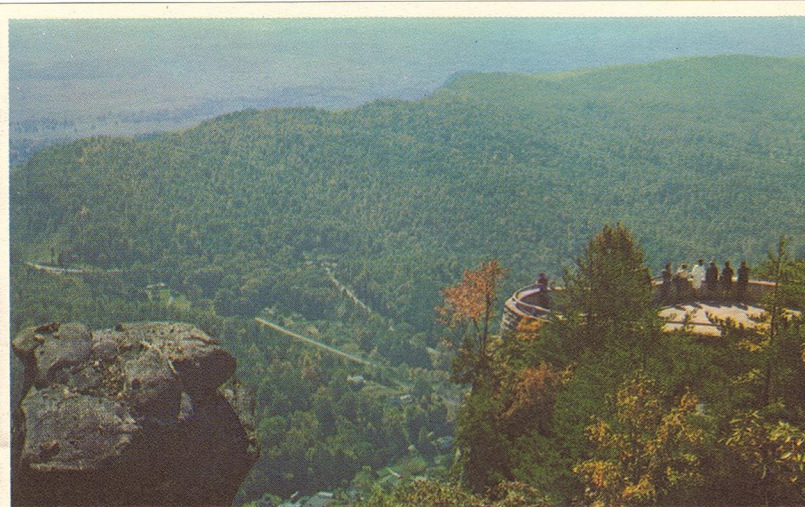




A fine old steamer runs frequent excursions on the Ohio at Louisville.

