- The meeting was called to order by Vince Carman at 9:32am
- Having a quorum, the commissioners voted to approve the 2020 2nd Quarter Minutes
 - Jamie motioned to approve the 2020 2nd Quarter meeting minutes, Bob seconded, all in favor
- Bob gave the treasurer's report details
 - The current balance in the checking account is \$9,000.70. The current balance in the savings account is \$31.23
- Bob explained that Lexington Fayette Urban County Government Paula Nye Grant recipient had not cashed their grant check leaving the account with one check of \$9,000 outstanding.
- Bob expressed he will contact Lexington Urban Fayette Urban County Government concerning the outstanding uncashed check.

- Vince and Doug discussed COVID-19's impact of funding received from the Share the Road license plates sales.

- Vince suggested reaching out the Kentucky Bike Walk Coalition to promote the sale of the Share the Road license plates.
- Vince suggested discussion of E-bike classifications and legislation to define E-bikes.
 - Alex recommended the need of support from both houses of state legislature concerning the issue.
 - Doug suggested the Commission to seek out model legislation beforehand.
 - Bob recommends the Commission get out in front of the issue in regards to education and safety concerns involving E-bikes.
 - o The Commission agreed the need for further discussion on the subject.
- Jamie expressed concern for the need of need Commissioners.
 - Doug suggested the need for women and more diversity within the KBBC.
 - Alex explained that he will reach out to potential KBBC applicants.
- Vince explained the need to follow up with the MOU between the Commission and the Department of Public Health
- Jamie expressed the need that this year's Paula Nye grant applications be distributed and reviewed electronically for the pending 4th quarter meeting due to COVID restrictions.
 - Daniel expressed that he will have those scanned and emailed to the Commissioner's beforehand.
