#### Justification

FTA 5307 funding for the City of Ashland to purchase two 24/2 Cut-a-way buses from the Kentucky Public Transit Authority for FY2019. Total cost for <u>each</u> 24 x 2 cut-a-way bus = \$93,025 (Total for both buses = \$186,050).

# RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT #7 TO THE 2018-2021 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND 2040 METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN (MTP)

- WHEREAS, KYOVA Interstate Planning Commission has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governors of West Virginia, Kentucky and Ohio for the Huntington, WV-KY-OH Urbanized Area acting through the West Virginia Department of Transportation/Division of Highways (WVDOH), the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) and locally elected officials in the KYOVA region; and
- WHEREAS, KYOVA has adopted a 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP); and
- WHEREAS, per the requirements of the Transportation Performance Management statutes and regulations, the safety performance measure targets must be included in the metropolitan transportation plan; and
- WHEREAS, the Tri-State Transit Authority (TTA) and Ashland Bus System (ABS) have requested amendments to the 2018-2021 TIP and 2040 MTP; and
- WHEREAS, the project information was available for a 15-day public review as outlined in the Huntington, WV-KY-OH Participation Plan and received no comments; and
- WHEREAS, the Huntington, WV-KY-OH Urbanized Area regional emissions are required for the conformity report, due to the court vacating the revocation of the 1997 8-hour ozone standard. This area is in attainment for the 2008 8-hour ozone standard; and
- WHEREAS, the insignificance finding of the 1997 PM2.5 annual NAAQs means no regional modeling is required as the Huntington-Ashland area is in attainment for the 24-hour 2006 PM2.5 standard; and
- WHEREAS, it has been determined that all proposed transit project amendments to the 2018-2021 TIP and 2040 MTP require no conformity determination based on 40 CFR 93.126 Table 2 Exempt Projects, Mass Transit;
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Policy Committee of the KYOVA Interstate Planning Commission, at a regularly scheduled meeting on December 6, 2018 adopts the attached project list as Amendment #7.

# RESOLUTION APPROVING SUPPORT OF ESTABLISHED WEST VIRGINIA, KENTUCKY, AND OHIO STATEWIDE SAFETY PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- WHEREAS, KYOVA Interstate Planning Commission has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governors of West Virginia, Kentucky, and Ohio for the Huntington, WV-KY-OH Urbanized Area acting through the West Virginia Division of Highways (WVDOH), the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), and locally elected officials in the KYOVA region; and
- WHEREAS, per Federal Rule 23 CFR 490 States are required to establish targets for five federal-aid highway safety performance measures applicable to all public roads; the measures are: the number of fatalities, number of serious injuries, rate of fatalities, rate of serious injuries, and number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries; and
- WHEREAS, the performance measures are required to foster transparency and accountability, and help track safety progress at regional, state, and national levels; and
- WHEREAS, the West Virginia Division of Highways has established a statewide target to reduce fatalities and serious injuries by 50% and 66%, respectively, by the year 2030 which translates as the following numeric statewide targets: 274.2 fatalities, 1,188.3 serious injuries, 1.450 fatality rate, 5.877 serious injury rate, and 84.5 non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries; and
- WHEREAS, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet has established the following statewide targets: 737 fatalities, 2,991 serious injuries, 1.5 fatality rate, 6.07 serious injury rates, and 276 non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries; and
- WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Transportation has established a statewide 1% annual reduction target across all five performance measures which translates as the following numeric statewide targets: 1,062 fatalities, 8,834 serious injuries, 0.91 fatality rate, 7.60 serious injury rate, and 836 non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries; and
- WHEREAS, Metropolitan Planning Organizations must establish targets for their respective areas within 180 days of the State's establishment of targets; and
- WHEREAS, the Policy Committee has analyzed and determined that it will support the established West Virginia Division of Highways' safety targets in Cabell and Wayne Counties; and
- WHEREAS, the Policy Committee has analyzed and determined that it will support the established Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's safety targets in Boyd and Greenup Counties; and

- WHEREAS, the Policy Committee has analyzed and determined that it will support the established Ohio Department of Transportation's statewide safety targets in Lawrence County; and
- WHEREAS, the KYOVA Interstate Planning Commission (MPO) does hereby agree to plan and program projects so that they contribute toward the accomplishment of the West Virginia Division of Highways' state safety targets for Cabell and Wayne Counties, West Virginia, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's state safety targets for Boyd and Greenup Counties, Kentucky, and the Ohio Department of Transportation's state safety targets for Lawrence County, Ohio;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the KYOVA Interstate Planning Commission does hereby support the 2019 highway safety performance targets for the following states: the West Virginia state targets for Cabell and Wayne Counties, West Virginia; the Kentucky state targets for Boyd and Greenup Counties, Kentucky; and the Ohio state targets for Lawrence County, Ohio.