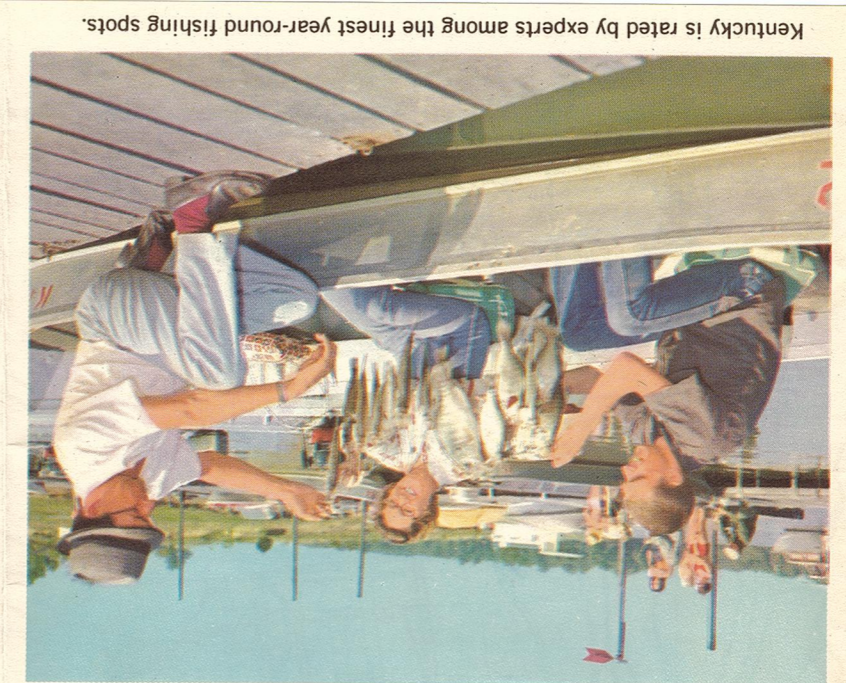

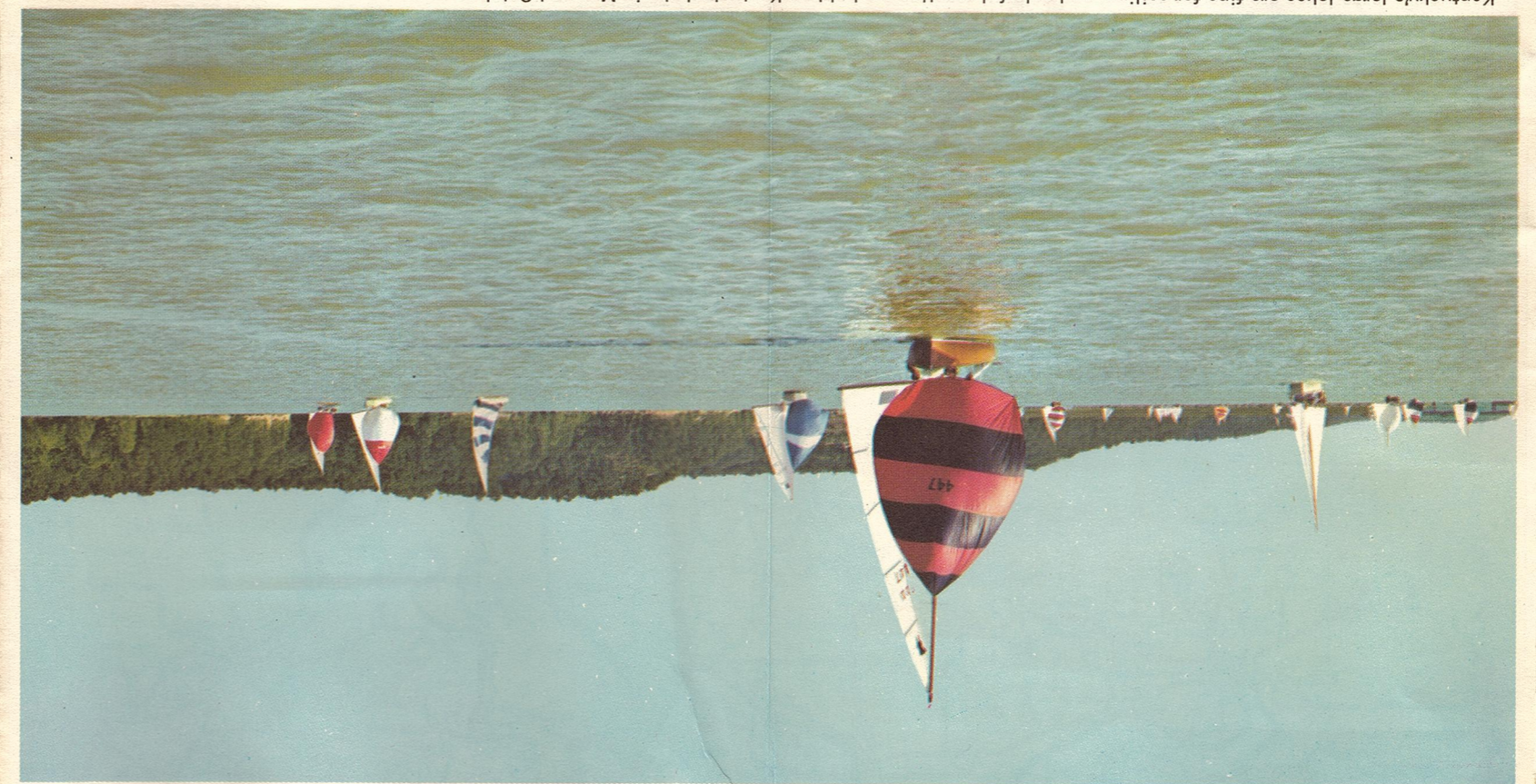
Explore Kentucky's past in the Old State Capitol at Frankfort.

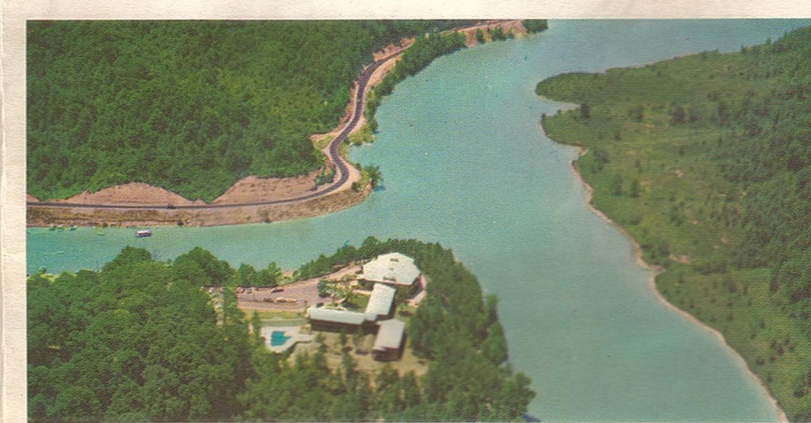
Seventy-Six Falls is on Lake Cumberland near Jamestown.



