and processes to be followed for this program.

This statewide transportation planning process ensures public input at the local level through elected officials, local county committees, regional committees and public meetings, as required by the federal transportation reauthorization legislation.

2020 Rural Consultation Survey



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Introduction

23 CFR 450.210(a) requires all States to consult with and consider the concerns of non-metropolitan officials when making transportation decisions in their Statewide Transportation Planning and Programming processes. 23 CFR 450.210(b) requires all States to consult with non-metropolitan officials regarding the effectiveness of the consultation process and any suggested modifications and report findings every five years as of February 24, 2006.

Kentucky's Rural Consultation Process

All States are required to have a documented and implemented consultation process with local officials in place. In 1995, Kentucky established a formal Regional Transportation Planning Program with the State's fifteen Area Development Districts (ADDs). This Program relies heavily on the participation and involvement of local officials. The roots of this Program date back to 1975 when the Cabinet first engaged the ADDs in the development of Regional Transportation Plans. In 1989, the Cabinet circulated the first Unscheduled Projects List (UPL) for prioritization.

In 2017, the Cabinet began using the Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) prioritization process as a data-driven and objective approach to compare capital improvement projects and prioritize limited transportation funds. The ADDs, along with the nine Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and twelve KY Highway District Offices (HDOs), update potential project lists into a Continuous Highway Analysis Framework (CHAF) database for SHIFT. Each ADD, MPO, and HDO gets a certain number of project sponsorships based on population, lane miles, and number of counties served. Specific projects are selected for sponsorship after consulting with the local elected officials. The sponsored project lists are combined with committed project lists that had funding beyond the design phase listed in the previous State Highway Plan, and the projects are reviewed and scored based on safety, asset management, congestion, economic growth, and benefit / cost. Statewide projects such as interstates, parkways, and other major connecting routes are scored first, and then the remaining projects are scored on a regional basis that includes points for local input.

The ADDs help gather local input from the local rural officials and regional transportation committees, and help the Cabinet share important transportation information for our rural communities. Effectiveness of the Rural Consultation Process

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet solicited comments and suggestions, for a period of 90 days from 536 Regional Transportation Committee members including Mayors and Judge Executives and other local officials in non-metropolitan counties and urban areas on the effectiveness of the Regional Transportation Planning Program. This occurred from **October 15, 2020, to January 31, 2021**. To measure the effectiveness of the planning program, the Cabinet prepared a survey consisting of 25 questions with a focus on the following issues:

- Awareness, understanding, and participation in the Area Development District Regional Transportation Planning Program;
- Understanding and presentation of transportation issues and project priorities to the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet by the Area Development District program;
- Performance and availability of the Area Development District Transportation Planner;
- Performance of the Cabinet's Programming processes in the following areas of consideration; decision-making, communications, and access to decision makers.

