2020 Census PL94-171 Redistricting Data

- Public Law (P.L.) 94-171, enacted by Congress in 1975.
- Small area population counts for redistricting
- The first 2020 decennial Census product released on August 12, 2021.

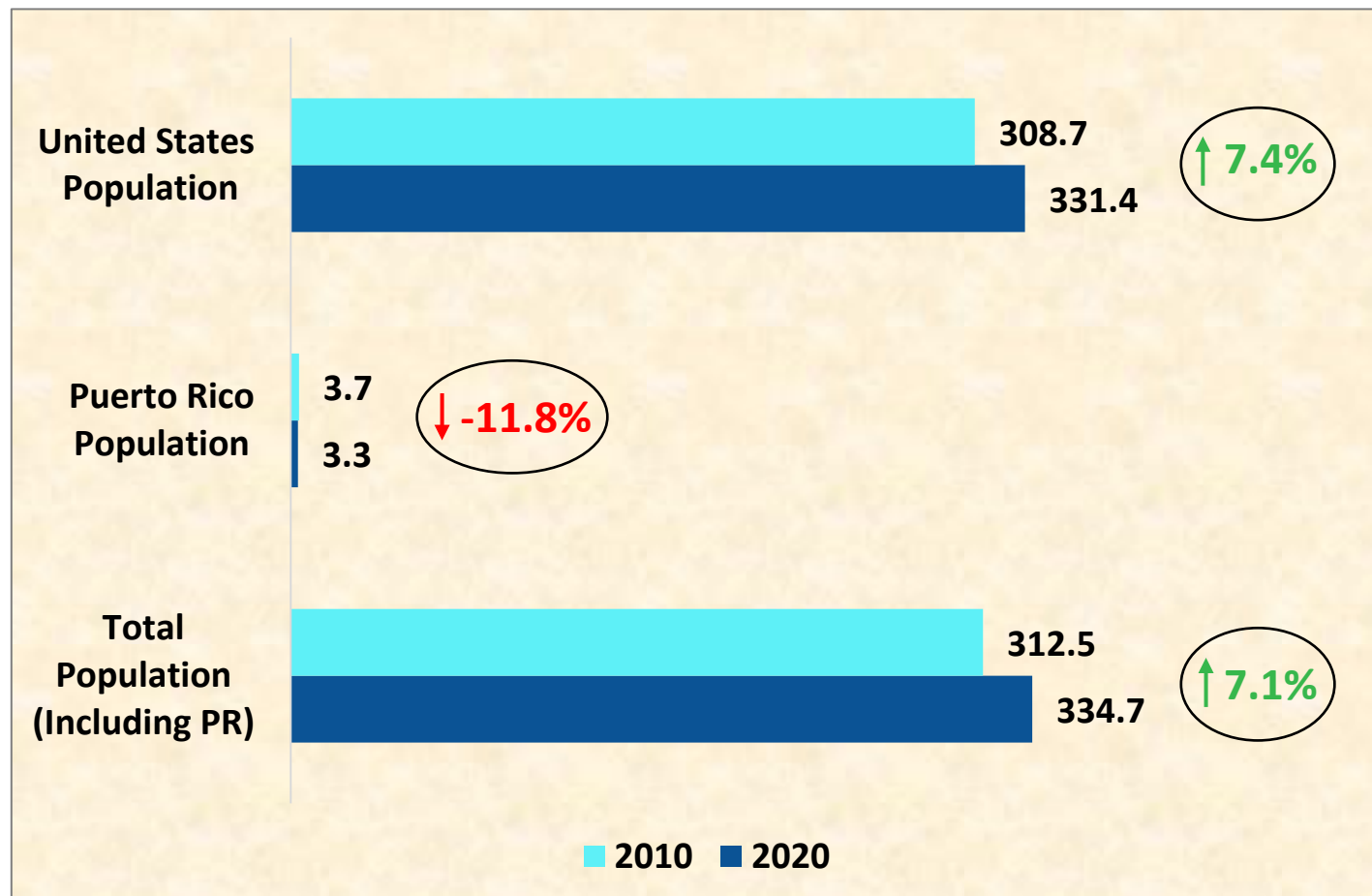
- **Total Population**

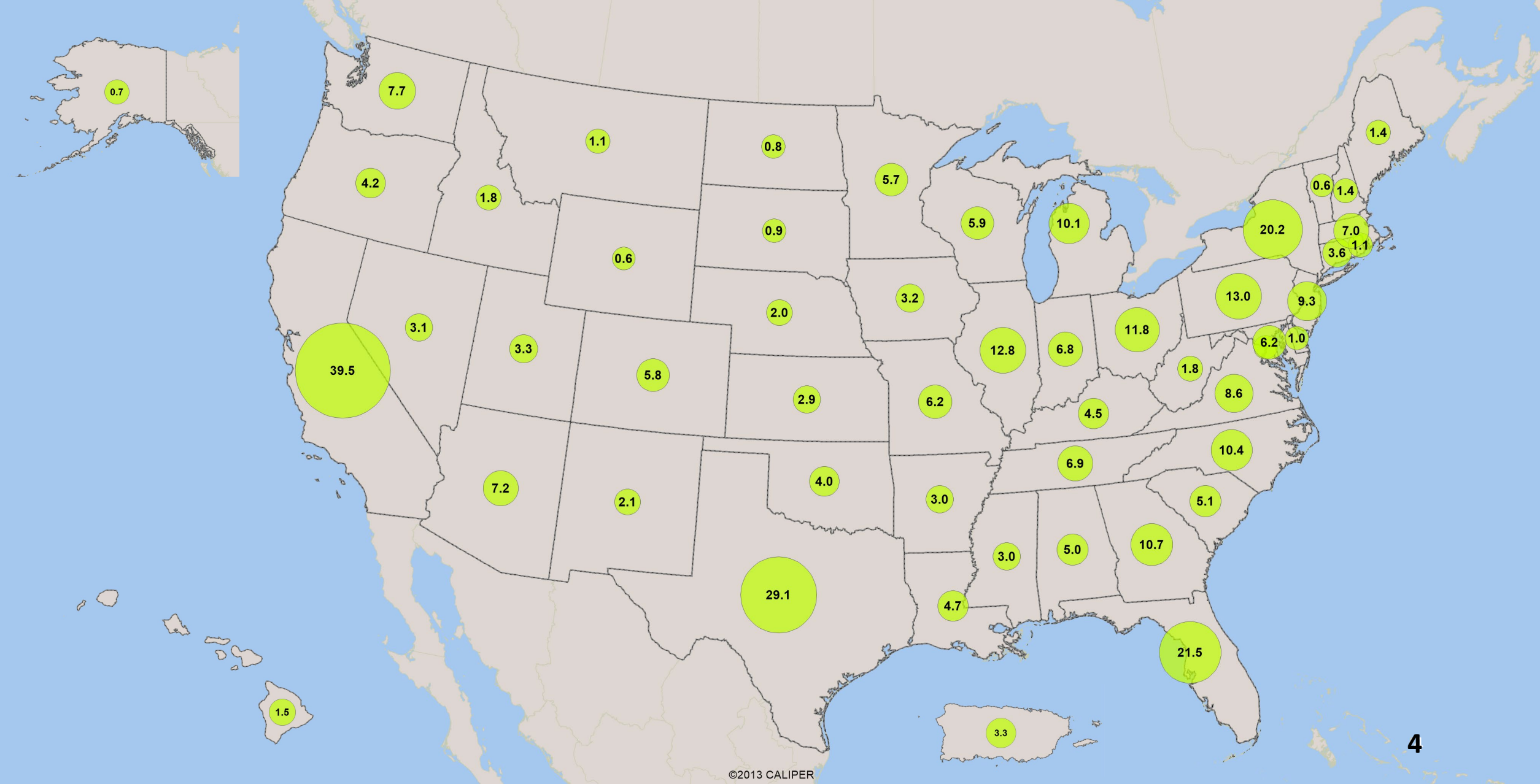

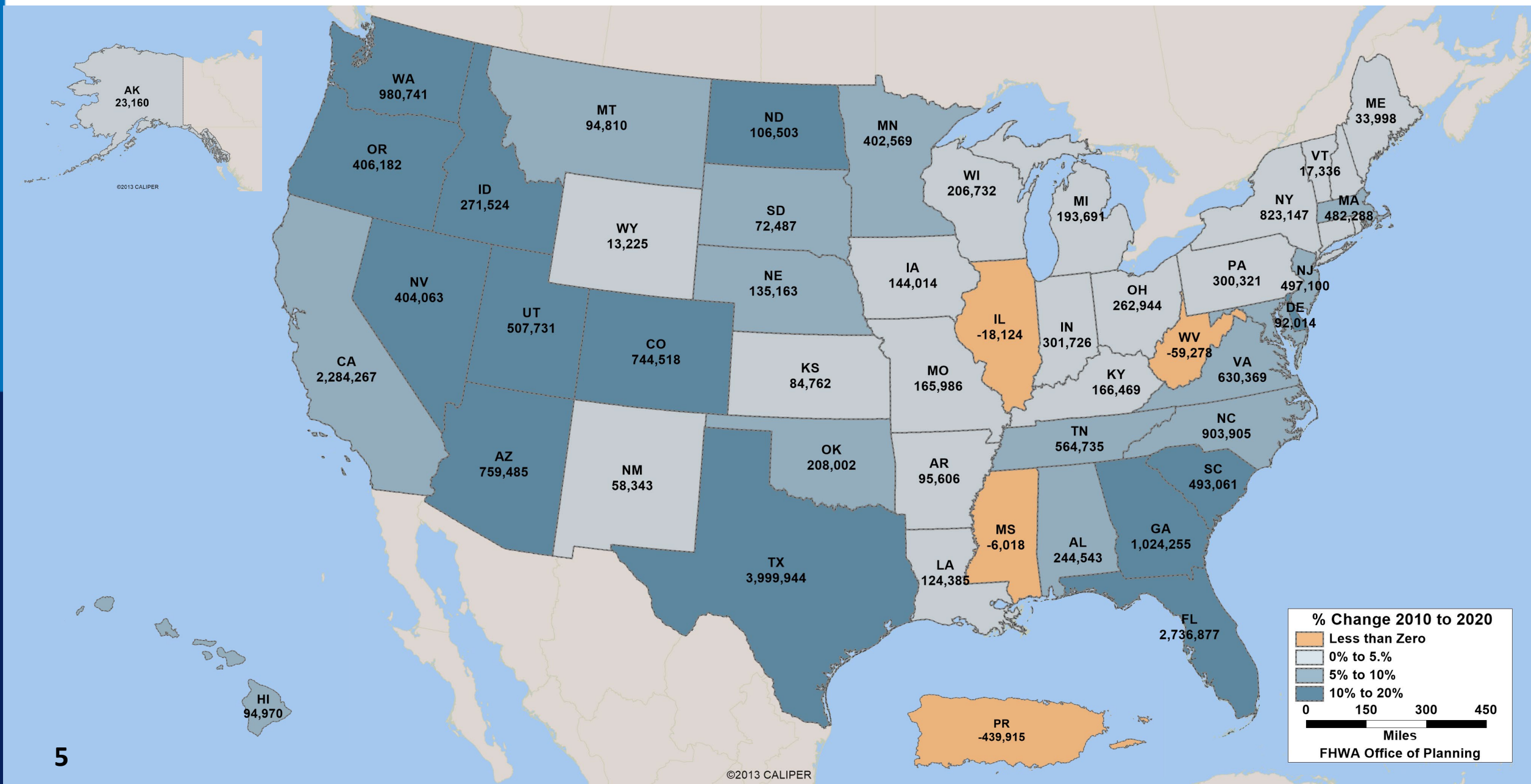

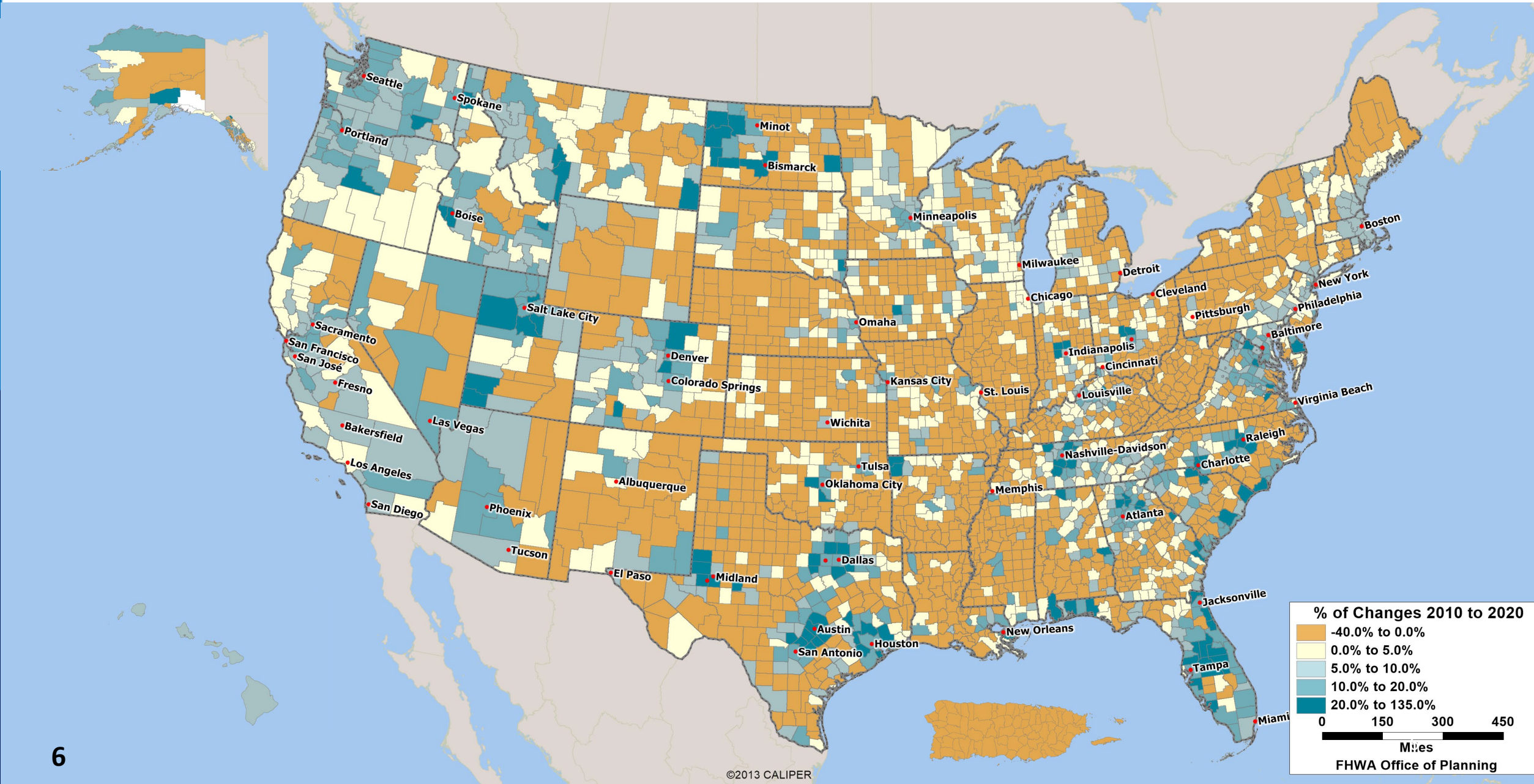
2020 Population by State (in millions)



