| PURPOSE AND NEED | As part of our mission, the Division of Environmental Analysis has a responsibility to complete UST/ HAZMAT Site Assessment Studies and prepare and implement corrective action/remediation measures for the development of Highway projects on a statewide basis. Additional staff and regulatory knowledge is needed periodically to accomplish these objectives to keep projects on time and within budget. The Consultant(s) will be asked to perform such studies and develop and implement the above-mentioned corrective action/remediation measures on an as-needed basis. |

SCOPE OF WORK

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

Environmental Studies required to investigate and remediate Underground Storage Tank and Hazardous Material sites on highway right-of-way prior to highway construction.

DOCUMENT PREPARATION

Technical reports necessary to adequately address specific areas of impact in each of the aforementioned areas.

LABORATORY SERVICES

Laboratory instrumentation necessary to perform materials analysis according to EPA Standard Methods. All services should be performed in accordance with the KYTC/DEA Environmental Procedures Manual and ASTM Standards. Interested Consultants will not be required to comply with the requirement of utilizing a laboratory prequalified with the KTC for UST/HAZMAT Services. Criteria for identification of acceptable testing facilities will be discussed with the Selected Consultant(s), who will provide KYTC with a proposed list of laboratories for approval.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

Two (2) firms will be selected to provide these services. The contract period is each firm receiving a two (2) year contract. Contracts will have an upset limit of \$2,000,000.00. Once the upset limit is reached, or the two (2) year term has expired, services will be re-advertised and no additional work assignments will be made under the contract. Contracts will not be modified to increase upset limit or extended for time to assign new work. No Letters of Agreement shall exceed \$100,000.00.

The Selection Committee will randomly draw from the pool and list in consecutive order to determine the initial order for which a project will be offered. Projects will be offered to firms on a rotating basis. A firm will not be offered an additional project until the remaining firms on the list have been offered a project. If a firm declines to accept a project or does not respond to an invitation to perform services for a project within seven (7) days, documentation shall be placed in the project files and the next firm on the rotating list shall be offered the project.

3. Past record of performance on project of similar type and complexity. (10 points)
4. Project approach and proposed procedures to accomplish the services for the project. (10 points)
5. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed. (2 points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
