This document constitutes a Request for Proposals for a Professional Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those services as described herein for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Highways.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This statewide contract is to provide services necessary to update the KYTC Public Involvement Plan (PIP). One (1) consultant will be selected to provide these services.

II. PROJECT INFORMATION

User Division - Planning / Office of Public Affairs

Approximate Fee - \$300,000 (Lump Sum)

Project Funding - Federal Statewide Planning & Research Funds (SPR)

III. PURPOSE AND NEED

Early and continuous public involvement is a vital component of the KYTC mission to "deliver a safe, efficient, environmentally sound and fiscally responsible transportation system that delivers economic opportunity and enhances the quality of life in Kentucky." States are required by 23 CFR § 450.210 to develop and use a documented public involvement process that provides opportunities for public review and comment at key decision points. States are also required to periodically review the effectiveness of the process, as appropriate.

The public involvement space has undergone a wholesale change since the adoption of the previous KYTC PIP in 2020 – which itself was only a small update from the previous plan to incorporate some virtual elements. To ensure meaningful and effective public involvement in this new era with a variety of tools available, the development a new PIP and supporting documentation from the bottom-up is needed.

IV. DBE GOAL

The Consultant team shall include a DBE Participation Plan with their Response to Announcement to help the Department meet the 11.95% DBE goal established by FHWA. The plan should demonstrate how DBE companies will be mentored or used to assist in the area(s) pertaining to this contract. Consultant teams are advised that the intersection of public involvement with transportation planning may offer the potential for new DBE relationships to be formed. An additional page will be allowed in the Project Approach (Section 7) to exhibit this plan.

A maximum of five (5) points will be considered in the Evaluation Factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

V. SCOPE OF WORK

Items to be completed may include but not be limited to:

- Develop and Document a meaningful Public Involvement Process in full compliance with 23 CFR § 450.210, <u>Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (and associated legislation)</u>, Executive Orders 12898, 13166, and 14096
- Identify and summarize content of select fellow state DOT Public Involvement Plans
- Coordinate public review of draft plan and incorporate comments into final plan
- Develop supplemental materials for various audiences (public, MPO, ADD, Legislature) which can be used as handouts
- Develop internal and external graphics showing project lifecycles and project development process
- Clearly document processes and tools for holding public involvement activities at key decision points across all types of KYTC efforts

VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

The Department reserves the option to modify the selected Consultants' agreement to include any necessary engineering and/or related services for this project. The firm(s) or one of their subconsultants must at that time be prequalified by the Department in the required area(s). The Department may retain any of the advertised services to be performed by in-house state forces.
