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# I. INTRODUCTION

The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) is conducting a Small Urban Area Study for the City of Danville, Kentucky in Boyle County (KYTC Item No. N/A). Third Rock Consultants, LLC (Third Rock) was retained by Parsons Brinckerhoff to prepare an existing conditions overview for Ecological and Underground Storage Tank/Hazardous Materials (UST/Hazmat) sections of the Environmental Overview for the proposed project.

The Study Area comprises an approximately four-mile radius around the City of Danville and includes the entire incorporated boundary of the City of Danville and a portion of the surrounding unincorporated area of Boyle County (Exhibits 1 and 2, pages 2 and 3). This Environmental Overview documents resources within the proposed Study Area.

# II. ECOLOGICAL OVERVIEW

No field reconnaissance was included in the scope of services. All research efforts were conducted in-office by qualified Subject Matter Experts. Available literature and mapping was reviewed to assess the ecology of the Study correspondence Area. No agency was Species information from the conducted. Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife Resources (KDFWR) and Kentucky State Nature Preserves Commission (KSNPC) were acquired on line. Because species information from the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) is no longer available on-line, previously available data was reviewed. Copies of these data searches are located in Appendix A.

# A. Ecological Environmental Setting

The Study Area is located in the eastern portion of Boyle County, Kentucky, and is bounded by an approximately 4-mile radius from the center of Danville. Much of the Study Area is comprised of the Danville urban area, with the outer portions

comprised of the surrounding unincorporated land around the City. Clarks Run roughly bisects the Study Area west to east and flows toward the Dix River, which is northeast of the Study Area.


# B. Climate


Temperatures in Boyle County are temperate, with the average daily maximum of 66 degrees F and an average daily minimum of 45 degrees F. The average annual temperature is 55.2 degrees Fahrenheit. The record high temperature is 103 degrees F and the record low is -21 degrees F. The average annual precipitation in Boyle County is about 49 inches, with March through July and December having the highest average rainfall amounts. On average, May is the wettest month (4.94 inches). The average seasonal snowfall is 11.4 inches (USDA 2000). The prevailing wind is from the south (National Climatic Data Center, 2011).

# C. Physiography

The study area is located within the Interior Plateau Level III ecoregion (Woods *et al.* 2002), but the area falls within four subdivisions of this ecoregion. Listed from north to south, these ecoregions are the Inner Bluegrass, the Hills of the Bluegrass, Outer Bluegrass, and the Knobs-Norman Upland ecoregion in a small portion of the southwestern portion of the watershed. The following discussion of these areas is based upon the data presented in Woods *et al.* 2002.

The nearly level to rolling Inner Bluegrass is a weakly dissected agricultural plain containing extensive karst, intermittent streams, and expanding urban-suburban areas that originally developed near major springs. The elevation at the Danville courthouse is 989 feet. The Hills of the Bluegrass ecoregion has upland soils fairly high in phosphorus, potassium, and lime but not as naturally fertile as the Outer Bluegrass.





The Hills of the Bluegrass has steeper terrain, droughtier soils, lower soil fertility, higher drainage density, and is more erosion prone than the Outer Bluegrass ecoregion. The rolling to hilly Outer Bluegrass is known to contain sinkholes. springs, entrenched rivers, and intermittent and perennial streams over its entire range. Local relief is variable but is usually less than in the geomorphically distinct Knobs. Elevations in the area are typically greater than 1,000 feet above sea level. The Knobs-Norman Upland ecoregion has characteristic rounded hills and ridges that are mostly forested and divide the Bluegrass from the rest of the Interior Plateau. Much geological. topographical. and ecological diversity characterizes this ecoregion. The density of perennial upland streams is far greater than on nearby limestone plains.

# D. Geology

The ecoregions of the area are reflective of the underlying geology, which is patterned in west to east bands across the Study Area. The Inner Bluegrass is underlain by Middle Ordovician limestone and shale that is lithologically distinct from the rest of the Interior Plateau. Very fertile alfisols and mollisols have developed from the residuum of underlying phosphatic limestone; natural soil fertility is greater than in the Hills of the Bluegrass. The Hills of the Bluegrass ecoregion is lithologically unlike the Knobs, Inner, or Outer Bluegrass. Rocks of this region primarily contain higher percentages of shale layers, and therefore do not develop extensive karst features. The Outer Bluegrass ecoregion is Upper Ordovician mostly underlain by interbedded shales and limestones. This area is moderately karst prone. The Knobs-Norman Upland ecoregion is underlain by Devonian to Mississippian sedimentary rocks. Mississippian siltstones and shale on the surface of this area limit wells to low volumes of water produced through fractures in fine-grained sedimentary rocks, and very few springs exist (Carey et al. 2004). Karst features are shown on Exhibits 1 and 2, pages 2 and 3.

# E. Soils

Soils data were analyzed using a geographic information system (GIS) to determine the predominant soil types (USDA/NRCS 2007a). The most common soils include Maury silt loam, Lowell silt loam, Caleast silt loam, McAfee silt loam, Eden silty clay loam, and Nolin silt loam.

According to Craddock (1981), Maury silt loam is characterized by deep, well drained soils that formed in 1 foot to 2 feet of loess-like material over residuum of weathered limestone. These soils have moderate permeability and are found on karst ridgetops and side slopes. Lowell silt loam is characterized by deep, well drained soils that formed in residuum of weathered limestone. shale, and siltstone. These soils have moderately slow permeability and are found on ridgetops, side slopes, benches, and foot slopes. Caleast silt loam is characterized by deep, well drained soils that formed in residuum of weathered limestone. These soils have moderately slow permeability and are found on karst ridgetops and side slopes. McAfee silt loam is also characterized by moderately deep, well drained soils that formed in residuum of weathered limestone. These soils have moderately slow permeability and are found on karst ridgetops and side slopes (Craddock 1981).

