METHOD OF DESIGN	The Selected Consultant shall utilize the CADD Standards for Highway Plans (version 2.04) policy in the development of the Highway Plans.		
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SCOPE OF WORK

The Selected Consultant will be expected to provide the geotechnical exploration for two (2) bores and for the connector between the bores under US 42 and Drumanard Estate utilizing directional coring and conventional vertical drilling techniques. Each of the main bores will be approximately one-half mile in length. The Consultant will use televiewer recorders and borehole survey technology to evaluate areas for geotechnical testing of the cores and possibly in-situ testing. Upon completion of the investigation, core samples are to be transported to the KYTC Geotechnical Branch Facility in Frankfort. The Consultant will be expected to coordinate with staff from the Louisville Southern Indiana Ohio River Bridges Project and the section design team; including the firm currently providing the design of the tunnel to assure adequate information for that design is provided. Identify any subconsultants expected to be used in the response to this bulletin. Generally, all sub-consultants must be pregualified in the applicable categories. However, pregualification may not be required for some sub-consultants performing highly specialized services. The use of any and all sub-consultants is subject to the approval of the Department and the prime geotechnical consultant will be responsible for their sub-consultants' work.
