A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County – Warren Route – KY 185 Item No. 3-110.00

Project Description – Reconstruct KY 185 from north of junction with KY 263 near Richardsville (M.P. 6.29) to the Butler County line (M.P. 11.913)

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

Project Manager – Jim Hudson, P.E.
User Division – Highway Design
Approximate Fee – \$1,300,000 Final Design (Lump Sum Fee)
Project Funding – Federal Funds (STP)
Project Length – 7.6 miles (5.7 miles mainline plus 1.9 miles approximate approach roads)

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The existing roadway is classified as a Rural Collector and consists of narrow travel lanes and grass shoulders. There are numerous horizontal and vertical deficiencies throughout this section of roadway, especially north of Mt. Pleasant Church of Christ. The roadway between Bowling Green and the southern project terminus was reconstructed in the 1970s.

The primary goals of this project are to improve traffic service and travel safety by providing modern roadway geometry with wider travel lanes and shoulders between project termini and providing a reconstructed route for the most congested segment in the community of Anna. The proposed project would simultaneously serve to enhance highway accessibility and system connections for local communities and for Butler County to the north, particularly to I65 and the Western Kentucky Parkway. The reconstruction and widening of lanes in each direction will help relieve congestion and improve the reliability, speed, and travel expectations throughout the roadway segment. A safer, more efficient roadway network to accommodate the truck-auto mix projected for this growth area would also be anticipated to result from the reconstruction.

The purpose for this project is to provide the traveling public a safe facility which meets current design standards in the following ways:

• To increase safety and reduce accidents

- To improve capacity and the level of service of the roadway
- To accommodate the forecasted increase in automotive and commercial truck traffic on KY 185
- To facilitate the movement of goods and services reinforcing economic development efforts in Warren and Butler Counties, while minimizing adverse economic, environmental and community impacts in a most cost-effective manner
- To provide a roadway facility that meets current design standards

IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the project approach in the Response to Announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Final Roadway Design. Final Roadway Design includes, at a minimum, preparation of drainage design, construction plans including storm water construction and post construction Best Management Practices (BMP), signing and pavement marking plans, traffic control plans, final cost estimates, and an anticipated construction schedule.

The initial contract will cover up through Right of Way Plan Inspection and submittal of Right of Way Plans. Completion of Joint Inspection Plans and final construction plans may be advanced with a Contract Modification.

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