Change in State Population: 2010 to 2020



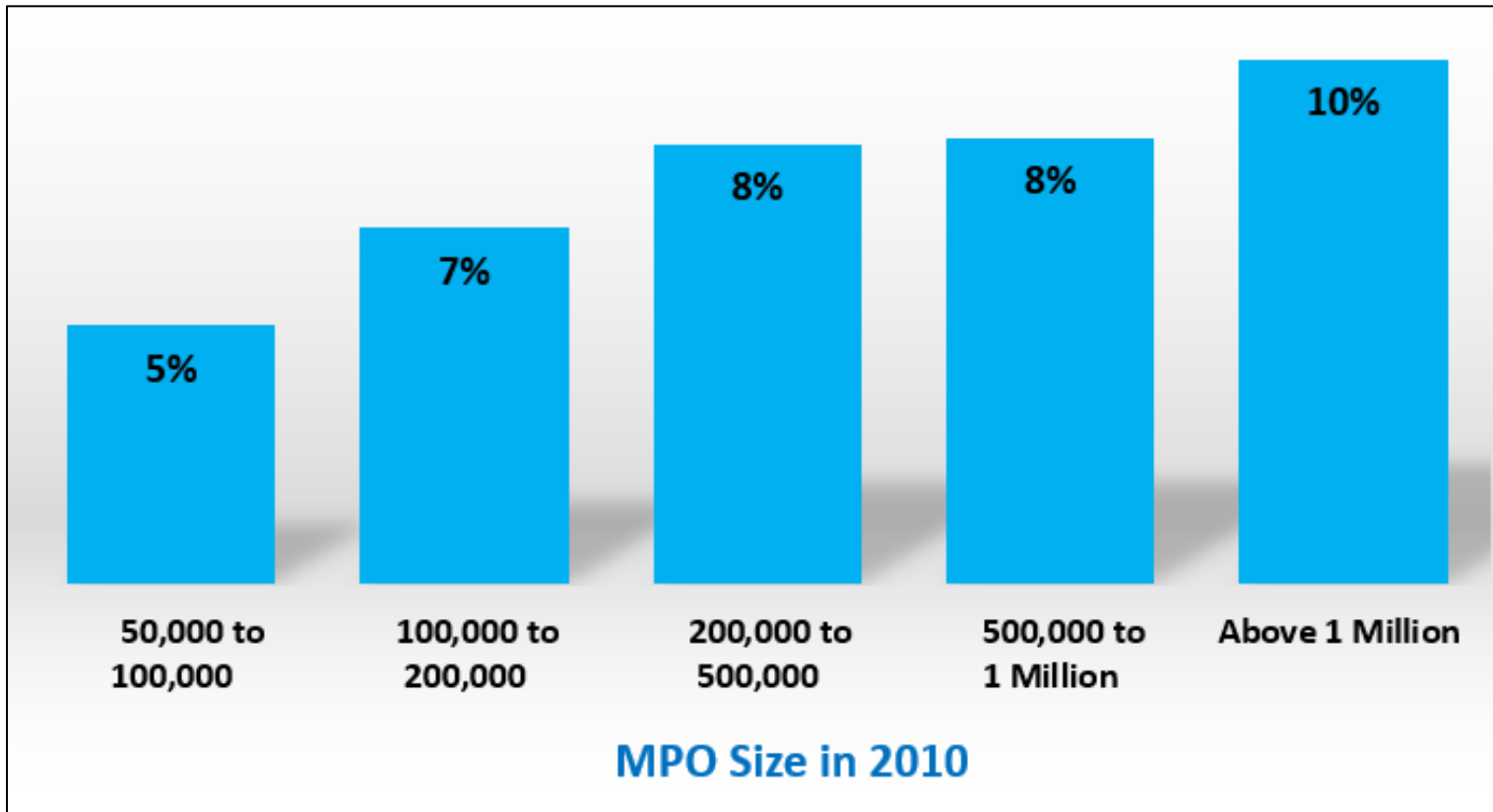
% Change in County Population: 2010 to 2020



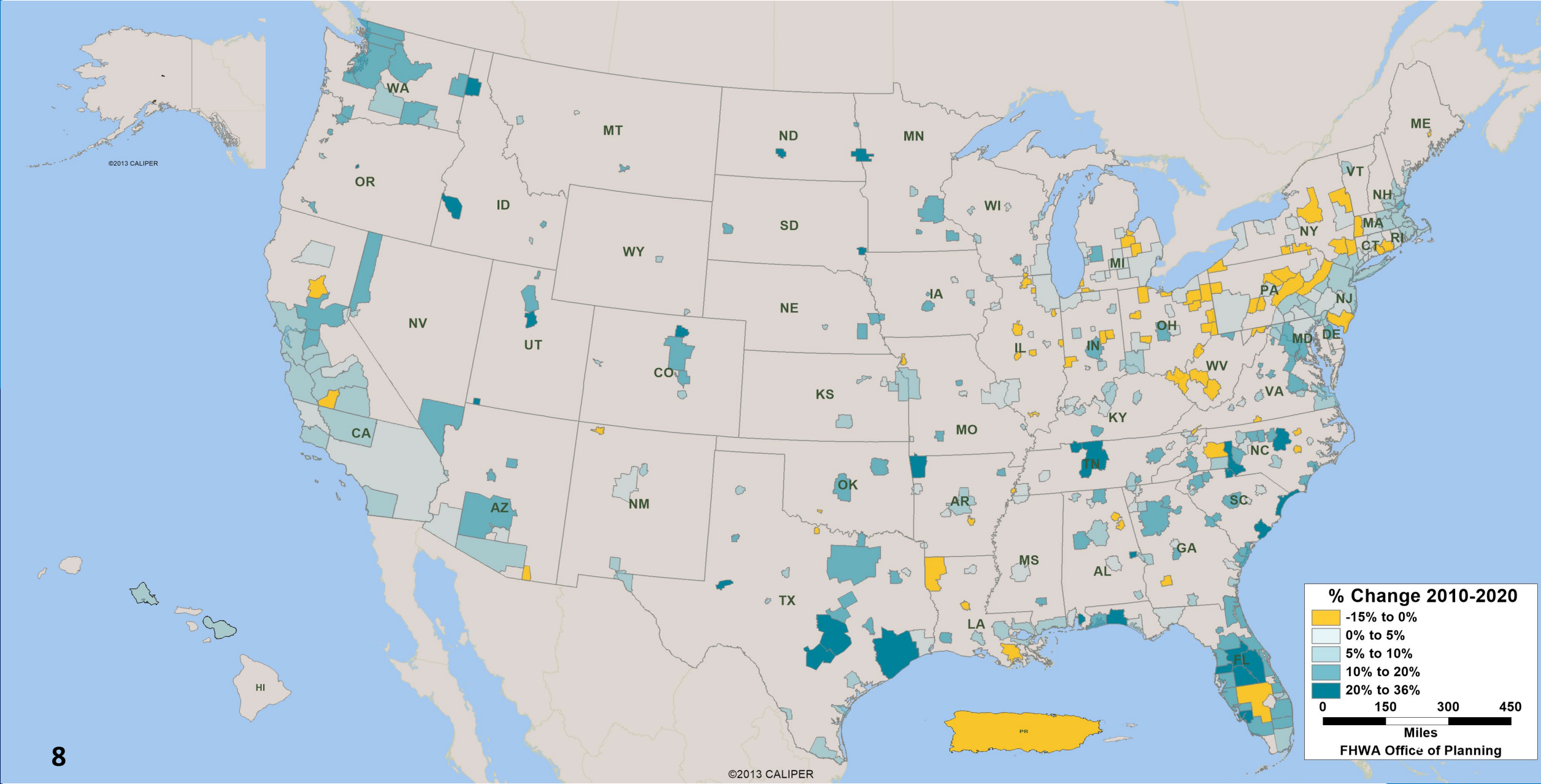
% of Population Change by MPO Size: 2010 to 2020