The lodge at Pine Mountain State Park, Pineville, offers comfortable accommodations that are typical of Kentucky's hospitality.



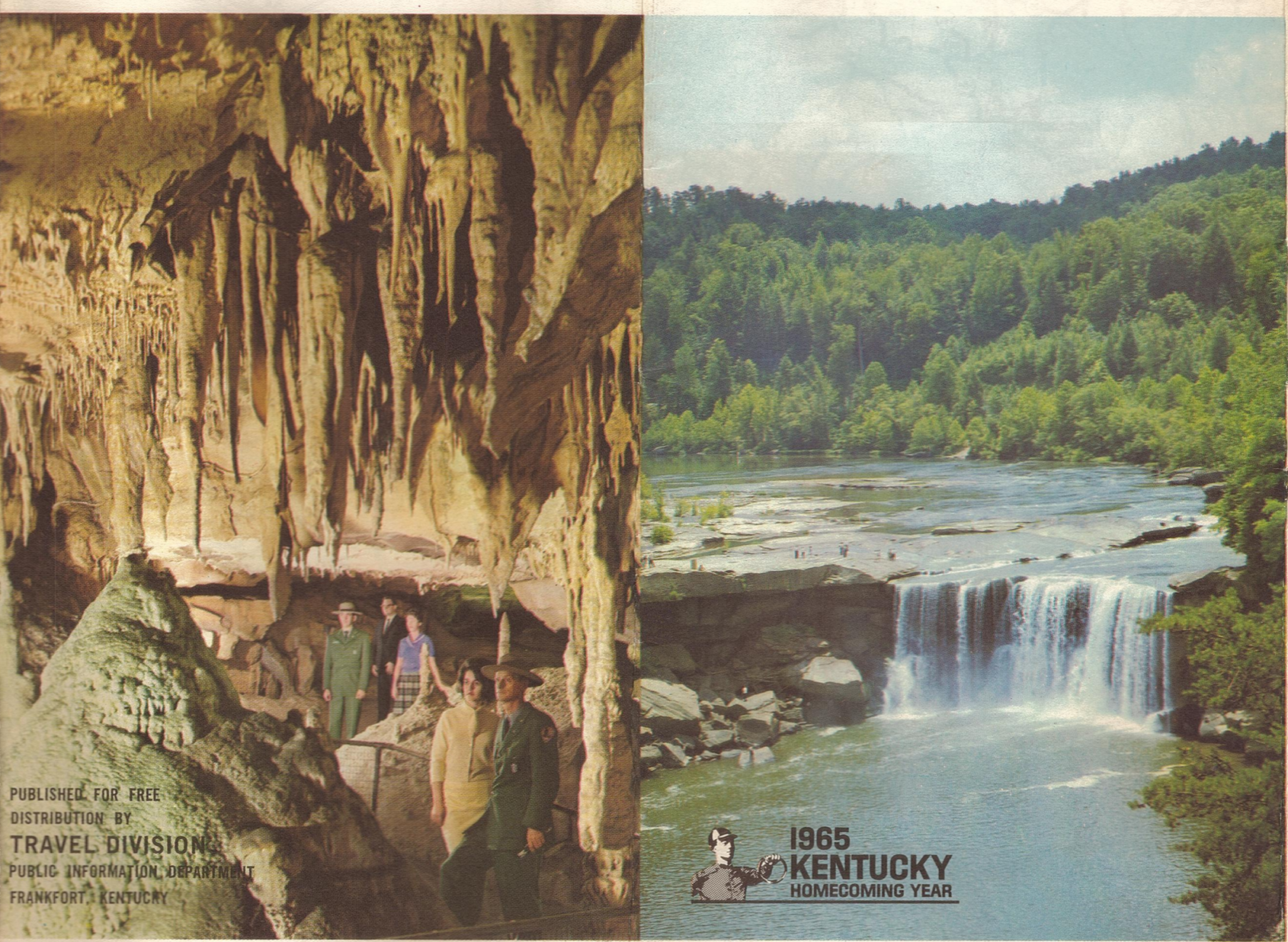
The village of Shaketown, near Harrodsburg, a unique setting for a now extinct religious way of life, is being restored.



Jenny Wiley State Park is on Dewey Lake in the eastern mountains.

