The New Law is Changing the Grant Landscape

- More than a dozen new USDOT Programs and Pilots
- 60,000 new potential grant partners for USDOT
- Grant Programs of special interest to KYTC
 - INFRA
 - TIGER/BUILD/RAISE
 - National Infrastructure Project Assistance (Mega Projects)
 - Rural Surface Transportation Program
 - Bridge Investment Program
 - Congestion Relief Program
 - PROTECT (Resilience)
 - EV Charging Program

Our Challenge

Program Management Responsibilities Will Change

- Align NOFOs with broader spectrum of projects
- Coordinate and submit KYTC applications, assist local understanding
- Successful Projects: Monitor and close out a greater number of projects

The Effort to Generate Grant Funding Must Evolve

- Projects must meet USDOT expectations
- Local Projects will be weighed equally by USDOT
- KYTC will need to staff the effort appropriately

- Identified individual grant program eligibilities
- Developed a “Grants Matrix” for ease of reference
- Developed a form for obtaining District grant project recommendations
- Shared Federal Grants Working Group outputs with DOH Leadership