Within the study area, Bonneville soils are hydric, while Dunning, McGary, Newark, and Nolin may have hydric inclusions. These soils are mapped in Exhibits 1 and 2 above. Areas with hydric soils have increased chances of containing wetlands.

# F. Land Use

Land use within the urban boundary of the Study Area includes residential and commercial properties. Agricultural properties are immediately outside the urban boundary. Boyle County is predominately flat surrounding the Study Area, which lends itself well to agricultural uses. These include cultivated crops, pasture/hay and cattle.

#### G. **Ground Water**

The Study Area has a well-developed karst system for groundwater transport including multiple springs and swallets. The Kentucky Geological Survey has mapped groundwater basins in the area and conducted dve trace studies to map the flow. To the west of Danville, the Nolan and Crawford groundwater basins are mapped. The groundwater flow in the Nolan basin did not follow the surface drainage but was traced under Mocks Branch to the Salt River. The Spears groundwater basin, in the northern portion of the study area, empties into Spears Creek. Within Danville, the Centre sinking stream also flows to Spears Creek. Groundwater traces have also been conducted on locations which drain to Balls Branch and Clarks Run in the eastern portion of the watershed.

#### Н. Surface Water

#### 1. Streams

The Study Area is located within the Dix River Watershed HUC#05100205. Streams in the area include Clarks Run, Balls Branch, Mocks Branch, Spears Creek, and Dix River, which is impounded to form Herrington Lake. Numerous unnamed intermittent and perennial streams are also located in the area. According to the Kentucky Division of Water, mapping indicates that no Outstanding State Resource Waters or Wild Rivers existed within the Study Area. Balls Branch and Clarks Run are impaired for primary contact recreational use (nonsupport), and Clarks Run, Mocks Branch, Spears Creek and Herrington Lake are impaired for warmwater aquatic habitat use (partial support for all but Herrington Lake). A Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) has been developed for *E. coli* for Clarks

Run and Balls Branch to address the primary contact recreational use impairment.

#### 2. Floodplain

According to FEMA Flood Hazard Mapping, areas adjacent to Clarks Run and other streams and unnamed tributaries within the Study Area are designated as 100-Year Floodplain (Exhibits 1 and 2). If fill material is placed within these areas. No-Rise Certification will be required. A US Army Corps of Engineers 404 Permit and Kentucky Division of Water 401 Water Quality Certification and Floodplain Permit may be required for stream impacts. After alternatives are developed impacts will be assessed and permit needs will be determined.

#### 3. Wetlands

National Wetland Inventory (NWI) mapping for the Study Area was reviewed for wetlands. These wetlands were primarily palustrine farm ponds with unconsolidated bottoms and are shown on Exhibits 1 and 2.

#### I. Floral and Faunal Communities

Based upon review of aerial and topographic mapping and upon previous site visits to the Study Area for unrelated projects, it is known that land within the Study Area has been converted to agricultural, residential, and commercial uses and is of limited value to wildlife. No large forested tracts are located within the Study Area. Agricultural uses include pasture/hay and cultivation of row crops. These include corn, soybeans, grain and tobacco. The Study Area is not proximate to the Dix River and is thus not influenced by its wooded riparian zone.

# Endangered, Threatened, and Special J. Concern Species Potentially Occurring Within the Study Area

Agency coordination was not conducted per scope of work requirements. On-line resources were examined for KDFWR and KSNPC; USFWS no longer provides on-line species information by county. Therefore, a previously issued database was consulted. Known or potential occurrence of 20 species of concern have been documented for the Study Area (Table 1, page 7). All database results are included in Appendix A.

# 1. Federally Listed Species

In 2008, the USFWS listed three federally listed species for the Study Area. The list includes one mammal, Indiana bat (*Myotis sodalis*); one mussel species, clubshell (*Pleurobema claya*); and one plant, running buffalo clover (*Trifolium stoloniferum*). All of these species are listed as endangered.

The **Indiana bat** formally attained endangered species status on March 11, 1967 (USFWS 1999). A recovery plan was approved March 1, 1999. The historic range for this species consisted of the central and southeastern United States. Within Kentucky, two caves, Bat Cave in Carter County and Coach Cave in Edmonson County, have been designated as critical habitat for the species (USFWS 1976).

Indiana bats hibernate during the winter months in large, cool caves, sinks, and/or mines (hibernacula) where they form tight clusters containing hundreds of individuals. Mines include coal, limestone, and other mineral recovery operations. Each spring, the females emerge from these hibernacula and migrate to summer (maternity) habitat consisting of hardwood forests. Maternity colonies are formed in these areas under the exfoliating bark of dead trees or loose bark of living trees. The migration of males is variable. Some males do not migrate, others migrate only a short distance to smaller, warmer caves, and others migrate to the same habitat as females.

Major reasons for the decline in Indiana bat populations include channelization of streams, impoundment of waterways and associated flooding of bottomland forests, deforestation, application of insecticides, destruction or improper gating of winter habitat (e.g., mines, cisterns, and caves), commercialization of caves, and vandalism of cave habitat (Barbour and Davis 1974; USFWS 1999, 2004; Slone and Wethington 2001).

While potential summer roosting habitat (forest) appears scarce in the study area, according to aerial mapping, field surveys for habitat should be conducted once alternatives are developed. Because the Study Area contains karst topography (see Exhibits 1 and 2, pages 2 and 3), suitable winter habitat (e.g., caves) may be present.

