Implementation Status of HJR 46 -

- Preparing information for production of 106 MOAs from awards contained in HJR 46.
- MOAs to be sent out for processing on or about 7/1/2025, when funding is available.



FY 2026 County Priority Projects Program ("CPPP") & Local Assistance Road Program ("LARP") Update

<u>Implementation Status of LARP -</u>

- Updated application form includes LARP requirements:
 - a. Photos every 300 ft (17.6 per mile);
 - b. Project no more than \$500,000;
 - c. Local Match required, and;
 - d. Must be rehabilitation projects (designed to restore original condition).
- Reporting forms prepared and ready to capture required information as provided by local agencies.
- Scoring Matrix has been developed by KYTC Highways staff to be utilized by all Districts.



County Priority Projects Program Local Assistance Road Program

- The Local Assistance Road Program (LARP) sets out modified requirements and guidelines for the County Priority Projects Program (CPPP) in HB 546 from the 2025 Legislative Session.
- Application Cycle opens June 1, 2025 closes on October 1, 2025.




COUNTY PRIORITY PROJECTS PROGRAM "The Basics"

Funding for FY 26 is \$20 million (+carryover).

Application cycle begins June 1, 2025, and ends October 1, 2025.

Updated application Form TC 20-41 is available on the KYTC DRMA website.


Complete Application Fully

Length of project in miles and beginning and ending mile points are very important and are found on the KYTC Local Maps website Photos Must be submitted for every 300 ft of each project

(17 photos per mile)

Each project must be <u>no</u> more than \$500,000.

You may apply for more than one project.



Local Match is required.

(See next slide for percentages)

Projects must be rehabilitation projects

designed to restore original condition. No other improvements or increased capacity.

PER HB 546 ("LARP") – Matching funds must be provided by the local agency – Road Aid Funds may be used for this purpose.

How are roads scored?

Evaluation is calculated using the following:

- Raveling (Good, Fair, Poor)
- Rutting (Yes/No, Depth)
- Longitudinal & Transverse Cracking (Good, Fair, Poor)
- Utility Cuts (Good, Fair, Poor)
- Pattern/Block Cracking (Good, Fair, Poor)
- Potholes (Count & Density)
- Base Failures (Count & Density)
- Pavement Dropoff
- ADT (Average Daily Traffic)
- Recent Improvements (Yes/No)
- Safety, Cost and Priority within the District

- Phase I and II:
 - i. 45 Bridges funded:
 - 30 replacement projects
 - 15 repair/preservation projects
 - ii. Total funding authorized \$18,450,614
- Phase III
 - a) Pending: \$26,445,748.20
 - b) Funding available: \$6,549,386



PHASED APPROACH TO "CCBIP" APPLICATION SUBMISSION

FY 2026 CYCLE DATES - \$25 million authorized for FY2026

- Phase I funding for FY 2026 opens July 1, 2025 closes August 29, 2025
- **Phase II funding for FY 2026** begins September 1, 2025 closes November 14, 2025
- **Phase III funding for FY 2026** begins November 17, 2025 closes February 13, 2026
- **Phase IV funding for FY 2026** begins February 16, 2026 closes May 1, 2026

In planning for a bridge replacement or repair project, your first step should be to contact your Chief District Engineer's Office in your Transportation District to assist you in confirming inspection findings involving your bridge, discussing corrective actions, and providing necessary recommendations to correct deficiencies.

PLEASE NOTE THE CCBIP IS AN ADDITIONAL PROGRAM – the 80/20 Rural Secondary Bridge Program is still available as well.


