# A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County – Grayson
Route – US 62
Item No. – 4-8502.00
Project Description – Widen portions of US-62 from Leitchfield to Clarkson (from MP 23.0 (KY 3155) to MP 25.5 (KY 224)

## II. PROJECT INFORMATION

Project Manager – John Moore
User Division – Highway Design
Approximate Fee – \$1,250,000 Phase I Preliminary Engineering and Phase II Final Roadway
Design (Lump Sum Fee)
Project Funding – Federal Funds (STP)
Project Length – Approximately 2.5 mile

#### III. PURPOSE AND NEED

US 62 serves a large number of vehicles traveling between Leitchfield and points east including Clarkson and the Western Kentucky Parkway.

The existing cross-section consists primarily of two ten-foot-wide travel lanes with narrow shoulders. Extensive development along the corridor has resulted in numerous closely-spaced access points. This causes delays for through traffic and creates a safety hazard in the built-up area of Clarkson. A sharp S-curve near the midpoint of the study corridor has also been identified as a high-crash location. Sidewalks exist only in a few isolated locations. In addition, paved parking areas adjacent to US 62 in Clarkson combined with generally flat terrain have created drainage problems in that area. Construction of KY 3155 around the east side of Leitchfield has led to increased truck traffic using US 62 to travel between the Western Kentucky Parkway and the industrial park on the north side of Leitchfield. This has created a need to better accommodate trucks, particularly at the KY 224 intersection.

The goals established for this project are to:

- Improve Safety;
- Address parking and drainage concerns in Clarkson;

- Improve pedestrian access; and
- Reduce delays for through traffic.

## IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the response to announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

#### V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected Consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Phase I and Phase II Design. Phase II includes roadway design, including the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right of way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans and cost estimates.

The selected Consultant will be required to provide structure design services which may be added to the contract agreement by contract modification.

## VI. <u>SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS</u>

The Department may retain any of the advertised services to be performed by in-house state forces.

The purpose of the design contract is to provide Phase I Preliminary Engineering and Phase II Final Roadway Design. The initial contract agreement will be for Phase I Preliminary Engineering only. Phase II Final Roadway Design may be added by contract modification. Phase II units may be negotiated at the end of Phase I after a preferred alignment has been selected. Structure Design services may be added to the contract agreement by contract modification.

#### VIII. METHOD OF DESIGN

The Selected Consultant shall utilize the current CADD Standards for Highway Plans (version 3) policy in the development of the highway plans.

## IX. PHOTOGRAMMETRIC SERVICES

Photogrammetry is not required.

#### X. ENVIRONMENTAL

The KYTC will provide environmental for this project. The Consultant will be responsible for providing any necessary exhibits or plans needed by the department for the assessment.

#### XI. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The Department will provide all Geotechnical Services required for the project.

#### XII. STRUCTURE DESIGN

The selected consultant shall do the necessary Engineering Services to submit to the KYTC Advanced Situation Folders for the applicable structures. The Structure Design will be performed by the Consultant. Structure Design Services may be added to the contract by contract modification. Prequalification in the area of structure design is required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement.

#### XIII. TRAFFIC

Traffic projections and related information will be provided by the Department.

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