Once alternatives are developed, field surveys for summer and winter Indiana bat habitat should be conducted. If roosting, foraging and winter habitat is found to exist within the Study Area, further consultation with the USFWS Frankfort Field Office may be required as alternatives are developed to comply with Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act.

The **clubshell mussel** formally attained endangered species status on January 22, 1993. A recovery plan was approved September 21, 1994. Historically, the species had a wide range and abundance. The species prefers large perennial streams and small to large rivers in clean, coarse, sand and gravel in runs, often just downstream of a riffle; it cannot tolerate mud or slack-water conditions and is very susceptible to siltation (Watters 1994). Habitat for the clubshell mussel is unlikely to exist in the Study Area.

Running buffalo clover (*Trifolium stoloniferum*) attained endangered species status on July 6. 1987, and a revised final recovery plan was approved on June 27, 2007. The species occurs in central Kentucky and was historically associated with buffalo traces and relatively open savannah woodlands. It is typically associated with limestone-based soils and is dependent on partial shade (filtered sunlight) and periodic disturbance. Habitat may exist for running buffalo clover within the Study Area. Once alternatives are developed, surveys for the presence of running buffalo clover should be conducted. Surveys should occur generally between late April to mid-June, just before, during, or shortly after flowering.

# 2. State Listed Species

State listed threatened or endangered species include 2 plants, 11 birds, 3 insects and 1 reptile. Once alternatives have been developed, a habitat assessment will be required to verify the potential for these species to exist in the Study Area.

**Grass pink** (*Calopogon tuberosus*) is listed as a state endangered species by KSNPC. This member of the orchid family occurs in a diverse range of open, wet habitats with only apparent common factors being full sunlight and constant water supply. Drying of habitat, overshading by woody species and over-collection represent

threats to the species (natureserve.org). Because a field reconnaissance was not performed, it is not known if habitat supporting grass pink exists in the Study Area.

**Softleaf arrowwood** (*Viburnum molle*), also known as Kentucky viburnum, is listed as a state special concern species by KSNPC. This member of the honeysuckle family is found throughout the Midwest but particularly in Kentucky. It prefers cliffs, rocky banks of creeks and moist slopes. Threats to the species may include logging activites in wooded areas (Ohio Department of Natural Resources; Wharton *et al.* 1973). Habitat for this species is unlikely to occur within the Study Area.

Henslow's sparrow (Ammodramus henslowii) is listed as a state species of concern and a federal species of management concern by KSNPC. This sparrow is found in open fields and meadows with relatively thick/dense grass interspersed with weeds or shrubby vegetation (natureserve.org). Field verification will be required to determine if habitat for Henslow's sparrow exists in the Study Area.

Northern shoveler (Anas clypeata) is listed as a state endangered species by KDFWR. This subspecies of dabbling duck has a global migratory range. Its presence in Kentucky is suggested to be migratory and thus transient. During migration, the species favors both freshwater and brackish habitats, and (not typically) in cultivated fields. Habitat for northern shoveler is not likely to exist in the Study Area. (natureserve.org)

**Blue-winged teal** (*Anas discors*) is listed as a state threatened species by KDFWR. This subspecies of dabbling duck has a global migratory range. Its presence in Kentucky is suggested to be migratory and thus transient. In migration and when not breeding, the species

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favors both freshwater and brackish situations. It prefers freshwater marshes, ponds, and sloughs, but occurs also in river pools, salt ponds, coastal lagoons, estuaries, and flooded pastures. Ponds may provide habitat for blue-winged teal in the Study Area (natureserve.org).

**Bobolink** (*Dolichonyx oryzivorus*) is listed a state special concern species by KDFWR and KSNPC. Breeding habitat for this migratory species includes tall grass areas, flooded meadows, prairie, deep cultivated grains, and hayfields. Nests are on the ground in small hollows in areas of concealing herbaceous vegetation. The species is threatened in Kentucky by incidental mortality from agricultural operations that disturb nesting habitat during breeding season (May to July), habitat loss and fragmentation, and pesticide exposure. Habitat for bobolink may exist in the Study Area (natureserve.org).

American coot (Fulica americana) is listed as a state endangered species by KDFWR. This migratory waterfowl species is referenced as having non-breeding populations in Kentucky. The species prefers freshwater lakes, ponds, marshes, and larger rivers, wintering also on brackish estuaries and bays. It is also found on calm open water with plenty of algae and other aquatic vegetation. Ponds may provide habitat for American coot in the Study Area (natureserve.org).

**Peregrine falcon** (*Falco peregrinus*) is listed as a state endangered species by KDFWR. While the species was federally delisted in 1999, it is still protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act. Although the species historically nests on cliffs, the abundant prey combined with high structures in urban areas provide good habitat for the species. KDFWR's placement of nesting boxes throughout the state has encouraged resurgence of the species. The urban core of Danville has tall structures that may appeal to the

species. No clifflines exist in the Study Area (KDFWR).

Dark-eyed junco (Junco hyemalis) is listed as a state special concern species by KDFWR. This widespread species appears to have undergone a slow but steady decline in abundance over the past several decades. The cause of the decline is unknown, although no major threats have been identified. Habitat includes coniferous, mixed. and deciduous forest; forest edges and clearings; bogs; and open woodland. In migration and winter the species occurs in a wide range of openly wooded and brushy and grassy habitats. Habitat for the species is not likely to exist in the Study Area. (natureserve.org)

Yellow-crowned night-heron (Nyctanassa violacea) is listed as a state threatened species by KDFWR and KSNPC. This species prefers a coastal habitat, such as marshes, swamps, lakes, lagoons, and mangroves. Inland habitat, although less frequently, includes forested and herbaceous wetland and riparian corridors. Threats include disturbance and loss/degradation of nesting and foraging habitat. It is probably susceptible to reduced reproductive success caused by pesticide contamination. The preferred coastal habitat for the species does not exist in the Study Area. (natureserve.org)

Savannah sparrow (Passerculus sandwichensis) is listed as a state special concern species by KDFWR and KSNPC. Preferred habitat in the Midwest includes cropland/hedgerow, grassland/herbaceous, It prefers habitat with short to intermediate vegetation heiaht. intermediate vegetation density, and breeding, a well-developed litter layer. Habitat for this species is likely to occur within the Study Area. The species appears to be susceptible to brood parasitism by brown-headed cowbirds. Threats to the species also include loss of habitat through timing of agricultural operations (natureserve.org).

