PURPOSE AND NEED	0.3 miles The primary purpose of this bridge replacement project is to replace the bridge and approaches on KY 36 over Locust Creek approximately 3.2 miles West of the junction with US 42 in order to provide a safe, reliable roadway for those wanting to access US 42 or KY 227 in Carrollton, KY. This project is needed because the structure has been classified as Functionally Obsolete. The structure is 20 feet wide curb-to-curb while the adjacent roadway is 22 feet. The concrete deck has transverse and diagonal cracking throughout with large areas of delamination and the curb shows moderate to heavy deterioration with exposed reinforcing steel that is allowing rail anchors to dislodge. Fifty percent (50%) of girder ends and diaphragms show moderate to heavy concrete deterioration from joint leakage with random spalling and exposed, rusting resteel. Interior beams throughout spans have moderate to heavy map cracking throughout fascia concrete with areas of dark staining, efflorescence and spalling.
