PROJECT DESCRIPTION	Construct a Connector Road between US 27 and I-75.

PURPOSE AND NEED	The purpose of this project is to improve Regional Access and East-West Connectivity. Major roadways in the study area (US27, I-75, KY 1980 and Man-O-War Blvd) currently have high traffic volumes and growth rates continue to increase. Truck percentages are also high on these routes. Because there is no direct route centrally located between US 27 and I-75 in this area, traffic feeds into these existing roadways, decreasing LOS and safety along the routes. The goals of this project include improved connectivity, vehicle safety, reduced traffic congestion, travel time reliability/ savings, improved access for truck traffic and addressing Homeland Security needs by providing an alternate route for I-75 traffic around the Clays Ferry Bridge.			
METHOD OF DESIGN	The Selected Consultant shall utilize the current CADD Standards for Highway Plans policy in the development of the Highway Plans.			
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DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the response to announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will be required to provide Phase I Roadway Design and Environmental Services, including the preparation of engineering studies, identification of appropriate typical sections, identifying any utility impacts, performing drainage design, developing dependable cost estimates, conducting and preparing documents for public meetings, and providing documents and/or plans to be used in obtaining an approved Environmental Document.

The selected consultant will be required to coordinate the project information with the currently on-going KY 627/I-75 Interchange Project in Madison County and the Proposed East Nicholasville Bypass Project in Jessamine County.

The selected Consultant will be responsible for assisting the KYTC in developing the Financial Plan for this project, including preparation of the necessary supporting data and exhibits."

The purpose of the design contract is to provide Phase I Plans and Environmental Services.
