A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for a Professional Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

The purpose of this project is to improve safety, traffic flow, and function of KY-56 in order to provide a safer and more reliable route for residential and commercial traffic traveling to and from Morganfield. This section of KY-56 connects from US 60 in downtown Morganfield through the Morganfield Bypass to KY-141. It provides the connection to businesses and services in Morganfield as well as residential properties. This roadway is comprised of an urban typical section within the Morganfield City Limits from MP 13.1 to MP 13.75 with the remaining project being rural in nature to consist of narrow lanes and shoulders. This section of KY-56 also contains a few geometric deficiencies as well as undesirable intersection layouts. In addition, there are a few access management issues that need to be addressed.

IV. DBE GOAL

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their Response to Announcement to help the Department meet the 11.95% DBE goal established by FHWA. The plan should demonstrate how DBE companies will be mentored or used to assist in the area(s)

pertaining to this contract. An additional page will be allowed in the Project Approach (Section 7) to exhibit this plan. A maximum of four (4) points will be considered in the Evaluation Factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

The selected Consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Preliminary Engineering and Environmental Services to make necessary improvements along KY-56 from downtown Morganfield at MP 13.1 through the Morganfield Bypass and intersection with KY-141 to MP 19.8. This would include addressing geometric deficiencies, improving functionality issues, and addressing any other concerns. Preliminary Engineering includes preliminary line and grade plans, traffic engineering analysis as per Design Memo 03-11, preliminary drainage and preliminary structure design, cost estimates, and gathering any necessary survey for the project area.

This project may be advanced to Final Design upon the completion of Preliminary Engineering with a Contract Modification. The selected Consultant will then be required to provide engineering services to perform Final Roadway Design, including the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans, and cost estimates as well as any other services that KYTC chooses not to perform with in-house forces.

VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Department may retain any of the advertised services to be performed by in-house state forces.

VIII. METHOD OF DESIGN

The selected Consultant shall utilize the most recent CADD Standards for Highway Plans Policy in the development of the highway plans. Refer to the 2019 CADD Standards for ORD V4 Project Development Memo for information pertaining to the latest CADD Standards and plan submittal.

IX. ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Some necessary Environmental Services are expected to be provided by the Consultant. The anticipated environmental document will be a Categorical Exclusion Level 2. Prequalification of various Environmental Services are required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement.

X. PHOTOGRAMMETRIC SERVICES

The Department will provide LiDAR digital mapping and will furnish manuscripts on computer disks in DGN format. The selected Consultant shall supplement this information with conventional surveying as needed.

XI. STRUCTURE DESIGN

Structure Design is not anticipated for Preliminary Design. When the project advances to Final Design and if the selected Consultant is retained for Final Design services, the selected Consultant shall do the necessary engineering services to submit to the KYTC an Advanced Situation Folder(s) for the appropriate structure(s). The selected Consultant may be responsible for any necessary Structure Design services. Structure Design of the proposed structure(s) may be added as a Contract Modification. Prequalification in the area of Structure Design is <u>not</u> required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement. However, the selected Consultant must obtain the required qualifications before providing these services or bring a prequalified subconsultant at that time.

XII. <u>GEOTECHNICAL SERVICES</u>

The selected Consultant may provide all Geotechnical Services required for the project. The Preliminary Design contract may include preliminary geotechnical services to review available geological, mining, or other geotechnical information that could influence the selection of the preferred alternate. Geotechnical services necessary for the completion of Final Design may be added by contract modification at the appropriate time. At any time, if the Department has the capacity to provide these services, the Department may retain the advertised geotechnical services. Prequalification in the area of Geotechnical Services is **not** required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement. However, the selected Consultant must obtain the required qualifications before providing these services or bring a prequalified subconsultant at that time.

XIII. TRAFFIC ENGINEERING

The Department will provide all traffic projections and related information.

XIV. UTILITIES

The selected Consultant shall provide a project location map to the Department. The Department will send project location maps to all potential utility contacts to determine whether they may have existing utilities within these project limits. The Department will develop the utility contact list. All utilities including aerial carriers shall be field-verified by the Consultant. Sizes and types of underground and aerial utilities shall be identified on the plans for each alignment alternative in the PL&G submittal.

The selected Consultant may be required to provide utility related services for this project, which may include construction inspection or utility preconstruction coordination. Prequalification in the area of Utility Design is <u>not</u> required to be identified in the Consultant's Response to Announcement.

The selected Consultant will authorize B.U.D. (Before You Dig) to field-locate utilities during final design and any other associated utility location service outside of B.U.D., as needed. The consultant shall perform field surveys to collect the B.U.D. data. Horizontal location of existing utilities shown on final plans shall be adjusted as necessary to reflect actual B.U.D. locates.
