This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for a Professional Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Project Description - Extend the existing 4-Lane on Liberty Road from Graftons Mill Lane

(MP 1.145) to New Circle Road (MP 0.0) and improve intersection with

New Circle Road (16CCN)

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

Project Manager - Joshua Samples, P.E. User Division - Highway Design

Approximate Fee - \$400,000 Preliminary Engineering (Lump Sum)

Project Funding - STP Funds (Federal Funds)
Project Length - Approximately 1.145 miles

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The purpose of improvements to Liberty Road is to increase roadway capacity, correct roadway deficiencies to better serve the numerous residential areas along the project corridor, and provide a more efficient route for persons traveling through the project corridor.

The project should address traffic concerns of residents and provide them more efficient access to busy commercial areas along New Circle Road and Man O' War Boulevard and numerous community facilities along the roadway. The project should also address the concerns of pedestrian and bicycle traffic as well.

The project is needed to address the increased traffic due to residential growth since the 1980s along the project corridor. Improvements to the existing roadway geometry is needed to address safety concerns and to accommodate vehicle, pedestrian, and bicycle traffic.

This project will complete the improvements to modernize Liberty and Todds Roads (KY 1927) within the city limits.

IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their Response to Announcement. An additional page will be allowed with the Project Approach (page 7) in the Response to Announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the Evaluation Factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected Consultant will be required to provide Preliminary Roadway design, including the preparation of engineering studies, identification of appropriate typical sections, identifying any utility impacts, performing drainage design, developing dependable cost estimates, conducting and preparing documents for public meetings, and traffic modeling.

The selected Consultant may be required to provide Final Roadway Design which may be added to the contract agreement by a Contract Modification when Preliminary Engineering is complete. Final Roadway Design includes, at a minimum, the preparation of any design studies, joint inspection plans, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, signing plans, traffic control plans, final cost estimates, and an anticipated construction schedule.

The selected Consultant shall utilize the most recent CADD Standards for Highway Plans Policy in the development of the highway plans.

IX. ENVIRONMENTAL

Any necessary Environmental Services will be provided by the Department.

X. PHOTOGRAMMETRIC SERVICES

KYTC will provide photogrammetry. The selected Consultant may be required to collect

additional information by conventional survey methods.

XI. STRUCTURE DESIGN

Structure Design is not anticipated for the project. The Department will provide Structure Design required for the project if necessary.

XII. GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES

The Department will provide all Geotechnical Services required for the project.

XIII. TRAFFIC

The traffic projections and related information will be provided by the Cabinet. The selected Consultant will then be required to provide engineering services to design any traffic signals and lighting deemed necessary.

XIV. UTILITIES

The selected Consultant will be responsible for determining the impact of all design alternates to existing utilities to determine feasibility of redesign or utility relocation and cost estimates.

- 3. Past record of performance on projects similar in type and complexity. (15 Points)
- 4. Capacity to comply with project schedule. (10 Points)
- 5. DBE Participation Plan. (4 Points)
- 6. Consultant's offices where work is to be performed. (2 Points)

For state-funded projects, if a Selection Committee vote results in a tie between two (2) firms, one (1) of which will perform more of the work tasks in Kentucky than the other, then the former firm shall be ranked one (1) place ahead of the latter.