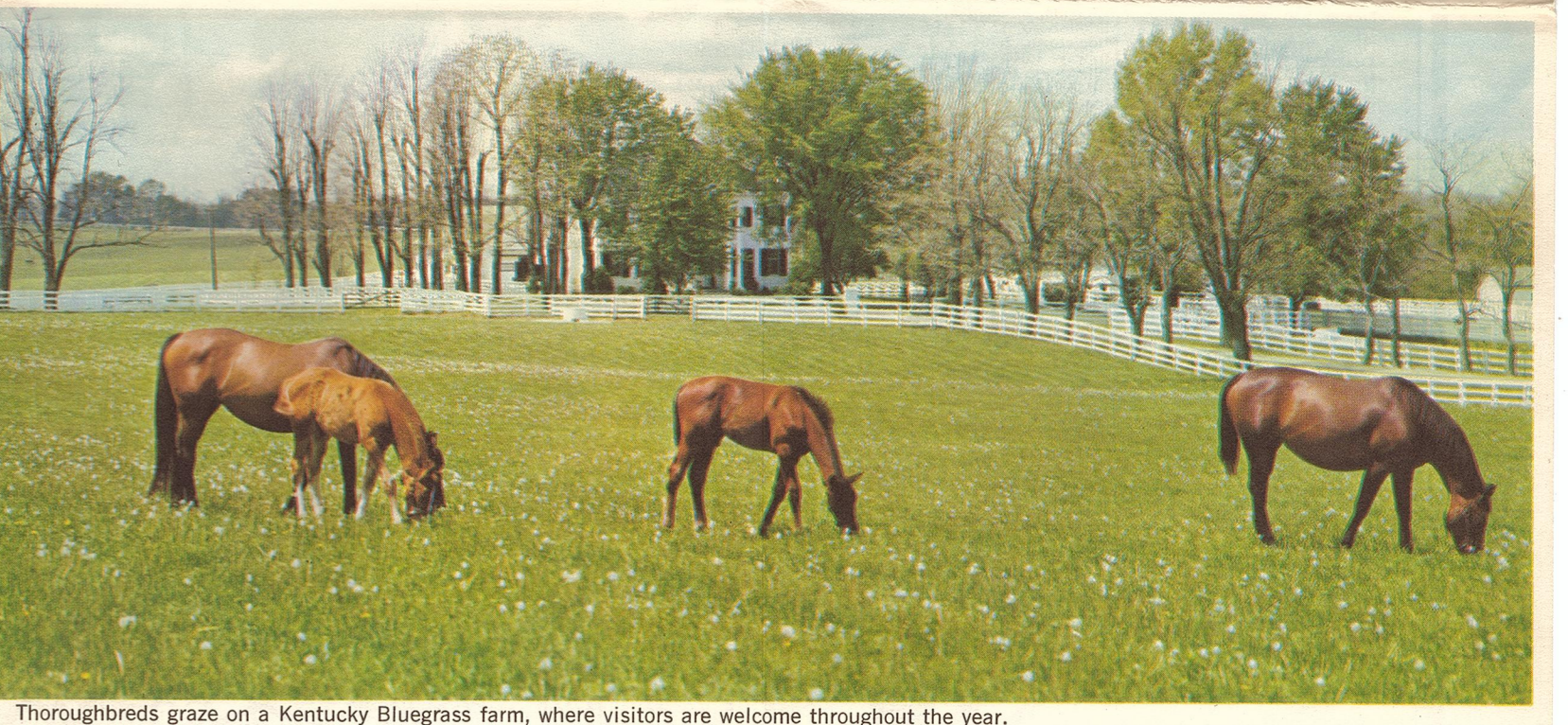

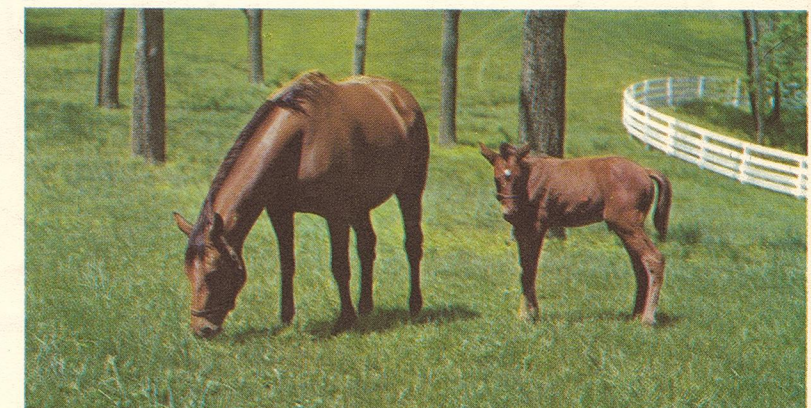
Thoroughbreds graze on a Kentucky Bluegrass farm, where visitors are welcome throughout the year.