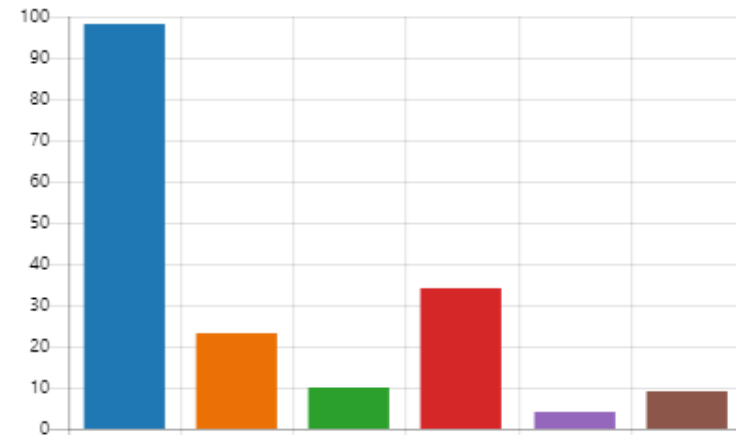

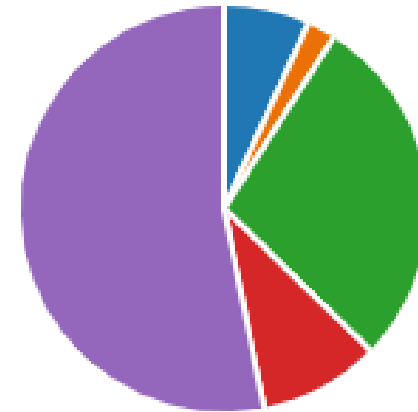

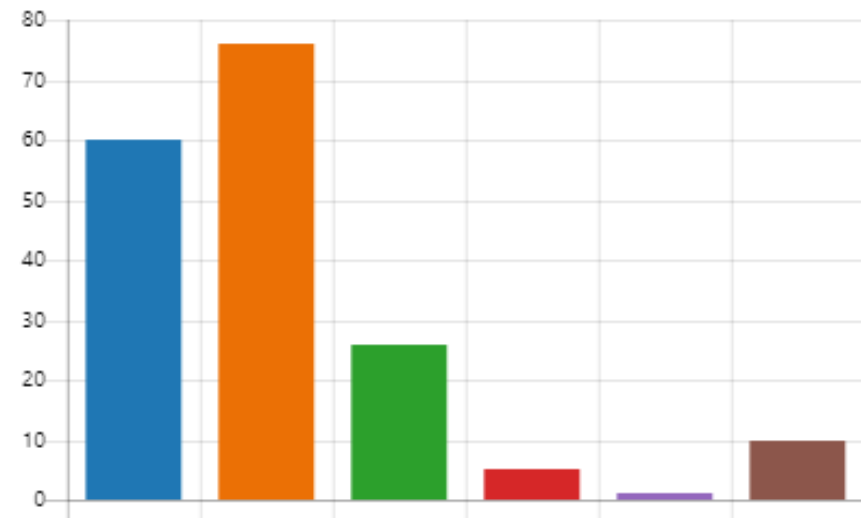
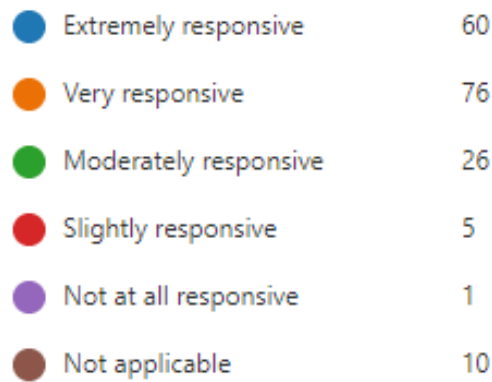

Q8 Overall, how responsive has the Regional Transportation Planning Committee been to your questions or concerns about highway improvement needs in your area?

