A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

Department of Highways Professional Services Procurement Bulletin 2011-09 Henderson, Daviess, Ohio, Butler & Warren Counties

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County - Henderson, Daviess, Ohio, Butler & Warren

Route – I-69 Spur (Audubon Parkway), I-66/I-65 Spur (Natcher Parkway), and the connection (US 60) between the Audubon and Natcher Parkways.

Item No. - 2-85.00

Project Description – Strategic Corridor Planning Study to evaluate the Audubon Parkway from the Pennyrille Parkway (Future I-69) in Henderson to Owensboro and the William H. Natcher Parkway from Owensboro to I-65 in Bowling Green (Future I-66) to determine the improvements needed to bring the corridor up to current interstate standards to become spurs to the I-66 and I-69 high priority corridors and I-65, as well as evaluating US 60 (formerly the Bypass) as a connection between these two corridors.

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The 1991 Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act (ISTEA) identified Corridor 3 (I-66) and Corridor 18 (I-69) as high priority corridors on the National Highway System. A national study was completed in 1994 which concluded that construction of I-66 from the west to east coast of the United States was not feasible, but that individual segments of the corridor could be desirable from a state or regional perspective. A 1997 state study concluded that I-66 across Kentucky was feasible. A national study was completed in 1995 which concluded that construction of I-69 from Canada to Mexico was feasible. This project would provide an interstate spur from Owensboro to each of the high priority corridors, improve traffic flow between Owensboro, Henderson, Madisonville and Bowling Green, and enhance economic development in this portion of Western Kentucky.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected Consultant will provide engineering services for the completion of a strategic corridor planning study to identify and evaluate potential improvement options to bring the Audubon Parkway and Natcher Parkway up to interstate standards for inclusion as spurs to the I-69 and I-66/I-65 routes, respectively. In addition the study will evaluate US 60, the connection between the I-69 and I-66/I-65 Spurs. Activities include but may not be limited to an inventory of existing conditions and problem definitions, establishing project purpose and goals, proposing and analyzing alternate improvement options, developing practical solutions and cost estimates, developing a master plan for prioritizing improvements, conducting public involvement activities throughout the study process, making recommended solutions, and writing a technical report(s) to document the study process and results.