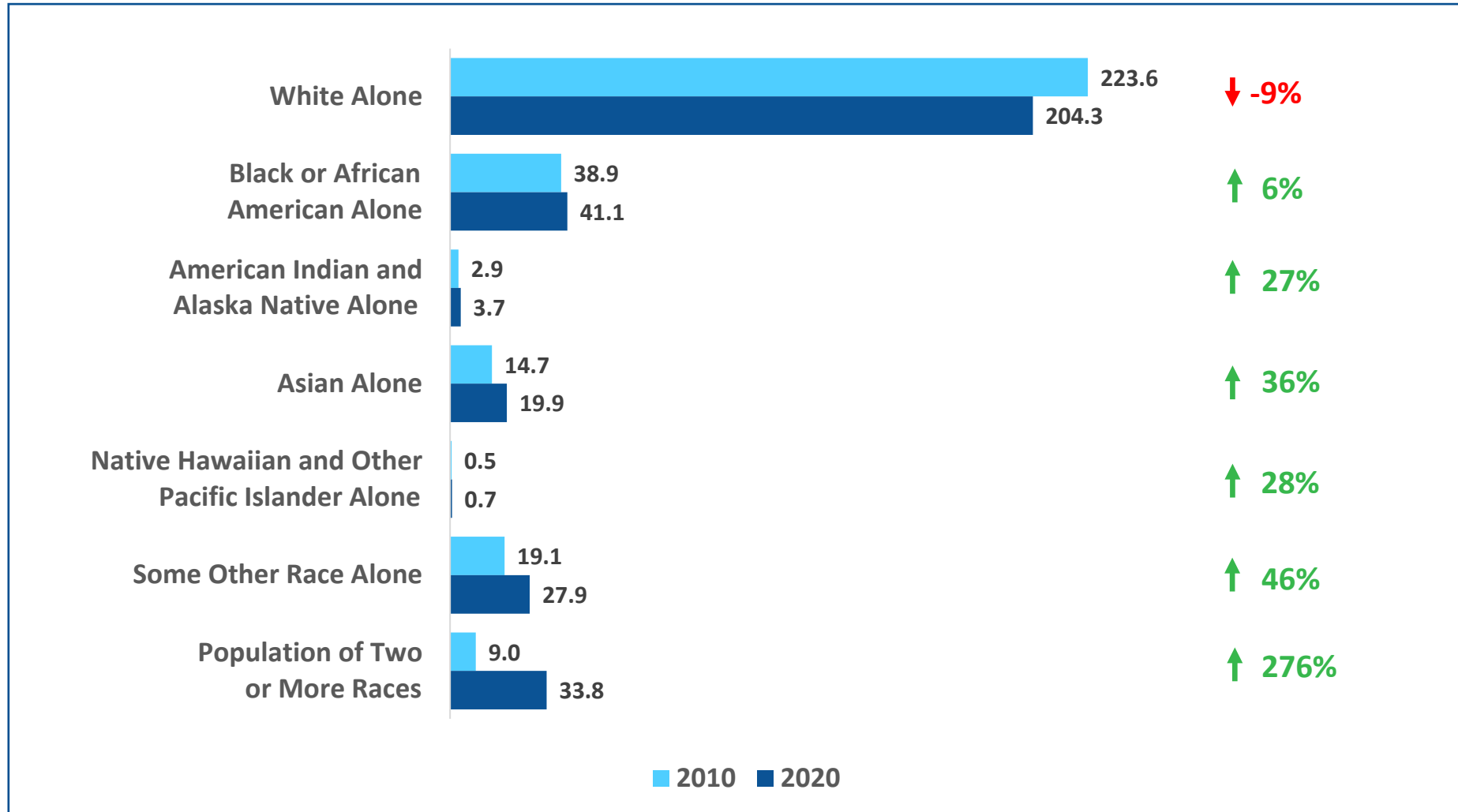
% Change in MPO Population: 2010 to 2020



Population Change by Race: 2010 to 2020 (In millions)