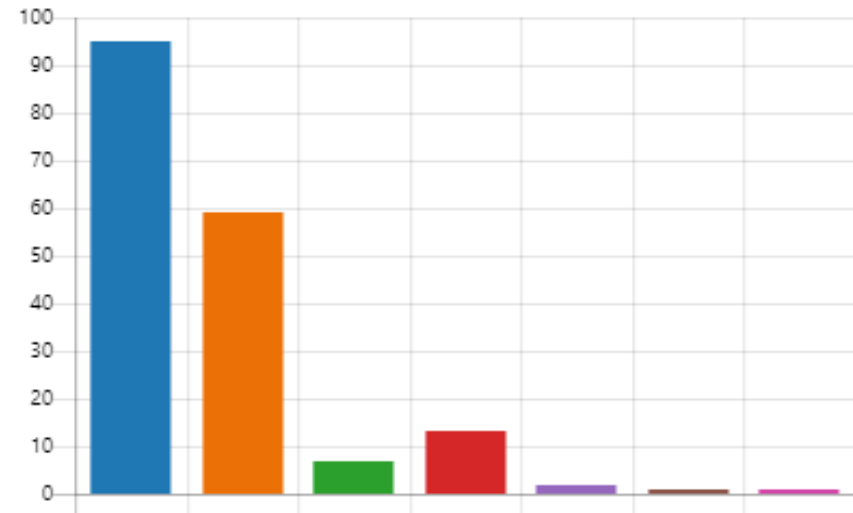

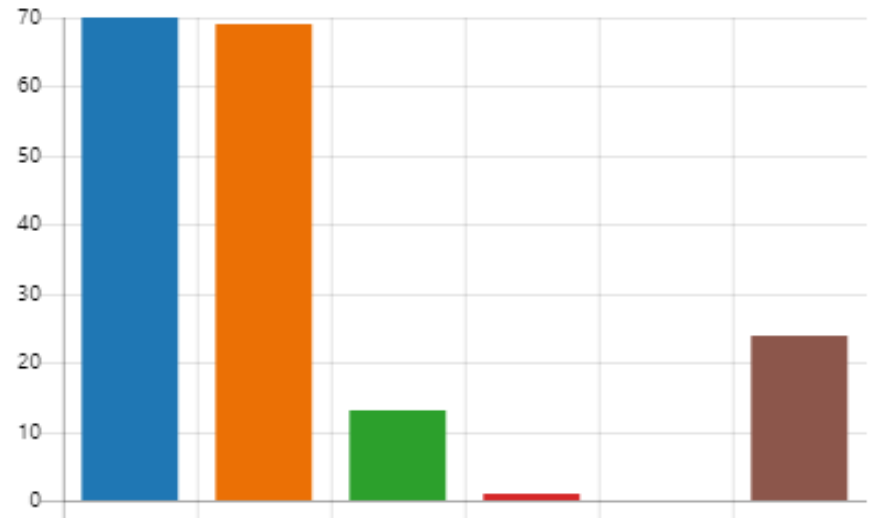
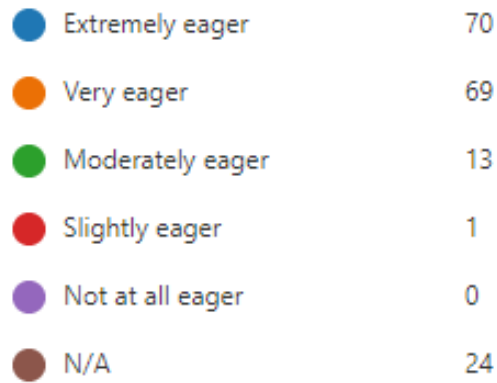

Q13 Was the ADD Transportation Planner eager to help you?

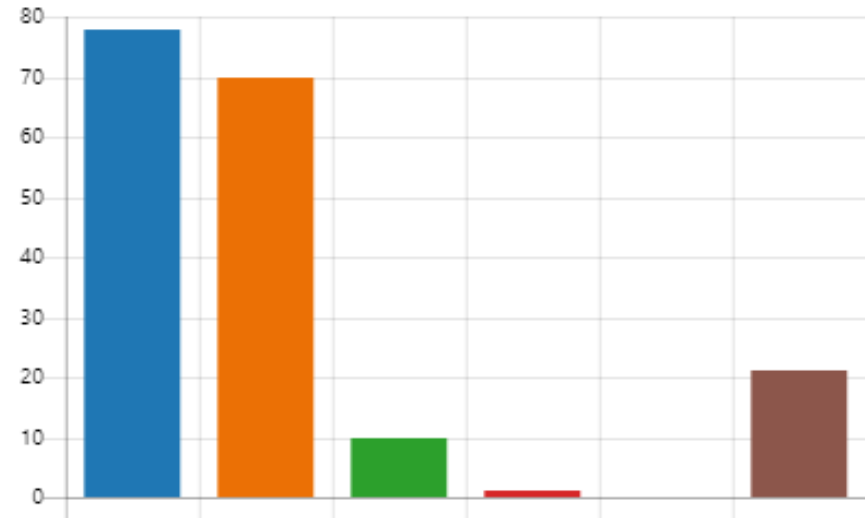

Q14 How knowledgeable did the ADD Transportation Planner seem to you?

