This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for a Professional Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This statewide contract is to provide necessary Statewide Environmental Investigation and Remediation Services. Two (2) consultants will be selected to provide these services on an asneeded basis for two years.

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

Project Manager - ODail Lawson

User Division - Environmental Analysis

Approximate Fee - \$1,000,000 per contract (Specific Rate of Compensation)

Project Funding - State Funds
Contract Term - Two Years

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

Our mission is to keep the KYTC facilities in environmental compliance status as stipulated in the 1992 Memorandum of Agreement between KYTC and EEC. In order to achieve this, the Division of Environmental Analysis is responsible for overseeing any necessary environmental investigations and/or corrective action. Additional staff and specific regulatory knowledge is needed periodically to accomplish this objective to keep these facilities in environmental compliance. Each Consultant may be asked to perform such studies, develop and implement the above-mentioned plans along with providing regulatory and compliance knowledge as needed to maintain KYTC facilities in environmental compliance.

IV. DBE REQUIREMENT

The Consultant team may include a DBE Participation Plan with their Response to Announcement to help the Department meet the 11.95% DBE goal established by FHWA. The plan would demonstrate how DBE companies will be mentored or used to assist in the area(s) pertaining to this contract. If included, an additional page will be allowed in the Project Approach (Section 7) to exhibit this plan. No additional points will be provided in the Evaluation Factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected consultants may be required on an as needed basis to provide Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) based site assessments, evaluations, characterizations and remediation plans and control compliance reviews in accordance with RCRA, CERCLA, KY Underground Storage Tank (UST) regulations, the Clean Water Act and the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). This includes sampling, reporting, remediation and other environmental concerns.

VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Department reserves the option to modify the selected Consultants' agreement to include any necessary engineering and/or related services for this project. The firm(s) or one of their subconsultants must at that time be pregualified by the Department in the required area(s).

Two (2) consultants will be selected to provide these services for a period of two (2) years with no new work assigned after two years from the Notice to Proceed, although the contract may be extended for time to complete work already assigned. Contracts will have an upset limit of \$1,000,000. Once the upset limit is reached or the two year term has expired, services will be readvertised and no additional work assignments will be made under the contract. Contract will not be modified to increase the upset limit or extend for time to assign new work.

Two (2) regional divisions will be shown for the state, and the consultant should note in the proposal which regions that they can adequately cover with the specified personnel. The two (2) regions are denoted as follows:

Region 1: Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 Region 2: Districts 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12

This contract will be negotiated as an actual cost for the person, travel, lodging, per diem, overhead, and profit. The cost per hour will include the pay rate for the personnel classifications providing the reviews, overhead, travel expenses, profit and all other direct and indirect cost incurred by the Consultant to accomplish the work.

The hourly rates should be included <u>as a separate page</u> within the Consultant's Response to Announcement.