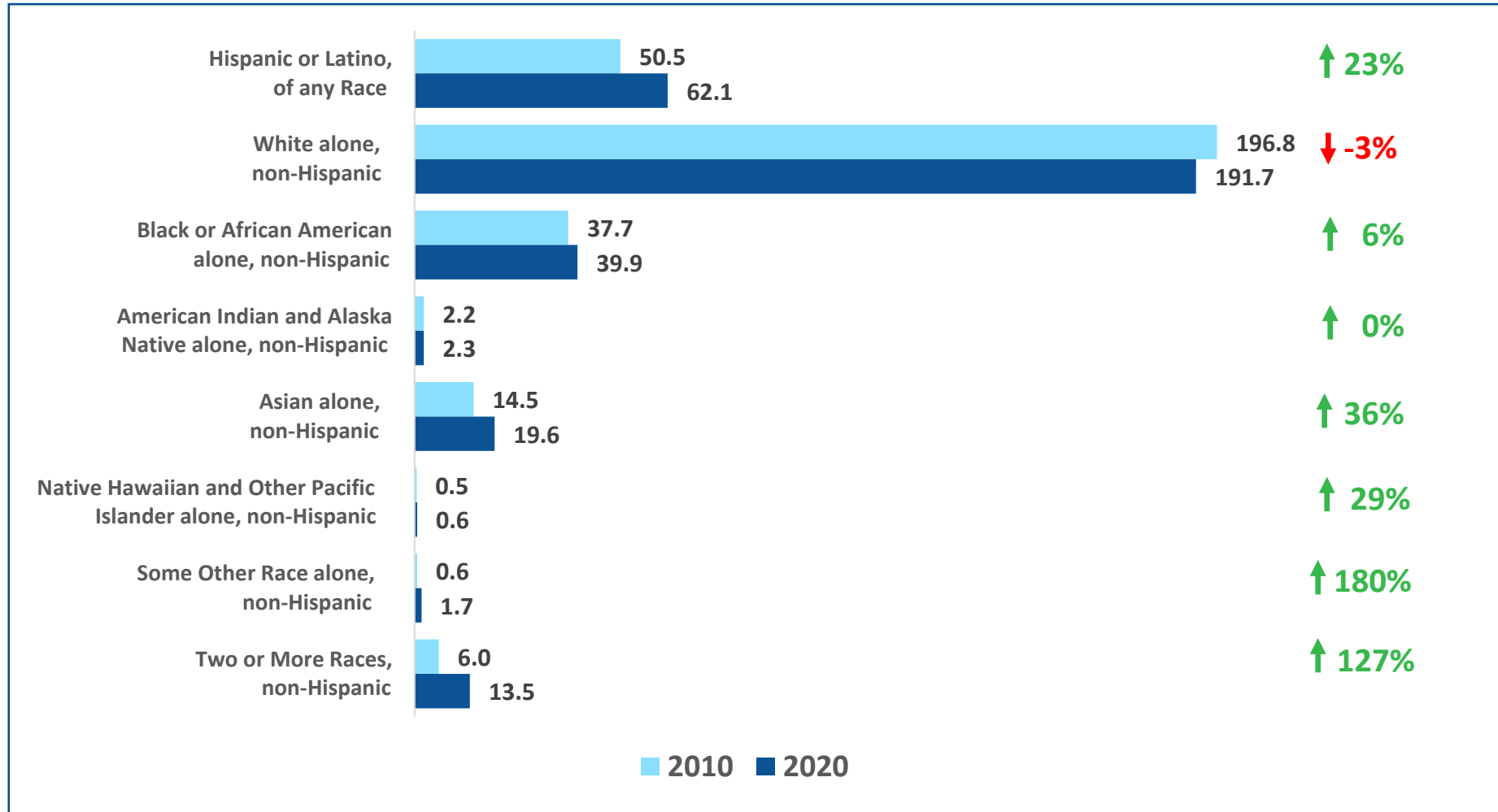

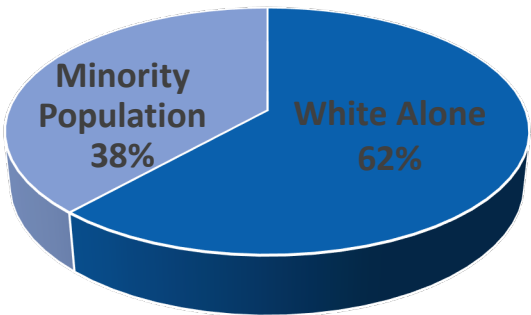
Minority Population

Minority populations are those who are not White Alone or non-Hispanic White Alone