**Double-created cormorant** (*Phalacrocorax auritus*) is listed as a state endangered species by KDFWR. This water-loving species prefers large bodies of water, of which none exist in the Study Area. Threats to the species include illegal hunting, residual pesticide contamination and predation of eggs and young by crows, ravens and gulls. (natureserve.org)

**Barn owl** (*Tyto alba*) is listed as a state species of special concern by KSNPC. Barn owls hunt over open farmland, woodlands, and suburban areas (Vanner 2003). Roosting occurs in dark secluded buildings (*e.g.*, barns), cliffs, and trees (Barbour *et al.* 1973). This habitat could exist in cleared agricultural areas within the Study Area.

Coal skink (Eumeces anthracinus) is listed as a state threatened species by KDFWR and KSNPC. This lizard occurs primarily in fairly dry rocky open woodlands, remnant glades and prairies, old quarries and gravel pits, rocky fields, and utility line corridors with some bare ground and scattered areas of cover including rocks, sunny outcrops, old railroad ties, and/or discarded tree limbs and general household rubbish. Although some of the literature indicates that coal skinks are most often found in mesic habitats, nearly all Kentucky sites are quite dry and open. (Kentucky Comprehensive Wildlife Conservation Strategy,

http://fw.ky.gov/kfwis/stwg/volume%20ii/Reptilia/reptilia.htm#847. Habitat for the species is not likely to occur in the Study Area.

Three insects: **hidden cave beetle** [(Pseudanophthalmus conditus), state threatened species by KDFWR and KSNPC], **old well cave beetle** [(Pseydanophthalmus puteanus), state threatened species by KDFWR and KSNPC], and **cave obligate beetle** [(Pseudanophthalmus

elongates), state threatened species and Federal species of management concern by KSNPC] are also listed as potentially occurring in Boyle County. A field survey would be required to determine the presence of karst features that would favor potential presence of these species.

In addition to the listed species, KSNPC also included reference to a siltstone/shale glade community in Boyle County. A site survey would be required to verify presence or absence of this community in the Study Area.

# III. UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS / HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Third Rock conducted a desktop assessment of underground storage tank (UST) and hazardous material sites within the study area. The assessment consisted of the review of environmental resource agency database records and the following summary of the records. The findings consisted of the collection of records which can be geographically referenced as being within the project Study Area limits. The database research was provided by Environmental Data Resources, Inc. (EDR). The report included 182 records for the Study Area. with some sites having multiple records.

This summary discusses those sites that could represent an alignment consideration, are more likely to create a significant liability, or present complications related to right of way (ROW) acquisition. Each site is noted with a site name, address and map ID. The mapping of these records included all 182 records identified in the EDR report including the records discussed in this summary. The Executive Summary of the EDR report and mapping of these sites are included in Appendices B and C, respectively.

The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Information System (CERCLIS) contains data on potentially hazardous waste sites. CERCLIS contains sites which are either proposed to or on the National Priorities List (NPL) and sites which are in the screening and assessment phase for possible inclusion on the NPL. The purchase of ROW from within the designated boundary of a CERCLIS site could result in the owner acquiring liability for future cleanup and monitoring and may require corrective action before it could be utilized as roadway.

One site was identified in the CERCLIS database:

 Philips Lighting, Location: 320 Vaksdahl Avenue (Map ID 73)

CERC-NFRAP are archived sites are sites that have been removed and archived from the inventory of CERCLIS sites. Archived status indicates that, to the best of EPA's knowledge, assessment at a site has been completed and that EPA has determined no further steps will be taken to list this site on the National Priorities List (NPL), unless information indicates this decision was not appropriate or other considerations require a recommendation for listing at a later time. This decision does not necessarily mean that there is no hazard associated with a given site; it only means that, based upon available information, the location is not judged to be a potential NPL site. The purchase of ROW from within the designated boundary of the CERCLIS site could result in the owner acquiring liability for future cleanup and monitoring and may require corrective action before it could be utilized as roadway.

One site was identified in the CERC-NFRAP database:

 Matsushita Floor Care Co., Location: 1355 Lebanon Road (Map ID 79)

CORRACTS is a list of handlers with hazardous waste corrective action activity. This report

shows which nationally-defined corrective action core events have occurred for every handler that has had corrective action activity. This is commonly related to releases of hazardous waste into the soil or groundwater. The purchase of ROW from a CORRACTS site could result in a similar liabilities and complications as a CERCLIS site.

