PURPOSE AND NEED	Increase capacity and safety by adding additional lane(s). This section of US 62 has been evaluated in the past for HES projects. There is a significant number of crashes, most of which are rear end collisions. It has been difficult to choose a section because of the funding limitation on HES projects. One needed reach would extend into another location that also had a significant crash history. By a recent Official Order, this section of US 62 has been re-designated a part of US 431 because of the low railroad bridge on old US 431 in Central City.

METHOD OF DESIGN	The Selected Consultant shall develop highway plans utilizing the most recent CADD Standards for Highway Plans policy.		
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SCOPE OF WORK

The Selected Consultant will be required to provide Phase I Preliminary Engineering; including the preparation of engineering studies, identification of appropriate typical sections, identifying any utility impacts, performing drainage design, developing dependable cost estimates, conducting and preparing documents for public meetings, and preparation for approval of the appropriate Environmental Document. The Department does not have the manuscript for the project so the Selected Consultant will be expected to use conventional surveying on the project.

The Selected Consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Phase II Roadway Design; including the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans, and cost estimates as necessary to provide

 (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