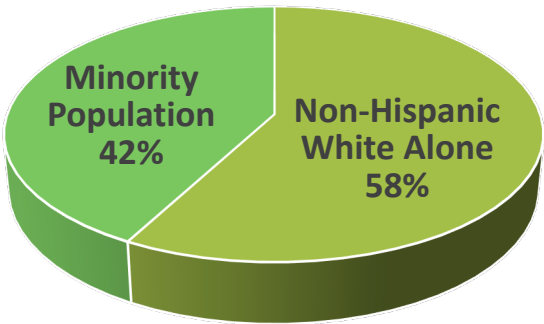

% of Minority Population in 2020

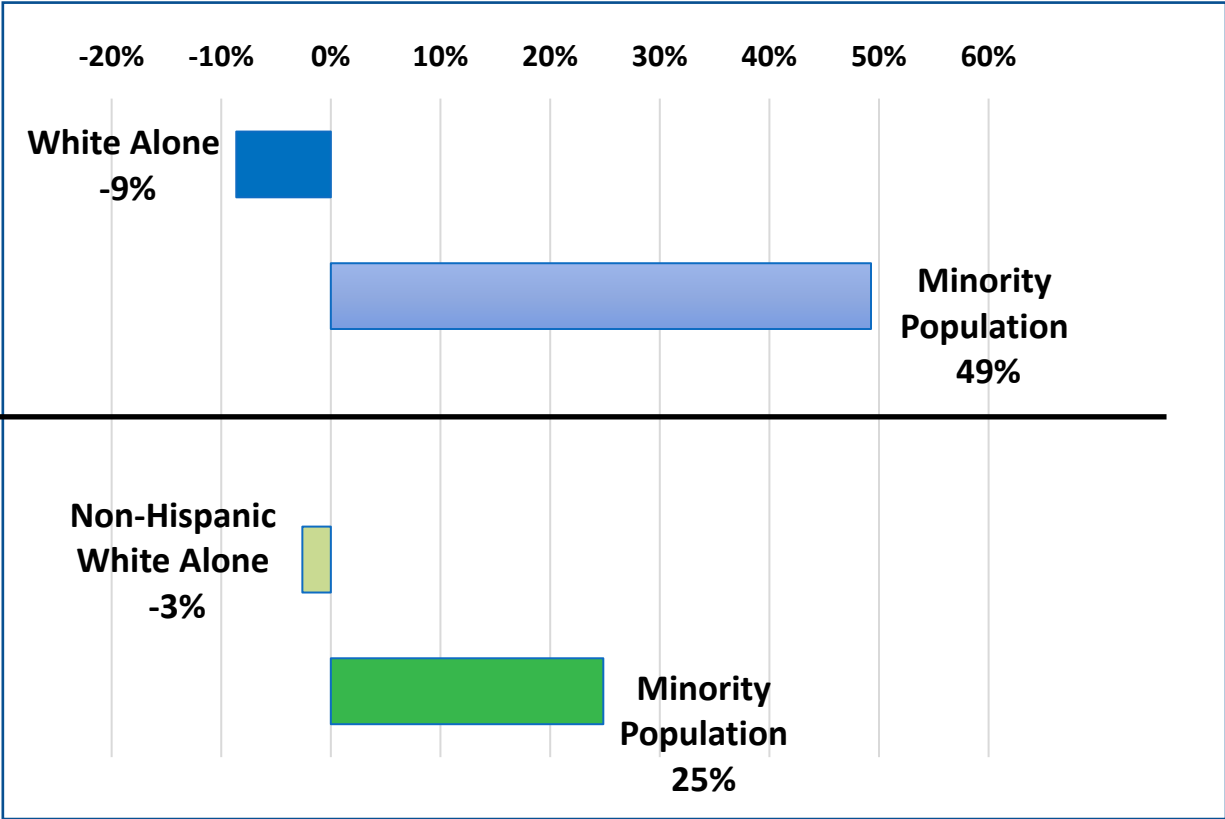

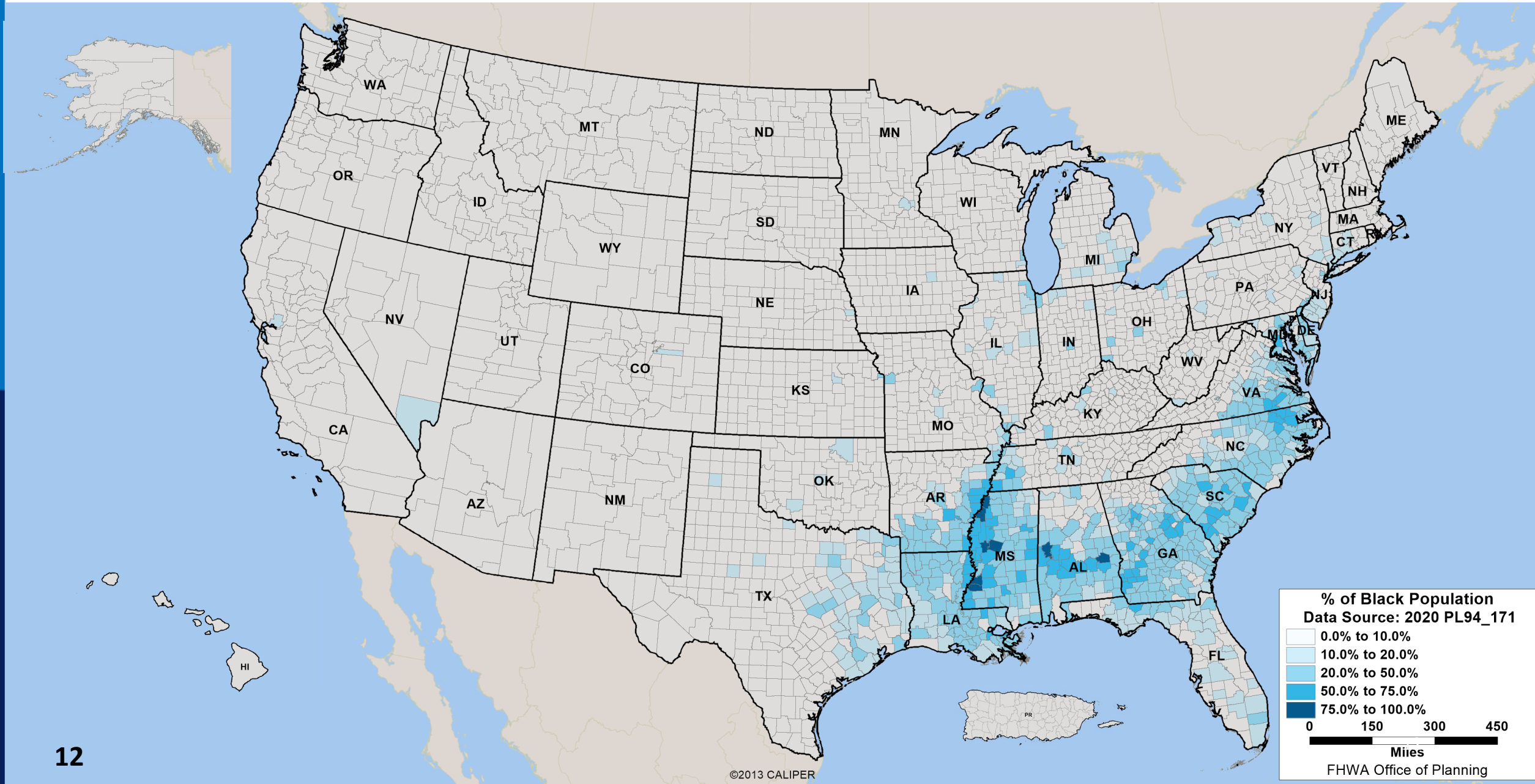

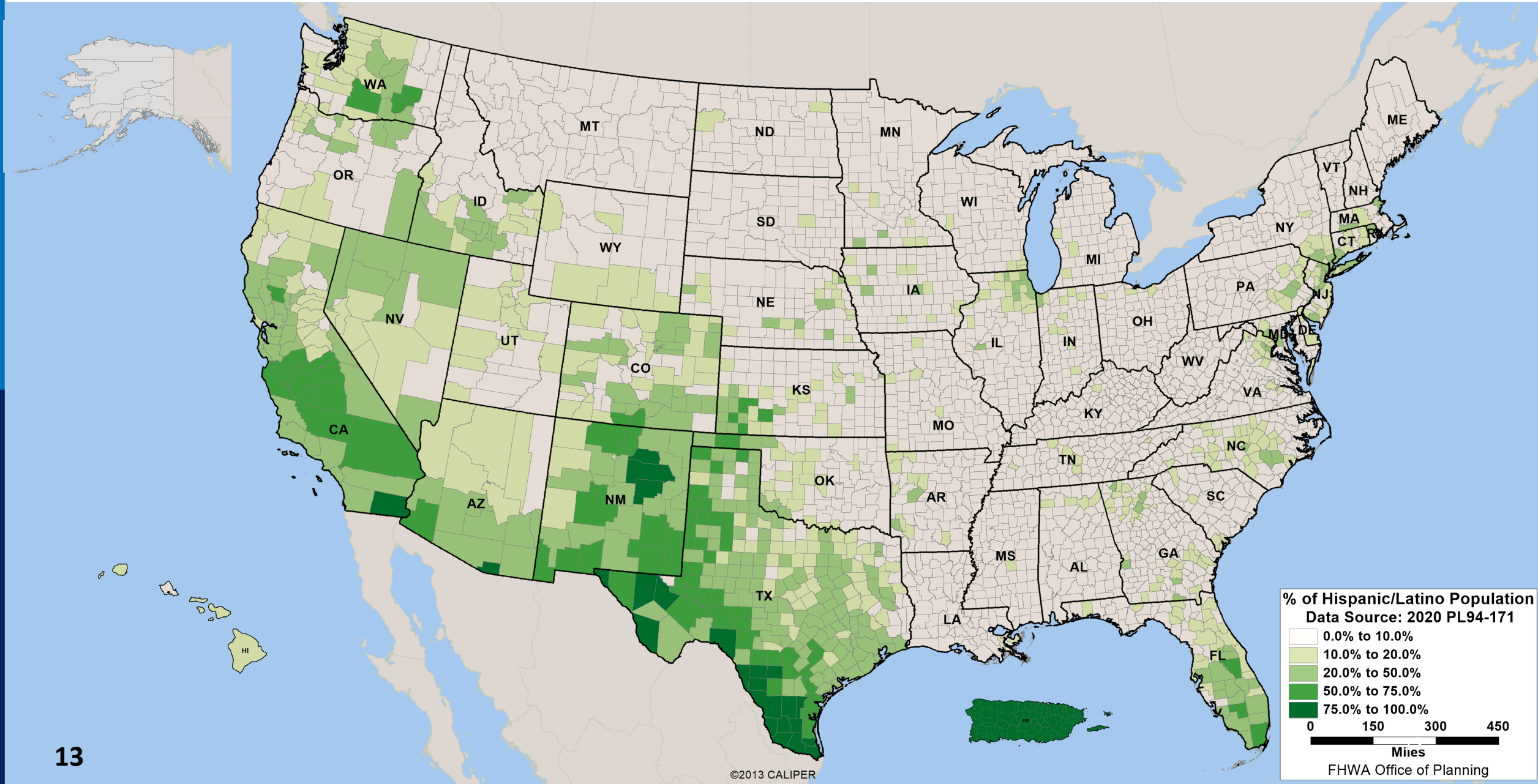
% of Change in Minority Population from 2010 to 2020



