All online licensing services require a myDrive account. Create an account, connect it to your Kentucky credential on file, and use your unique Letter ID code to complete the account verification process.

Don't have a Letter ID?

Request one to be mailed to the address on file when creating your myDrive account. Delivery takes 5-10 business days so plan ahead to avoid waiting. You can also request a Letter ID at any Driver Licensing Regional Office or find it printed on your temporary ID given at the end of your in-person visit.





Taking a written or road test with Kentucky State Police (KSP)?

Once you book an appointment with KSP on their website, you can pre-apply on myDrive to save time on your appointment day. The myDrive pre-application is a readiness tool to ensure you are prepared when you come into the office to avoid a second trip. Just show your pre-application confirmation barcode when you come into the office to jump start the process.



myDrive is the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's new driver services online portal to enhance convenience for Kentuckians. Starting June 8, 2026, drivers who wish to conduct online transactions will need to create a verified myDrive account to access eligible services and can pre-apply by submitting information before visiting a Driver Licensing Regional Office. While drivers must still bring the required identity and supporting documents, but pre-applications will reduce wait times and speed up in-office processing.

With myDrive, You Can:

-  **Pre-apply Before Visiting an Office**
Save time and arrive prepared for all licensing services.
-  **Renew or Replace ID**
Replace lost ID, or renew license (need completed vision screening form).
-  **Update Info and Track Card Status**
Update your address, confirm license status and check card printing status.
-  **Manage Reminders and Communications**
Sign up for card expiration reminders, add emergency contact, view official messages, and more.

Commercial Driver License (CDL) Changes:

To save you time, trips and paperwork:

Medical certificates are submitted electronically from approved medical examiners directly to the National Registry II under the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration. KYTC no longer accepts paper copies of medical certificates from CDL drivers. Commercial Learner's Permits are now valid for one year and cannot be renewed. The MyCDL portal has been discontinued. Waivers and self-certifications can be submitted through myDrive.
