A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

County – Hardin Route – KY 1357 (St. John's Road) Item No. – 4-8801.00

Project Description – Address safety, geometric deficiencies and maintenance issues along KY 1357 (St. John Road) from the US 31W Bypass (US 31WB, Mile Point 16.329) to KY 3005 (Ring Road) (Mile Point 14.614) in Elizabethtown

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

KY 1357 has widely been used as a cut through route from KY 3005 (Ring Road) to US 31WB. The roadway has a considerable number of houses and subdivision streets that are along this corridor. A large sports complex called the Elizabethtown Sports Park is located along this route and has been required to limit the access from KY 1357 to their site due to inadequacies of this roadway. Generally traffic is allowed to exit the park onto the roadway during large events. A new elementary school is under construction near the west end of the project and should be open in 2015. This section has narrow lanes and little to no shoulders. Some of the ditches are deep and very close to the edge of the roadway. Numerous drainage and maintenance issues exist along this route. Improvements to this roadway would provide a continuous link from US 31W just south of Hardin Memorial Hospital to Ring Road between US 62 and KY 361.

The purpose of this project is to provide a safer, more efficient route between Ring Road (KY 3005) and US 31WB.

The selected consultant will be required to conduct Preliminary Engineering Studies to identify appropriate typical sections, utility impacts, line and grade, and dependable cost estimates.

After Preliminary Engineering and Environmental work is complete, the Department may initiate a contract modification for Final Roadway Design for this project. Final Design will include the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans and cost estimates.

The Department will provide statewide aerial imagery and LiDar data for the project area. The consultant will be responsible for any additional ground survey required to complete preliminary and final design. This may include, but is not limited to: topo work, control, monumenting, drainage pick-ups, drainage situations, pavement tie downs, property corners, utility locations.

Photogrammetry will be added via contract modification or completed via separate letter agreement contract if deemed necessary. Prequalification for 'Photogrammetry And Related Services' is not required to respond.

XI. STRUCTURE DESIGN

The Selected Consultant is responsible for the necessary engineering services to submit to the Department an Advanced Situation Folder(s) for the appropriate applicable structure(s).

The Selected Consultant is not required to be prequalified in Structure Design for spans under 500 feet. However, should the Selected Consultant be prequalified in this area, the Department may add these services by contract modification during Final Design.

The Department reserves the right to retain all Structural Design services for the project.

XII. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The Department will provide all Geotechnical Services for the project.

Traffic projections and related information will be provided by the Department.

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