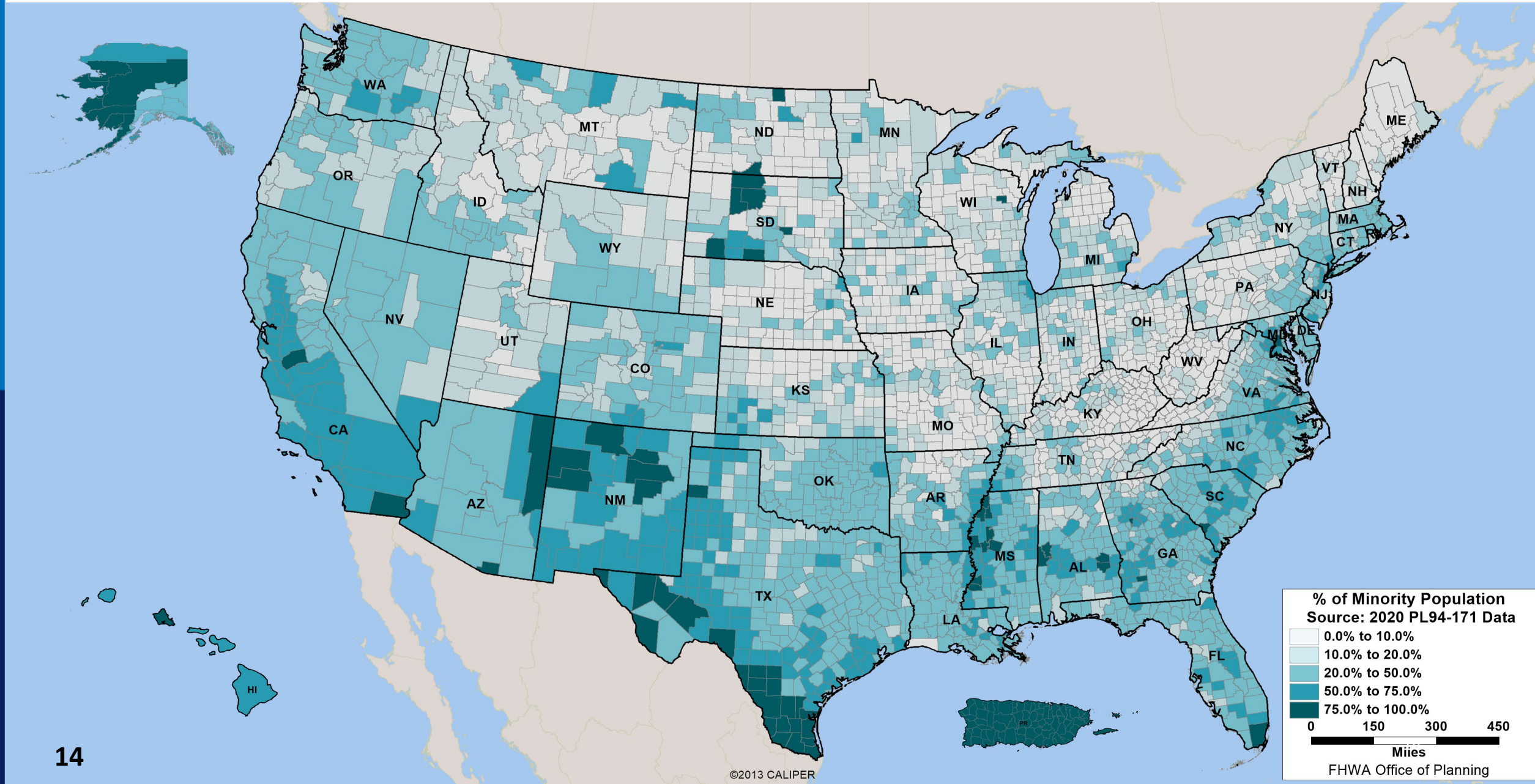
Percent of Black Population in 2020 (Black alone, not Hispanic)

→ NOTE: Please answer BOTH Question 6 about Hispanic origin and Question 7 about race. For this census, Hispanic origins are not races.

6. Is this person of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin?

- ☐ No, not of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin
- ☐ Yes, Mexican, Mexican Am., Chicano
- ☐ Yes, Puerto Rican
- ☐ Yes, Cuban
- ☐ Yes, another Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin – *Print, for example, Salvadoran, Dominican, Colombian, Guatemalan, Spaniard, Ecuadorian, etc.*

