This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County – Bullitt Route – KY 245 Item No – 5-8509.00

Project Description – Widen KY 245 from I-65 (MP 6.4) eastward 1.9 miles to Bernheim Forest & entrance to Jim Beam Distilleries (MP 4.5) in Bullitt County

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

Project Manager – Patrick Matheny, P.E. User Division - Highway Design Approximate Fee – \$500,000 (Lump Sum Fee) Final Roadway Design Project Funding – Federal Funds (STP) Project Length – 1.9 miles

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The purpose of this project is to provide an improved transportation facility to meet the additional traffic demand forecasted to occur and accommodate any existing or future development, and/or tourist destinations along the corridor. KY 245 leading southward from its interchange with I-65 is the major link between I-65 and the City of Bardstown, and the western entrance to the Kentucky Bourbon Trail.

IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the Response to Announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will be responsible for Final Roadway Design, including drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, Traffic Management Plans (TMP), Signing and Striping plans, and cost estimates.

VIII. METHOD OF DESIGN

The selected consultant shall utilize the most recent CADD Standards for Highway Plans Policy in the development of the highway plans.

IX. ENVIRONMENTAL

Categorical Exclusion (CE) Level I was completed as part of Preliminary Engineering on May 11, 2012. The document can be found in the above list of available studies. The Department will provide any necessary additional Environmental Services.

X. PHOTOGRAMMETRIC SERVICES

The Consultant will be required to field survey any additional required portions of the project.

XI. STRUCTURE DESIGN

The selected consultant shall do the necessary engineering service to submit an Advanced Situation Folder(s) to the KYTC for the appropriate applicable structure(s). The structure design will be performed by the selected Consultant. Prequalification in the area of structure design is required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement.

XII. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The Department will provide all Geotechnical Services required for this project.

XIII. TRAFFIC

Existing hourly traffic counts, traffic projections, Intersection turning movements, and related information will be provided by the Department. Refer to the Forecast dated December, 2010 from KYTC.

XIV. <u>UTILITY DESIGN</u>

The Department will be responsible for estimating Utility costs based on plans provided by the consultant. The Department will send project location maps to all potential Bullitt County utility contacts to determine whether they may have existing utilities within these project limits. The Department will develop the utility contact list. Facility atlas maps received for this project will be provided to the selected consultant. All utilities including aerial carriers shall be field-verified by the consultant. Sized and types of underground and aerial utilities shall be identified on the roadway plans. Plans shall be provided by the consultant in both .pdf and .dgn format. These will be distributed by the Department to utility representatives for review and comment.

The Department will authorize Subsurface Utility Engineering (SUE) work to field-locate utilities as needed. Horizontal and vertical location of existing utilities shown on Fianl Roadway Design plans shall be adjusted by the consultant as necessary to reflect actual SUE results.

XV. RIGHT-OF-WAY

The Department will be responsible for estimating Right-of-Way costs based on plans provided by the consultant. The selected consultant shall identify property owners and perform deed research within the project limits. Property owner information shall be shown on the plans along with existing Right-of-Way and property lines. Right-of-Way plans shall be developed for each alignment alternative with Summary Sheets and Strip Maps showing all areas of taking for the Right-of-Way and Drainage Inspection. Final Right-of-Way plans shall be furnished according to the Project Schedule.

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