Two sites were identified in the CORRACTS database:

- Philips Lighting, Location: 320 Vaksdahl Avenue (Map ID 73)
- ATR Wire and Cable Co., Location: 1857 Danville By-Pass (Map ID 138)

RCRA-TSDF: Resource Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA) information system is provides access to data supporting the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. The database includes selective information on sites which generate, transport, store, treat and/or dispose of hazardous waste as defined by RCRA. Transporters are individuals or entities that move hazardous waste from the generator offsite to a facility that can recycle, treat, store, or dispose of the waste. Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facilities (TSDFs) treat, store, or dispose of the waste. This listing may include sites that have hazardous waste impacted soil and groundwater. Three sites were identified in RCRA-TSDF database:

- Philips Lighting, Location: 320 Vaksdahl Avenue (Map ID 73)
- ATR Wire and Cable Co., Location: 1857 Danville By-Pass (Map ID 138)
- Danville Automotive Machine, Location 520 South Fourth Street (Map ID 87)

The RCRA large quantity generators (RCRA-LQG) database includes facilities that generate over 1,000 kilograms (kg) of hazardous waste, or over 1 kg of acutely hazardous waste per month. Special consideration of these sites will be

required to determine if the sites would result in the purchase of contaminated ROW.

Two LQGs were identified in the project study area:

- Philips Lighting, Location: 320 Vaksdahl Avenue (Map ID 73)
- Meggitt Aircraft Braking Systems, Location: 190 Corporate Drive (Map ID 120)

The Kentucky Hazardous Waste Sites (KY SHWS) records are the State of Kentucky's equivalent to CERCLIS. These sites may or may not already be listed on the federal CERCLIS list.

These sites may be planned for cleanup using state funds (state equivalent of Superfund), or may be part of an inventory of sites for consideration or assessment within the Kentucky superfund system. The purchase of ROW from within the boundary of a SHWS could result in the owner acquiring liability for future cleanup and monitoring and may require corrective action before it could be utilized as roadway.

Thirteen sites were identified in the KY SHWS database.

KY SWF/LF: The Solid Waste Facilities/Landfill Sites records typically contain an inventory of solid waste disposal facilities or landfills. The data come from the Kentucky Division of Waste Management's list of all active contained and residential landfills and transfer stations. The database does not provide a distinction between a transfer station and a landfill. Should the project acquire property within the limits of a

landfill significant efforts in regulatory compliance and waste management and may require substantial engineering consideration.

KY HIST LF: This solid waste facility listing contains information that is not included in the landfill listing. A listing with detail information is no longer available from the Kentucky Division of Waste Management.

A review of the KY HIST LF list has identified two KY HIST LF sites within the searched area:

- Stevens Dispos-All, Location: 700 Dillehay Street (Map ID 77)
- City of Danville Land Farm, Location: 1970 Old Stanford Road (Map ID 130)

UST sites: The database search identified 84 UST sites within the study area. MGP: Manufactured Gas Plant Database includes records of coal gas plants compiled by

EDR's researchers. Manufactured gas sites were used in the United States from the 1800's to

1950's to produce a gas that could be distributed and used as fuel. These produced a significant amount of waste and commonly create significant environmental conditions due to soil and groundwater contamination.

One MGP site was identified in the study area:



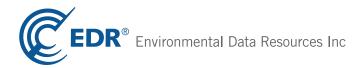



On August 26, 2013, Third Rock Consultants, LLC (Third Rock) submitted to Parsons Brinckerhoff (PB) an environmental overview for ecology and UST/hazardous materials. By email dated March 4, 2014, Third Rock was requested by PB to provide additional environmental review at the project level for the Danville Small Urban Area Study. In that email, PB provided to Third Rock a map naming the individual project locations (attached) as well as project descriptions and graphics for individual project locations. Third Rock was asked to identify additional ecological or hazardous materials environmental concerns from the original assessment. Based upon this second-level environmental review, Third Rock determined that the following individual projects have no environmental impacts for the reasons listed below.



As noted above, most of the proposed improvements may involve coordination with USACE and KDOW to determine or verify 404/401 permitting or wetland identification/mitigation requirements. If a proposed location's improvements require a 404 permit, additional compliance requirements may apply, such as Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act or Section 106, cultural resources. It should also be noted that no field studies verified the presence or absence of T&E species habitat, wetlands, hydric soils, or locations of culverts or drainage ditches.

Formal coordination with KDWM is likely not required for "L-E" and "ST-E." The location of the monitoring wells should be verified; however, it is likely that they are outside the proposed improvement disturbance limits.

# **Project Background**

In July and August 2013, Cultural Resource Analysts, Inc. (CRA), conducted a cultural resource records review for the Small Urban Area (SUA) study for the city of Danville and the surrounding unincorporated area of Boyle County, Kentucky. The review was conducted at the request of Arlen C. Sandlin, Area Manager of Parsons Brinckerhoff, Inc. The study area is centered on Danville, the county seat of Boyle County, and includes incorporated portions of the city and the unincorporated areas in the county surrounding the city. The cultural historic resources in the SUA study area are discussed in this report.

The SUA study will identify and examine transportation issues related to safety and congestion in the city of Danville and the surrounding area. The SUA study will focus on short-term improvements that can be quickly and effectively implemented at both an individual intersection level and at a corridor-wide level. The study will produce a list of short-term recommendations which the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), City of Danville, Boyle County and/or private developers can take for further project development and implementation. The study will also seek to address long-term concerns by examining the future transportation needs and determining options for future improvement projects.

## **Cultural Historic Records Review**

A search of records maintained by the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) (available online at: http://nrhp.focus.nps.gov/natreghome.do?searchtype=natreghome) and the Kentucky Heritage Council (KHC) (FY14\_1496) was conducted to: 1) determine if the SUA study area had been previously surveyed for cultural historic resources; 2) identify any previously recorded cultural historic sites that were situated within the study area; and 3) provide information concerning what cultural historic resources could be expected within the study area. The project team, consisting of the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), the Bluegrass Area Development District (BGADD), and consultant Parsons Brinckerhoff, Inc., developed the study area utilized for this report.

