- A. 10-126.40 Widen the Mountain Parkway to 4 lanes from 0.3 miles West of the Cutino-Hager Road O-Pass to 0.7 miles west of the Gifford Rd Overpass
- B. 10-126.12 Widen the Mountain Parkway to 4 lanes from 0.5 miles east of the Gifford Road Overpass to 1.0 miles west of the KY 9009/KY 7 Interchange.

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The Mountain Parkway corridor is a vital arterial route into the Appalachian region of Kentucky. The Parkway Corridor has several roadway and bridge deficiencies. Eastern Kentucky has a lack of sufficient transportation infrastructure and system linkage. The purpose of these projects are to provide a safer and more efficient Corridor, and to contribute to the transportation infrastructure improvements needed to support and enhance economic vitality in Eastern Kentucky.

IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the response to announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Final Roadway Design. Final Roadway Design will include the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans and cost estimates.

VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The proposals shall contain a Project Approach for each of the above Projects (A, B and C). Page 7, Project Approach, of the Consultant Response to Announcement may be expanded to a total of 8 pages, including DBE Participation Plan, to accommodate project approaches for all 3 sections.

Three (3) consultants will be selected with each receiving a contract. Project A will be selected first, then Project B second and Project C will be selected third. A consultant may be selected for more than one project, or all 3 projects.

The Department may retain any of the advertised services to be performed by in-house state forces.

KYTC will provide Photogrammetry. The selected consultant will be required to collect additional information by conventional survey methods.

The selected consultant shall provide the necessary engineering services to submit an Advanced Situation Folder(s) to the KYTC for the appropriate applicable structure(s). The structure design will be performed by the selected consultant. Structure Design services may be added to the contract agreement by contract modification. Prequalification in the area of structure design is required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to announcement.

XII. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The selected consultants will provide all Geotechnical Services for their projects. Prequalification in the area of geotechnical services is required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to announcement.

XVII. EVALUATION FACTORS


Consultants will be evaluated by the selection committee based on the following, weighted factors:

- Relative experience of Consultant personnel assigned to project team with highway projects for KYTC and/or for federal, local or other state governmental agencies. (15 points)
- 2. Capacity to comply with project schedule. (15 points)
- Past record of performance on project of similar type and complexity. (15 points)
- 4. Project approach and proposed procedures to accomplish the services for the project. (15 points)
- 5. DBE Participation Plan. (4 points)
- 5. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed. (2 points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one(1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
