This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for a Professional Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

# I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Project Description – To provide NBI/Element Level/Fracture Critical Inspections of twenty-four (24) Ohio River Bridges on a statewide basis during 2016 and 2017 calendar years.

## III. PURPOSE AND NEED

To ensure the continued structural safety and capacity of bridge structures for use by the motoring public by providing NBI/Element Level/Fracture critical inspections, current load ratings, and design plans for necessary maintenance items.

NBI/Element Level/Fracture Critical inspections are mandated by the FHWA and shall be performed in accordance with the National Bridge Inspection Standards. Reports are filed with the Division of Maintenance records as well as recorded electronically. Copies of reports are also shared with the District personnel and adjoining state DOT's. Inspection reports are used to determine needed repairs, allow for KYTC to prepare a budget for future years and share information and trends with other states.

Load Ratings are also mandated by FHWA. Copies of these reports will be provided to the Division of Maintenance Load Rating Staff as well as electronic files. Load Rating reports and files will be used by KYTC to maintain current ratings.

Design plan sets will be provided to KYTC and become part of project proposals for maintenance items such as, deck overlay, joint rehabilitation, and miscellaneous steel repairs necessary to maintain, restore, and extend the service life and capacity of the structures.

### V. SCOPE OF WORK

Five (5) consultants will be selected (1, 2, 3, 4 and 5). The consultant ranked first will be awarded first choice of the five (5) packages. The consultant ranked second will be awarded the choice of the remaining four (4) packages. The consultant ranked third will be awarded the choice of the remaining three (3) packages. The consultant ranked fourth will be awarded the choice of the remaining two (2) packages. The consultant ranked fifth will be awarded the remaining package. Each consultant must be prepared to make selection at the time of notification of ranking by the Selection Committee. Inspections packages are randomly listed and do not necessarily reflect the order of importance or anticipated contract size.

### VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Department may modify the Selected Consultants Agreement to include additional bridge inspections and/or necessary bridge maintenance engineering services associated for this project. The additional related engineering services may be requested up to a contract upset limit of \$150,000 above the initial contract amount for each contract package.

# X. EVALUATION FACTORS

- 3. Unique bridge inspection access techniques to minimize traffic. (20 points)
- 4. Consultant's past performance on similar projects. (10 points)
- 5. Capacity to comply with schedules (10 points)
- 6. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed (2 points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