KHC geographic information system (GIS) data requested by CRA on July 12, 2013, was returned on July 17, 2013, and researched by Trent Spurlock on July 18, 2013 (see Figure 1,

oversized map, attached). The work at KHC consisted of a review of professional survey reports and records of cultural historic sites for the SUA study.

KHC records revealed that there are two designated National Historic Landmarks (NHL), nine NRHP-listed historic districts, 306 contributing elements of the historic districts, 31 individually listed NRHP properties, 25 properties that have been determined eligible for listing in the NRHP, and 63 previously surveyed properties that have an undetermined status in the KHC database that are located within the study area.

#### National Historic Landmarks

According to the National Park Service, NHLs "are nationally significant historic places designated by the Secretary of the Interior because they possess exceptional value or quality in illustrating or interpreting the heritage of the United States. Today, fewer than 2,500 historic places bear this national distinction" (National Park Service 2013). Two NHLs are located in the study area: the Dr. Ephraim McDowell House (BOD 33) and Jacobs Hall (BOD 128) located on the campus of the Kentucky School for the Deaf (Table 1). Both properties were designated NHLs in 1966 and are located in downtown Danville.

## Historic Districts and Properties

Two multiple resource area nominations were completed for Boyle County. These are not nominations, per say, but are cover documents that include contexts and information to determine the NRHP eligibility of associated properties. Individual or groups of properties may be listed in the NRHP under the cover document, thereby creating a multiple property submission. The Historic and Architectural Resources of Boyle County, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination was completed in July 1997 by Christine Amos and Amanda Bradley of Burry and Amos, Inc. The nomination focuses on six historic contexts for the county: exploration and settlement; transportation; domestic architecture; agriculture; religion; and political history. The contexts were situated in four periods of history: settlement (1780-1820); antebellum (1821-1865); post bellum (1866-1917); and early modern (1918-1945). Three sites that had been previously nominated to the NRHP in association with this Multiple Property Listing were related to the following themes: education; commerce; and African-American heritage (Amos and Bradley 1997).

The Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination was completed by Helen Powell of H. Powell and Company, Inc. in December 1984. Five historic districts and eight individual properties were included within the cover document. The nomination contains a very brief historic context for Danville (Powell 1984).

Ten NRHP-listed historic districts are located in the study area (Tables 2 and 3). Nine of the historic districts are located in or near downtown Danville: the Constitution Square Historic District; the Danville Commercial District; the East Main Street Historic District; the Lexington Avenue-Broadway District; the Maple Avenue District; St. Mildred's Court-West Lexington Avenue Historic District; Terrace Court Historic District; Todd-Montgomery Houses (Beaten Biscuit Row); and the Warehouse District. Within these nine historic districts are 322 contributing properties.

The Constitution Square Historic District is located in downtown Danville and is bounded by Main, First, Walnut, and Second Streets. Situated within the Constitution Square Historic District are nine contributing resources including log, frame, and brick structures dating from 1786 to 1820 (Wallace and Grider 1971: 7-1).

The Danville Commercial District was listed under the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination. The Danville Commercial District extends east to west along Main Street from First Street westward to just past the intersection with Fourth Street. For the most part the boundary of the historic district extends to the rear of buildings oriented

to Main Street, with four blocks on the north side of Main Street and two blocks to the south of the street. The Danville Commercial District contains 40 contributing resources, including commercial buildings, churches, and the Boyle County Courthouse (BOD 32). The majority of buildings date from the later portion of the nineteenth century through the first decades of the twentieth century (Powell n.d. a).

The East Main Street Historic District was listed under the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination. This historic district, containing 33 contributing resources, includes single- and two-story residences exhibiting various architectural styles and forms, such as Queen Anne, Classical Revival, American Foursquares, and Bungalows. The historic district extends along East Main Street between Bruce Court and Center Street (Powell n.d. b).

The Lexington Avenue-Broadway District was listed under the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination. This historic district is located along portions of Lexington Avenue and Broadway to the north and northeast of the center of the city. The historic district extends along Lexington Avenue westward from near its intersection with Cecil Street to near Fifth Street. The historic district also includes a portion of Broadway from near its intersection with Third Street and west to the intersection with Fifth Street. The Lexington Avenue-Broadway District includes 130 contributing properties that exhibit a variety of architectural styles and forms, including: Federal, Greek Revival, Gothic Revival, Italianate, Queen Anne, American Foursquare, Classical Revival, and Bungalows (Powell n.d. c).

The Maple Avenue District, listed under the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination, extends to the north and south along approximately eight blocks of Maple Avenue. The south end of the historic district begins near Main Street and continues to the north to near Rosemont Avenue. The historic district contains 42 contributing resources. The majority of the resources within the historic district's boundary are houses exhibiting Greek Revival, Italianate, and Classical Revival architectural styles (Powell n.d. d).

Containing 41 contributing resources is the St. Mildred's Court-West Lexington Avenue Historic District, located north-northwest of the center of Danville's downtown. This historic district extends from the north to the south along St. Mildred's Court between West Lexington Avenue and West Main Street. The historic district also includes structures along both the north and south sides of West Lexington Avenue from its intersection with St. Mildred's Court and continuing to the west. The residences in the St. Mildred's Court-West Lexington Avenue Historic District include architectural styles and forms such as the Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, American Foursquare, Bungalow, and the American Small House (Breeding 1993).

The Terrace Court Historic District is comprised of ten residences, four structures, and one contributing site located to the west of Wilderness Road and between East Broadway and East Main Street in the eastern portion of Danville. The five residences, oriented to the south, face the other five dwellings of the historic district that are oriented to the north with a lawn separating the two groups of houses. A concrete sidewalk extends along the middle of the lawn between the houses dating to the early 1930s (Taylor 2009).