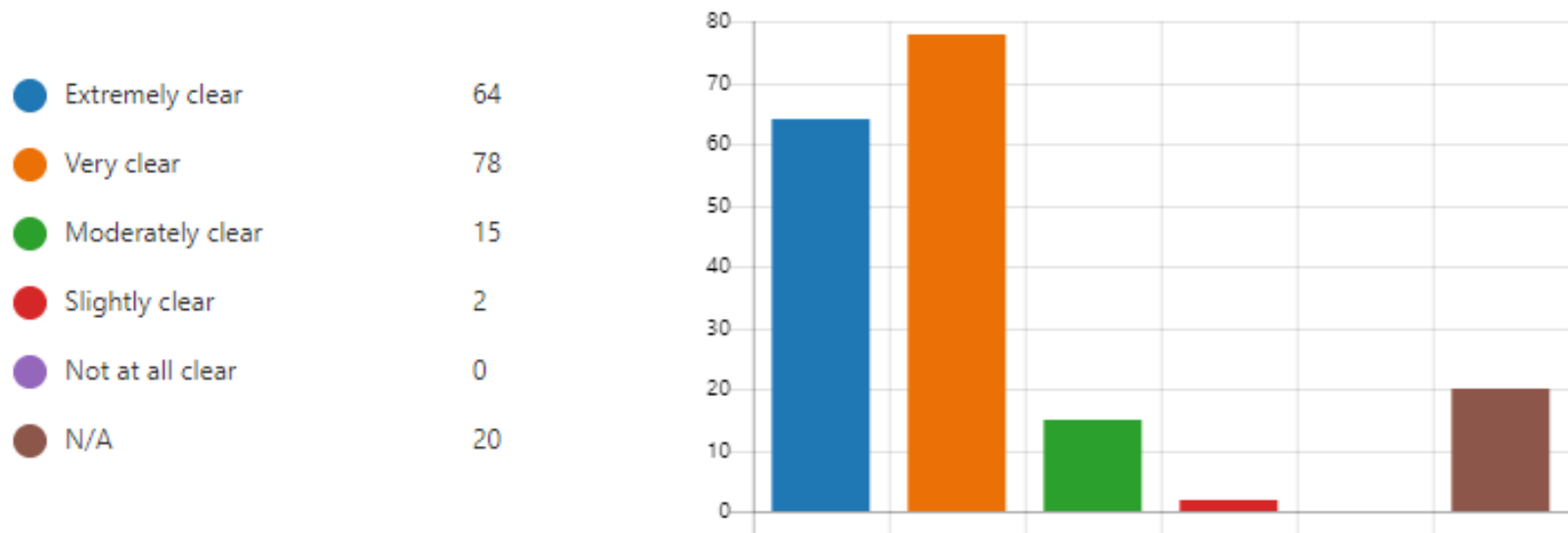

Q15 How clear was the information provided to you by the ADD Transportation Planner?