EXPLORE KENTUCKY'S HORSE FARMS

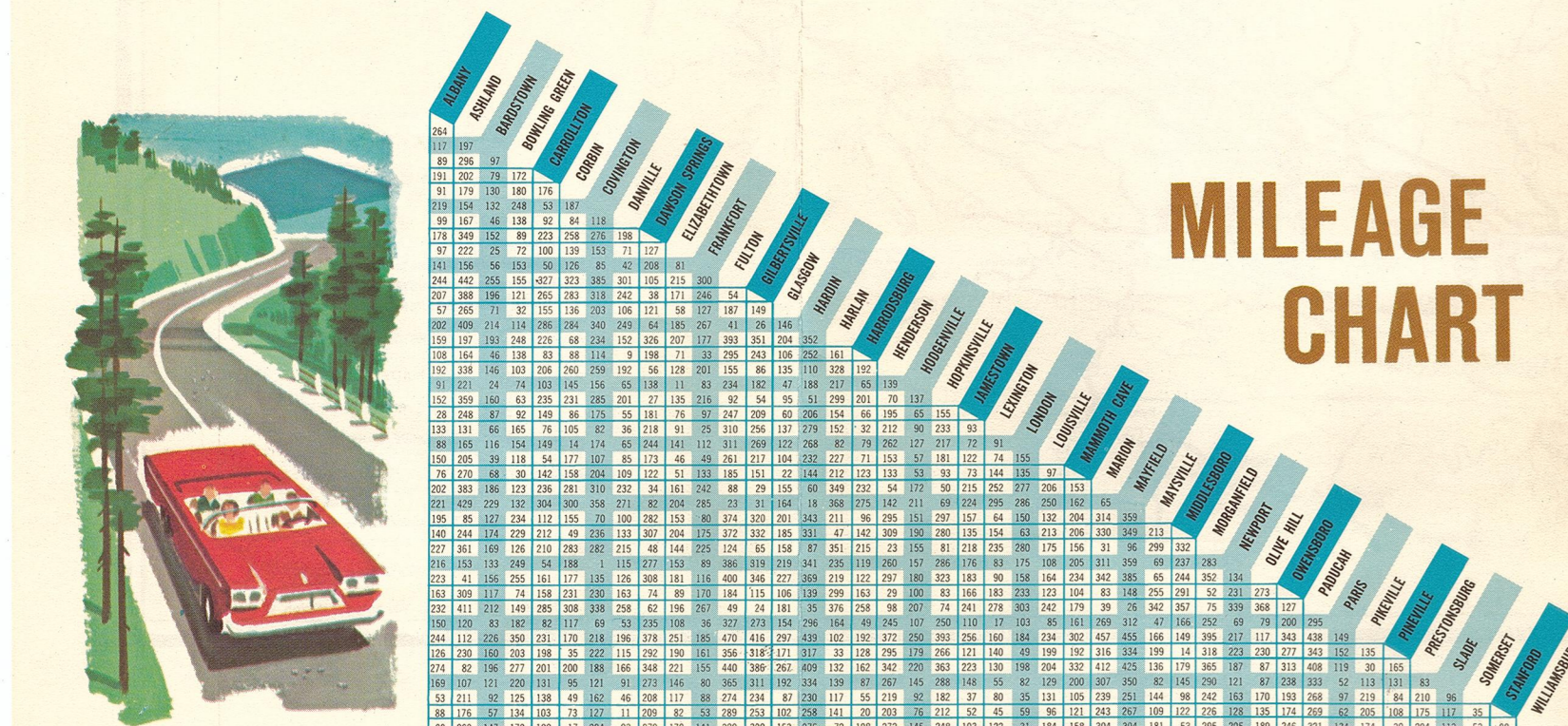
