1. QUESTION: Does KYTC already possess terrestrial LiDAR data and terrestrial imagery that shall be used to perform the inventory? If so, can KYTC provide information regarding the existing data such as LiDAR equipment and camera specifications, LiDAR format, imagery format (and if images are geolocated), and any (if known) proprietary data, hardware, or software restrictions?

ANSWER: The Cabinet has both mobile and aerial LiDAR images with <u>these sensors</u>. 2. QUESTION: For existing data, will the consultant be required to work within a repository environment hosted by KYTC, or will the consultant be given a copy? If the consultant is required or allowed to work externally from KYTC's environment, what is the minimum storage capacity needed?

ANSWER: Consultants will have access to the existing dataset and will be able to work within an environment of their choice, or with a supplemental vendor.

3. QUESTION: Would KYTC consider allowing proposers to demonstrate relevant project experience and technical capabilities in lieu of holding those specific prequalifications?

ANSWER: To avoid eliminating any technical experts based on a lack of prequalification, KYTC has decided to change the prequalification requirements of this contract to "optional." Interested teams should detail their technical expertise as it relates to the RFP throughout their response. It remains important that consultants are familiar with KYTC's data image system, linear referencing system, and conceptual transportation planning process previously covered by the prequalification areas. The ability of a project manager to relieve time and effort on the part of the Department remains of critical importance. Teams must still have access to the Professional Services Portal in order to submit responses.