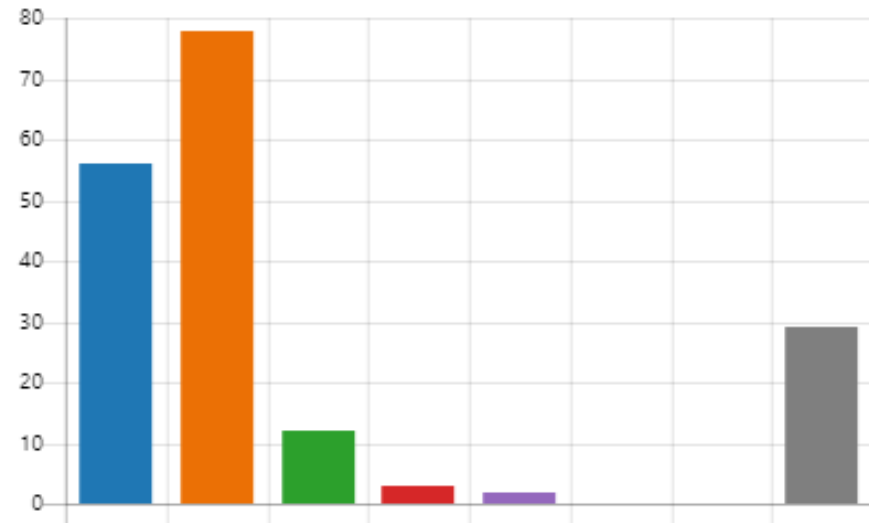

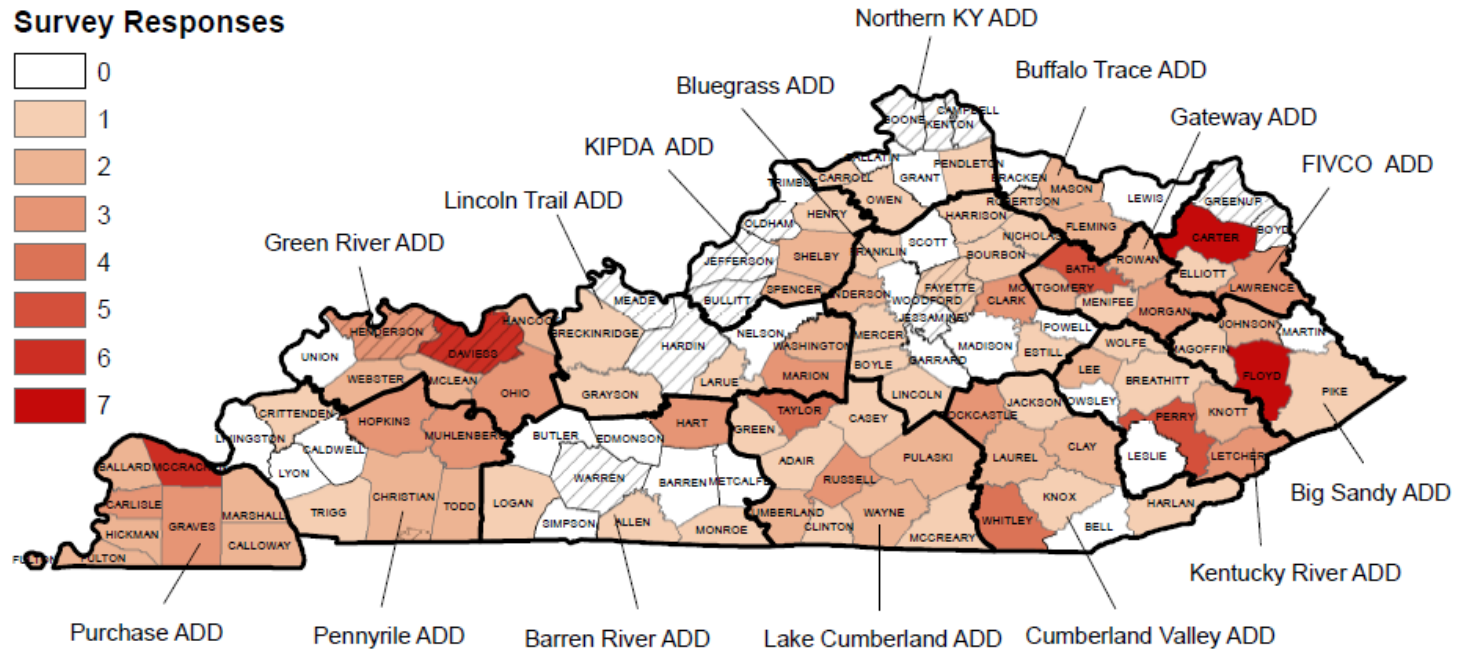

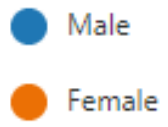
Q21 What is your age?

