# A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County – Hopkins, Webster, Henderson
Route – Edward T. Breathitt (Pennyrile) Parkway – EB 9004
Item No – 2-232.00 & 2-235.00
Project Description – Reconstruct elements of existing Edward T. Breathitt Parkway (Pennyrile Parkway) between MP 37.0 and MP 73.4 to upgrade geometrics to Interstate standards. (I-69 Corridor Improvement)

## **II. PROJECT INFORMATION**

Project Manager – Kevin McClearn, PE User Division – Highway Design Approximate Fee – \$1,200.000.00 (Lump Sum) Project Funding –NH Project Length – 37 Miles approximately

## III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The purpose of this project is to make the necessary improvements to Edward T. Breathitt (Pennyrile) Parkway to be Interstate compliant. The project is necessary to upgrade current geometric elements to Interstate standards as explained in the I-69 SIU 5 Planning Study titled "I-69 Corridor Master Plan, Eddyville to Henderson, Final Report May 2008" and incorporating guidelines established by a FHWA agreement.

## IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the Response to Announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

## V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will be required to provide Preliminary Engineering services and Final Design for roadway and structure design for the reconstruction of various geometric elements along the Edward T. Breathitt (Pennyrile) Parkway using the recommendations of the I-69 Corridor Master Plan Study and the FHWA/KYTC agreement to be established. The selected consultant will prepare an IMR for all interchange modifications within the project corridor. The project study limits are from MP 37.0 to MP 73.4 approximately on Edward T. Breathitt (Pennyrile) Parkway.

This project may be advanced to Final Roadway Design, with a Contract Modification. The selected consultant will then be required to provide engineering services to perform Final Roadway Design.

The selected consultant shall do the necessary engineering service to submit an Advanced Situation Folder(s) to the KYTC for the appropriate applicable structure(s). The structure design will be performed by the Selected Consultant. Structure Design Services will be negotiated and included in the original contract agreement. Prequalification in the area of structure design is required to be identified in the consultant's Response to Announcement.

The Department will supply all necessary Geotechnical Services required for the project.

The Department will provide all necessary existing traffic counts for this project. The Department will provide the necessary traffic projections and related forecast information required to complete the IMR(s) portion of this project.

## XVII. EVALUATION FACTORS

- 3. Past record of performance on projects similar in type and complexity. (15 Points)
- 4. Project approach and proposed procedures to accomplish the services for the project. (15 Points)
- 5. DBE Participation Plan (4 points)
- 6. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed. (2 Points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
