Dear Secretary Buttigieg,

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is requesting funding for the Safe Streets for Lexington Project located in Lexington, Kentucky. A primary goal of the project is to reconstruct a portion of New Circle Road to implement significant safety upgrades.

The project will install restricted crossing U-turn (RCUT) intersections along the corridor, a proven countermeasure to reduce serious and fatal injuries at intersections. It will also double the number of signalized pedestrian crossings to address a history of serious and fatal mid-block pedestrian crashes. Existing right-of-way will be repurposed to install shared use paths on both sides of the street, connecting to a regional trail to the north and a major shopping center to the south. Other elements include improved lighting, intersection treatments, improved transit stops, streetscape upgrades, raised crossing islands, and other safety measures.

The request also includes a robust multi-year public education campaign and a Vision Zero Coordinator to provide follow-through on the city's safety initiatives. The project is expected to significantly improve pedestrian, bicycle and transit access and to increase safety for all modes both along the New Circle Road corridor and across the city.

As such, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is committing \$1,450,000 to the Safe Streets for Lexington Project.
