I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Counties – Jefferson, Oldham, Henry, Trimble, Carroll, Gallatin, Boone Route – I-71 Item No – 99-394.00

Project Description – The scoping study will evaluate the I-71 corridor from I-65 in Jefferson County to I-75 in Boone County. The study will determine needed improvements and relative priorities for safety and congestion.

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

Interstate 71 is an Interstate Highway that begins at I-65 in Jefferson County and extends north and ends at I-90 in Cleveland, Ohio. The portion of I-71 in the study area, approximately 78 miles between I-65 in Jefferson County and I-75 in Boone County, carries between 27,000 and 80,000 vehicles per day, a large percentage of which are trucks. The majority of the study corridor is currently 4 lanes (2 lanes in each direction). The purpose of this study is to evaluate the safety and capacity of the corridor and to determine needed improvements and priorities.

IV. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will provide engineering services for the completion of a strategic corridor planning study to identify and evaluate improvements to the I-71 corridor between I-65 in Jefferson County and I-75 in Boone County. Activities include but may not be limited to an inventory of existing conditions, establishing project purpose and goals, proposing and analyzing alternate improvement options, developing practical solutions and cost estimates, conducting public involvement activities throughout the study process, prioritizing improvements, and writing a technical report(s) to document the study process and results.
