### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Project Description - Minor widening (2 + 1 concept) from the Simpson/Warren County line

north to the Buchanon Park entrance (MP 0.0 to MP 4.258)(14CCN)

### III. PURPOSE AND NEED

US 31W is a vital and heavily traveled connection between Bowling Green and Franklin. The increasing traffic is creating safety and mobility issues for motorists and commercial vehicles along the corridor.

The project was identified as the No. 4 transportation need for District 3 in the 2013 District Transportation Plan. Resulting from that recommendation, this project was identified in the FY 2014-2016 Enacted Biennial Highway Plan.

The purpose of this improvement is to address the safety and mobility issues along US 31W and to provide a safe and reliable connection from Franklin to Bowling Green.

#### IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

### V. SCOPE OF WORK

The Selected Consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Preliminary

Engineering and Final Roadway Design. Preliminary Engineering includes line and grade plans, traffic engineering analysis as per Design Memo 03-11, preliminary drainage, and cost estimates. Final Roadway Design includes, at a minimum, preparation of drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans including storm water construction and post construction Best Management Practices (BMP), signing and pavement marking plans, traffic control plans, final cost estimates, and an anticipated construction schedule. Geotechnical Engineering includes all field work and lab work necessary to provide a Geotechnical Roadway and Structure Report.

## VIII. METHOD OF DESIGN

The Selected Consultant shall utilize the most recent CADD Standards for Highway Plans Policy in the development of the highway plans.

#### IX. ENVIRONMENTAL

The Department will provide environmental services for this project anticipated to be an Environmental Overview. The Consultant will be responsible for providing any necessary exhibits or plans needed by the Department for the assessment.

# X. PHOTOGRAMMETRIC SERVICES

The Department will provide either photogrammetry and aerial mapping or Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) terrain (mobile) mapping. The Selected Consultant shall supplement this information with conventional surveying as needed.

#### XI. STRUCTURE DESIGN

The Selected Consultant shall provide the necessary engineering service to submit an Advanced Situation Folder(s) to the Department for the appropriate applicable structure(s) anticipated to be two or three box culverts. The Structure Design will be performed by the Department.

### XII. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The Selected Consultant will provide all Geotechnical Services required for the project.

# XIII. TRAFFIC

The Traffic projections and related information will be provided by the Department.

# XIV. UTILITIES

The Selected Consultant shall locate all existing utilities and locate them on the plans provided to the Department. The Department will develop the utility contact list. All utilities including aerial carriers shall be field-verified by the Selected Consultant. Sizes and types of underground and aerial utilities shall be identified on the plans.

- 3. Past record of performance on projects similar in type and complexity. (10 Points)
- 4. Project approach and proposed procedures to accomplish the services for the project. (10 Points)
- 5. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed. (2 Points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