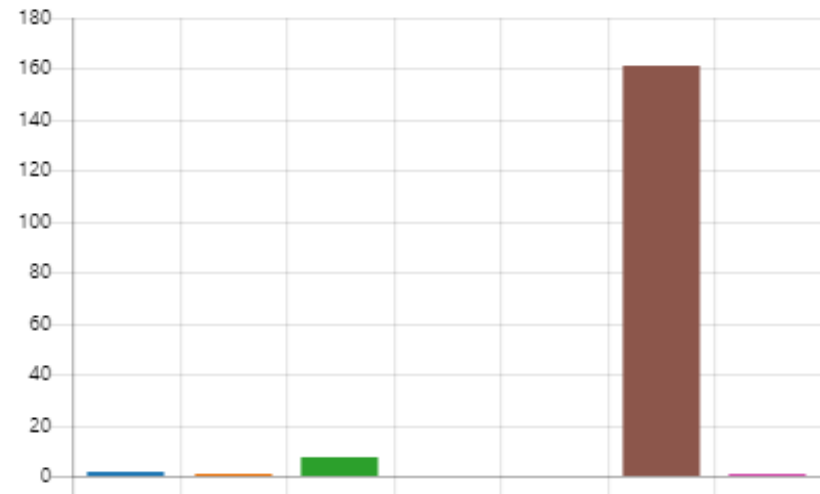

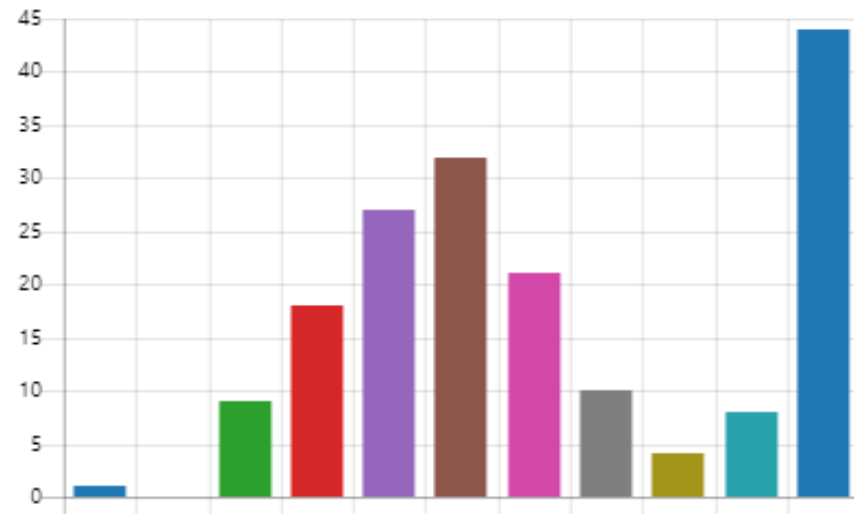

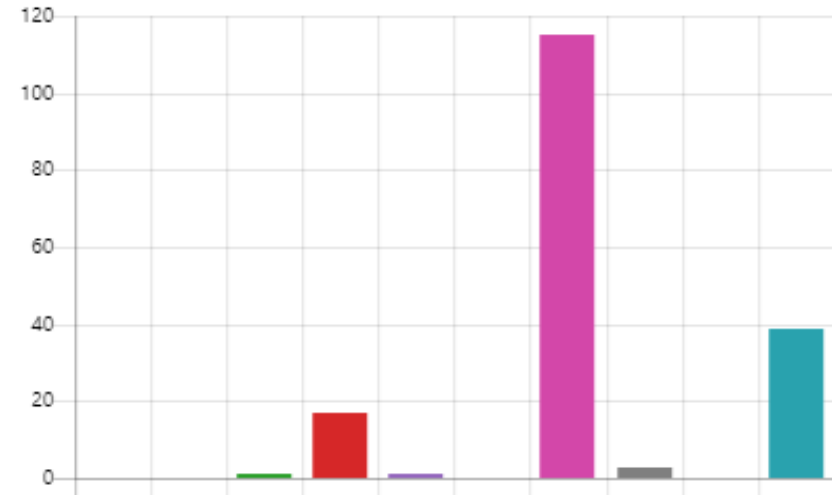

Plan of Action

- KYTC will offer training opportunities on project funding and appropriation.
- KYTC will offer training to ensure the ADD planner is aware of the location and limitations of relevant transportation data.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to maintain an orientation packet for new members detailing the purpose of the Regional Transportation Committee.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to develop a standard report for each Highway District Office regarding the status of ADD specific projects for presentation at each Regional Transportation Committee meeting.
- KYTC will encourage the ADDs to schedule meetings outside the ADD office where appropriate. This may include but not be limited to site visits, one-on-one city/county level meetings, and virtual meetings where appropriate.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to identify new opportunities for increasing Regional Transportation Committee participation.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to develop regular meeting schedules and notification procedures.
- KYTC will continue developing methodology to better inform local officials and add transparency to the project selection process on a statewide basis.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to discuss and respond to ADD specific survey results from the Rural Consultation Survey where applicable.
- KYTC will encourage the ADDs to schedule successive meetings (i.e. Water Board immediately followed by Regional Transportation Committee) to reduce in-person travel expectations, where possible.
- KYTC will work with the ADDs to continue communicating regional transportation topics with the Kentucky League of Cities, Kentucky Association of Counties, Executive Directors of the Area Development Districts, and Kentucky Council of Area Development Districts.

Summary

KYTC is very pleased to see an overall positive response in regards to the effectiveness of the Regional Transportation Planning Program. The majority of respondents are regular attendees representing broad public interests and multimodal perspectives. While increasing attendance has been and continues to be a challenge, overall attendance numbers are stable and indicative of a well-used resource for local officials and KYTC alike. KYTC seeks to continue and improve this relationship through increased training opportunities and improved communication.