The Todd-Montgomery Houses (Beaten Biscuit Row) is a historic district comprised of four contributing resources. The resources are residences located along the west side of North Third Street; three are situated south of the intersection with Lexington Avenue and one resource is located north of the intersection. The four dwellings date from 1837 to 1842 (Grider 1975).

The Warehouse District, listed under the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination, is located to the southwest of the Maple Avenue Historic District in the western portion of Danville. Containing six contributing resources, the Warehouse

District is bounded to the north by West Main Street and to the south by West Walnut Street and extends to both sides of Harding Street. Situated adjacent to the railroad tracks, the buildings in the district have historically contained manufacturing, storage, and transportation services (Powell n.d. e).

One historic district, the Harrodsburg Pike Rural Historic District, is located in the unincorporated portion of the study area. Only the southern portion of the Harrodsburg Pike Rural Historic District is located in the northwest portion of the study area, to the northwest of Danville. The entire historic district contains 46 contributing resources plus an additional 19 that were previously listed in the NRHP (Amos 1997). That portion of the Harrodsburg Pike Rural Historic District situated in the study area contains two properties with numerous contributing resources: the Helm-Gentry House (BO 341) and the Cambus Kenneth Estate (BO 342).

# **Individually Listed NRHP Properties**

Thirty-one individually listed NRHP properties are located in the study area (Table 4). These individually listed properties are scattered throughout the study area, with many situated in or near the incorporated portion of the study area. In the unincorporated portions of the study area, those individually listed properties with large NRHP boundaries include: Pleasant Vale (Samuel McDowell House, BO 364), located in the northeast portion of the study area; The T. B. Bright House and Farmstead (BO 356), situated in the western portion of the study area; the Granite Hill Farmstead (William Bryant House, BO 368), located in the east-southeast portion of the study area to the immediate south of KY 52; the Cambus Kenneth Estate (BO 342), located in the northwest portion of the study area; and the Charles W. Caldwell House (BO 308) in the southwest portion of the study area. One individually listed NRHP property with a large boundary is located in the incorporated portion of Danville, the Danville National Cemetery, which is located within the Bellevue Cemetery (BOD 81). Five individual properties within the city limits of Danville were individually listed in the Multiple Resource Area of Danville, Kentucky NRHP Multiple Property Listing nomination, including: Bellevue Cemetery (BOD 81); First Presbyterian Church and McDowell Park (BOD 30); the Carnegie Library (BOD 148); 420 East Lexington (BOD 118); and 432 West Main Street (BOD 147).

# Properties Determined Eligible for Listing in the NRHP

Twenty-three properties have been determined eligible for listing in the NRHP according to the KHC database (Table 5). Of these 23 properties, two have been determined eligible by the Keeper of the National Register and, according the KHC database, one property currently has its NRHP nomination pending (the Willis-Russel House, BOD 141) and should therefore be considered eligible for listing in the NRHP. The KHC database indicates three additional properties have been rejected for listing in the NRHP: the Spears-Craig Barn (BO 416); the James Birney Home (Woodlawn, BOD 15); and the Gore House (BOD 86). Although rejected for listing by the NRHP, the KHC would still consider the three properties as eligible for the NRHP (KHC). Six of the 23 properties have been assigned KHC site numbers that indicate they are not located in Danville while the remainder is designated as being located in Danville.

## Properties with Undetermined Status in the KHC Database

Sixty-three previously surveyed properties that have an undetermined status in the KHC database are situated within the study area (Table 6). These properties are nearly evenly divided as located in Danville or the unincorporated portion of the study area. According to the KHC database, three of the dwellings have been demolished (BO 309, BO 324, and BO 325).

# Previous Cultural Historic Reports within the Study Area

The files of the KHC provided the "Boyle County Survey Report" completed by Gibson Worsham in 1991. Worsham developed skeleton contexts for nine themes of significance: agriculture, commerce, manufacturing, transportation, education, religion, ethnic history, political/public service, and domestic. Based on the format established for the Bluegrass Cultural Landscape Project, four primary periods were addressed, including Exploration and Settlement (1780-1820), the Antebellum Years (1821-1865), the Industrial Age (1866-1918), and the Early Modern period (1919-1945) (Worsham 1991: 6).

In 1999, a new book on the historic resources of the county was released. *Danville and Boyle County in the Bluegrass Region of Kentucky: An Architectural History* was initiated by the Heart of Danville, with funding from the KHC. Written by Mary Jo Joseph and Janet Hamner, this book included an overall historic context for this area and a brief context for each period. It addressed the structures within four periods: Settlement (1774-1820), Antebellum (1821-1864), Postbellum (1865-1899), and Early Modern (1900-1945). Most of the book consists of pictures of various houses accompanied by brief caption descriptions (Joseph and Hamner 1999).

A Cultural Resource Survey of US 127 From Hustonville to the Danville Bypass in Lincoln and Boyle Counties, Kentucky report by Helen C. Powell of H. Powell and Co., Inc, was identified during the records review. This report was completed in 1988 for the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, Division of Environmental Analysis in Frankfort, Kentucky. The project APE extended from south of Hustonville in Lincoln County northward along US 127 to the Danville Bypass in Boyle County. Of the five NRHP-listed properties within the project's APE only one was located in Boyle County: Warrenwood (BO 327). The Willis Green House (BO 59) is also listed in the NRHP but is situated north of the project's APE. Of the forty-four previously identified sites, five were located in Boyle County and seven in Junction City. Nineteen previously unidentified sites were surveyed for the project. Four sites included in the 1988 report by Powell are within the southern portion of the study area: BO 324 (recommended as potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criteria B and C; according to the KHC database this property has been demolished); BO 325 (house had been demolished leaving only the outbuildings which were recommended as not eligible for listing in the NRHP); BO 326 (not recommended eligible for listing in the NRHP; and BO 327 (Warrenwood, individually listed in the NRHP) (Powell 1988: 1–2, 18–19, 31, 33, and 59).

