



VISION SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

A Kentucky law, House Bill 439,* took effect January 1, 2025 requiring vision screening (a test of visual acuity and visual field) at the time of renewal of a driver's license or instruction permit.

Kentuckians who opt to take the free screening at a Driver Licensing Regional Office may wear corrective eyewear. The screening may only be performed once per renewal cycle in a regional office.

NEXT STEPS

Your screening at a Kentucky Driver Licensing Regional Office indicates that you **do not** meet the minimum vision requirements for continuing the driver's license renewal process. You will need to see a vision specialist (an optometrist or ophthalmologist) of your choice for further testing and completion of the DRIVER VISION TESTING CERTIFICATION Form TC 94-202 before continuing the driver's license renewal process. Ask your preferred vision specialist if they have the form when making your appointment. *(Please note that vision specialists may charge a fee for their services.)*

You will not need to retake a vision screening in our office once you return with the completed form. You may also renew online at dlrenewal.ky.gov by uploading the form.

Your driver's license will remain valid until its expiration date.
