As Louisville continues to grow in this area, there is a need for better connectivity and accessiblity from both existing and approved new neighborhoods to the recreational amenities in the 746-acre park which includes athletic fields, tennis and basketball courts, a playground, and extensive path and trail system used by pedestrians, cross-country teams and others. The 100-mile Louisville Loop is a shared use path planned to traverse McNeely Lake Park as it moves across the southern part of Louisville from the Jefferson Memorial Forest to the Parklands of Floyds Fork connecting neighborhoods, schools, work places and other community facilities.