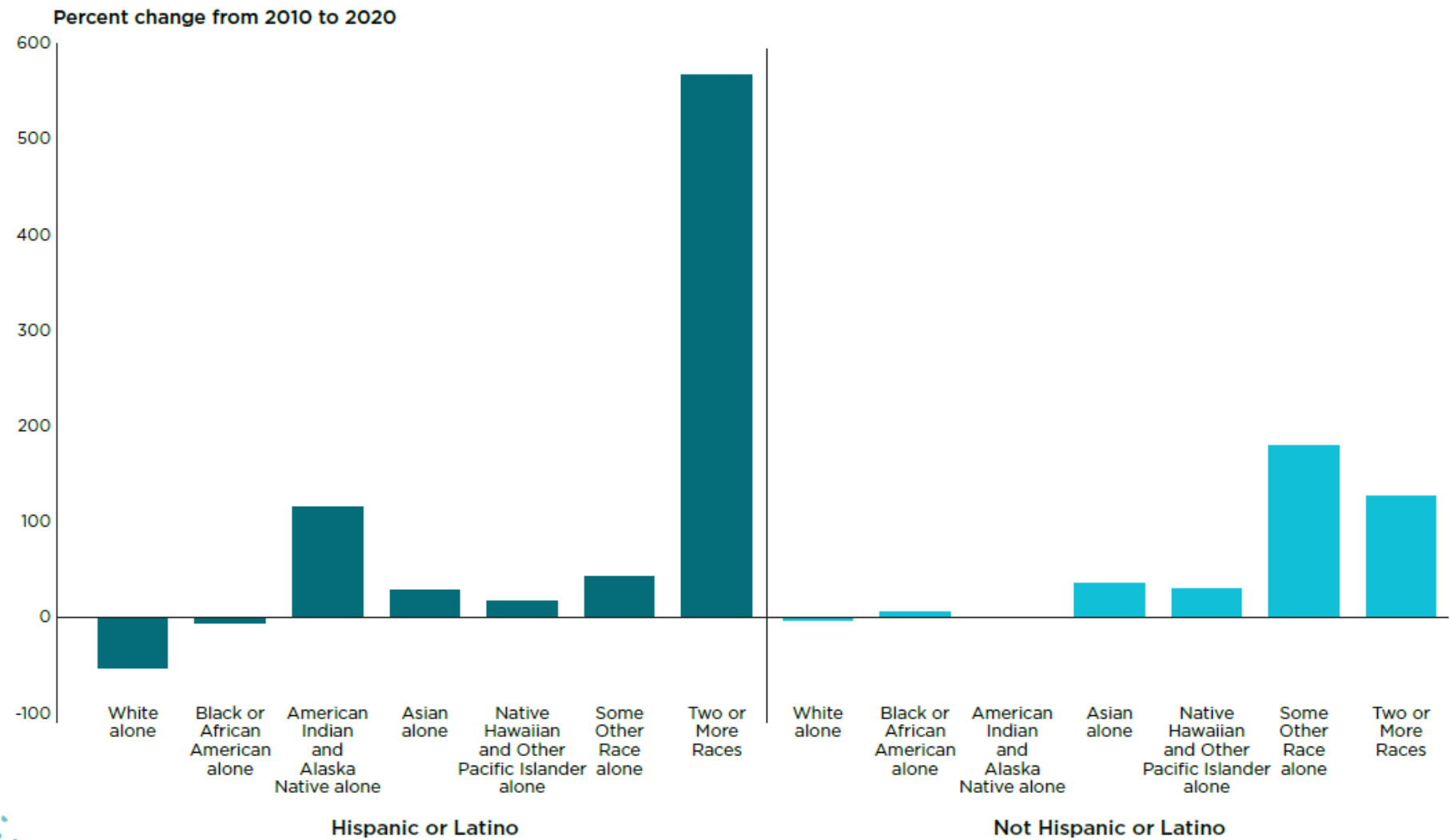

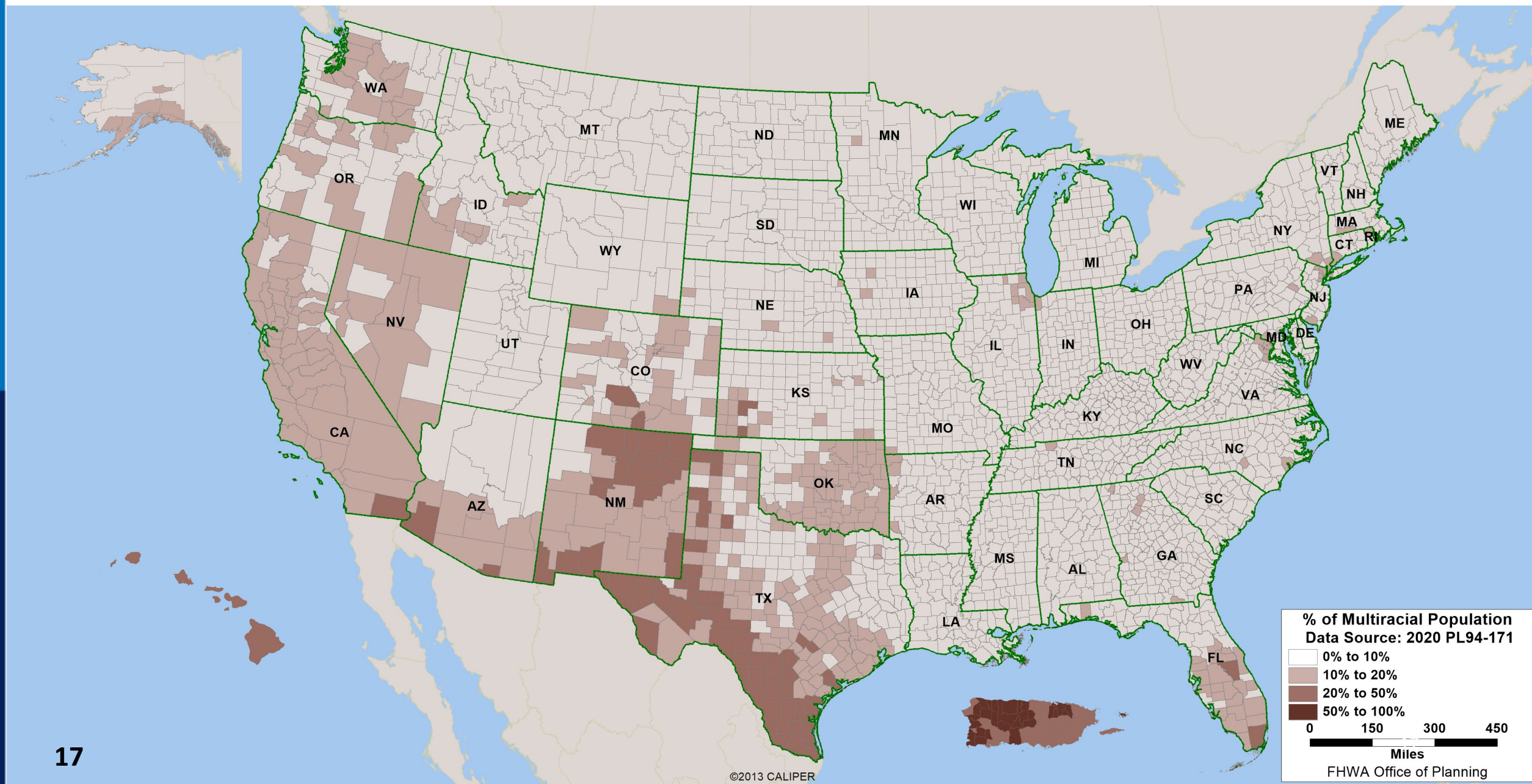

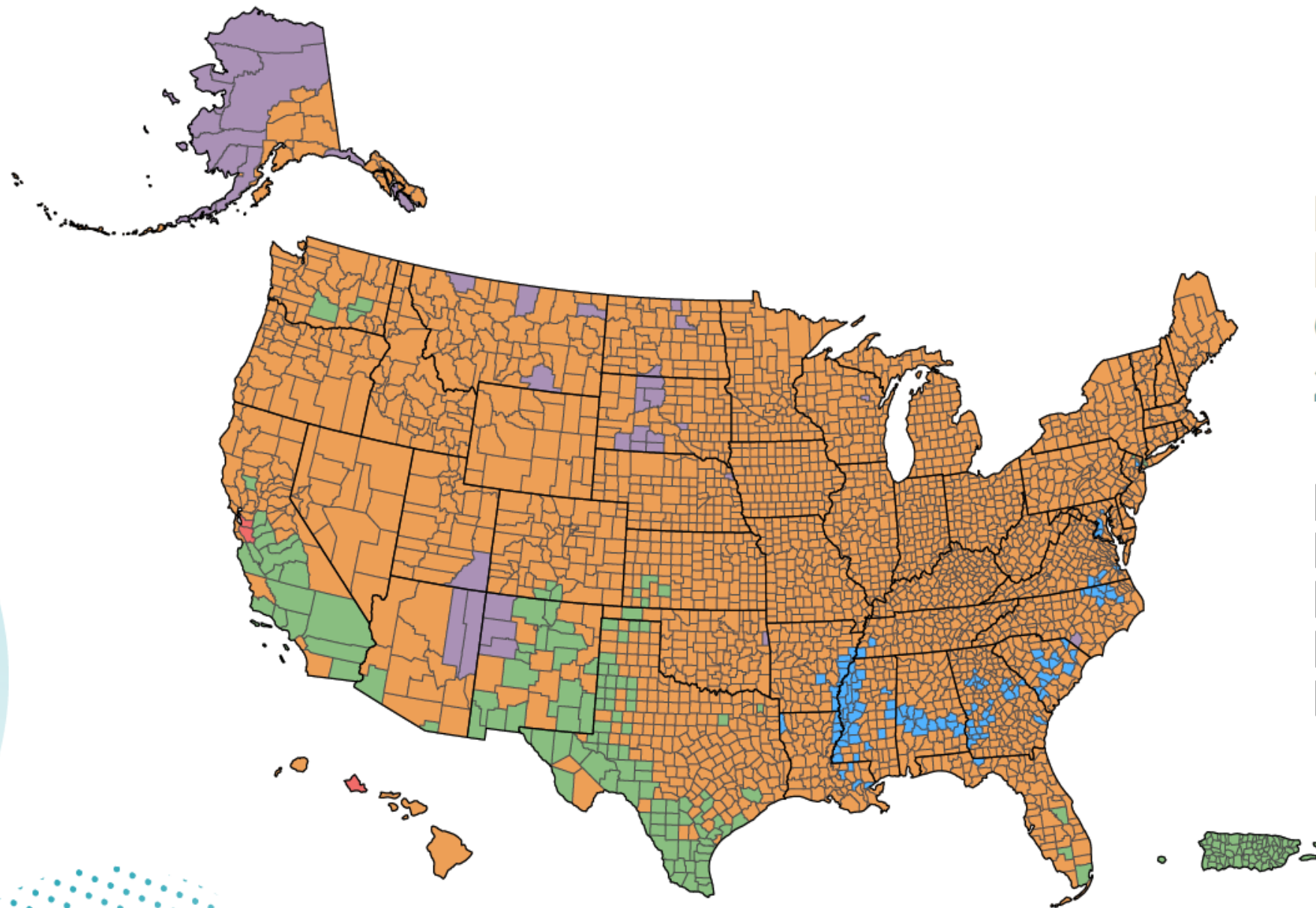

Most Prevalent Race or Ethnicity Group by County: 2020

Race or ethnicity group

- White alone, non-Hispanic
- Black or African American alone, non-Hispanic
- American Indian and Alaska Native alone, non-Hispanic
- Asian alone, non-Hispanic
- Hispanic or Latino, of any race

Note: Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander alone, non-Hispanic, Some Other Race alone, non-Hispanic, and Two or More Races, non-Hispanic were not the most prevalent group in any county.



Summary (Excluding Puerto Rico)

- Growth - US population has grown by 7.4%, adding over 22.7 million.
 - Urbanization – population growth is almost entirely concentrated in urban areas, particularly in large counties or metro regions.
 - Diversity - Population has become more diverse
 - Hispanic and Latino population has the highest number increase, accounting for over 50% of the US population increase
 - Multiracial population has the largest percentage increase
- Cautions in comparing race and ethnicity information between 2010 and 2020 census due to changes in the 2020 questionnaire design, data processing and coding
- MPO population accounts for over 82% of the US population.
 - Nearly 70% of US population increase occurred in the 50 largest MPOs