During the records review at the KHC, the report entitled *The Todd-McKee-Cheek House, A Study of its Architecture, Its Residents and Their Lifestyles* was identified. Christen A. Cheek served as editor for this report, completed in 1990. The residence is located at 229 North Third Street, Danville. The report includes an architectural and photographic study, a history of the families associated with the Todd-McKee-Cheek House, oral history from Mary Ashby Cheek, and a prospective of Danville during the Civil War (Cheek, editor 1990). The Todd-McKee-Cheek House (BOD 68) is a contributing property to the NRHP-listed Todd-Montgomery Houses (Beaten Biscuit Row) Historic District in Danville.

A Cultural Historic Survey of the Proposed Cellular Communication Tower Site, Hightower Road, Danville, Boyle County, Kentucky by Rebecca Lawin McCarley of CRA was located during the records review. The report was completed in 2001 for Hagerty Engineering of Jeffersonville, Indiana. The area of potential effect (APE) for the 2001 report is located entirely in the southern portion of the study area. The project was for the extension of an existing 140 ft cellular tower on Hightower Road to 170 ft in height. Five sites within the APE of the 2001 project had been previously identified: BO 59; BO 324; BO 325; BO 326; and BO 409. Two of the previously identified sites were listed in the NRHP: Waveland (Willis Green House, BO 59) and the McFerren-Rue House (BO 324). According to the report, the McFerren-Rue House (BO 324) has been demolished, as had the previously identified BO 325. Seven previously unidentified properties (BO 431–BO 434, BOD 375, BOD 376,

BOD 01) were located during the survey, and none, including the two previously identified sites (BO 326 and BO 409), were recommended as eligible for the NRHP (McCarley 2001).

The Cultural Historic Survey for the Proposed KY 2168 - New Route From KY 33 to KY 34, Northeast of Danville, Boyle County, Kentucky (7-210.00) report was located during the records review. This report was completed by Dean A. Doerrfeld of CRA in 2004. The APE for this 2004 report is located in the northeastern portion of the study area, beginning near Stony Point Church on KY 34 (Lexington Road) and extending to the west and northwest to KY 33 (Shakertown Road). Eight sites within the APE for the 2004 report had been previously surveyed, with five listed in the NRHP (BO 352, BO 356, BO 360, BO 362, and BO 364). One of the previously identified sites (BO 365) appeared eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criteria A and C. Six previously unidentified individual historic sites were documented during the 2004 survey. Two of these sites (BO 442 and BO 443) appeared eligible for inclusion in the NRHP under Criterion A. According to the report, "A reassessment of boundaries established for previously listed resources indicates that a potentially eligible National Register district lies in the area roughly bounded by KY 33 to the west, KY 34 and the Danville city limits to the south, and Taylor Road to the east, with a northern boundary roughly equal to an extension of Spears Road eastward from KY 33. This potential district includes all five previously listed resources and the three sites determined potentially eligible as part of this study. Eligible under Criterion A, the potential district achieves significance as an excellent example of an agricultural landscape representing development from the settlement period through the midtwentieth century. The proposed road passes through the center of the potential district and will have an adverse effect" (Doerrfeld 2004: i). The State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), Director of the KHC, concurred that the proposed East Boyle County Rural Historic District was eligible for listing in the NHRP with the following contributing resources: BO 352, BO 365, BO 364, BO 442, BO 362, BO 443, BO 356, and BO 360. The SHPO also agreed with the recommended NRHP boundary for the proposed historic district. The SHPO concurred that the following properties within the 2004 report's APE were not eligible either individually or in the context of the historic district: BO 438; BO 439; and BO 441.

The Documentation and Evaluation of the Coldiron-Watkins Memorial Water Treatment Plant in Danville, Boyle County, Kentucky letter report by Matthew D. McMahan of CRA was located during the file search at KHC. This letter report, completed in 2011, documented and evaluated structures associated with the water treatment plant in a nearly five acre APE. The Coldiron-Watkins Memorial Water Treatment Plant (BOD 474) is located between East Lexington Avenue (KY 34) and Cecil Street and southeast of Parkview Drive. The property had not been previously surveyed according to KHC records. The report recommended the property was not eligible for listing in the NHRP (McMahan 2011). The KHC concurred with CRA's recommendation that the water treatment plant was not eligible for listing in the NRHP.

## Cultural Historic Records Review Results

As indicated on Figure 1, historic resources have been surveyed throughout the study area with many concentrated in the city limits of Danville. The majority of historic properties within the study area that are individually listed or contributing to NRHP-listed historic districts are located in Danville. The NRHP-listed Harrodsburg Pike Rural Historic District contains resources in the northwestern portion of the study area and the East Boyle County Rural Historic District, which was recommended as eligible for listing in the NRHP with concurrence by the KHC, is situated in the northeast section of the study area.

Numerous historic resources have been recorded in the rural areas of the study area. It would be expected that many more historic resources are located outside the Danville city limits, especially properties with outbuildings associated with agricultural operations. These rural agricultural properties may retain landscapes with intact integrity that could support large boundaries, if the sites

are eligible for listing in the NRHP. Mid-twentieth century residences are expected to be located in the rural portions of the study area as residents began building dwellings outside the central portion of Danville.

CRA recommends that any projects developed as a result of this SUA study should avoid impacts to the area's many known historic properties identified in this report. Additional cultural historic investigations also may be required to identify previously undocumented cultural historic resources in the vicinity of any such projects.
