GENERAL PROJECT NOTE ON UTILITY PROTECTION

Utility coordination efforts determined that there are utilities that will require relocation to accommodate this construction. The information provided below in these Special Notes for Utility Clearance, Impact on Construction may not be exact or complete. The information provided is for the contractor's use in planning the execution of the work. It shall be the road contractor's responsibility to verify the completeness and/or accuracy of all such information being furnished.

Maintenance of Utility Services

All existing utility facilities are to be maintained throughout road construction. Temporary utility services to maintain service are to be provided and paid for by the road contractor as incidental to road construction. No additional compensation will be paid the contractor for temporary work and materials to maintain existing utility services. No unauthorized discharge of sewage due to the road contractor's work will be allowed.

Damage to Utilities

Any intentional or accidental disruption of service due to damage to water or sanitary mains caused by any of the contractor's operations without three days advance notice to the utility owner shall be cause for the Cabinet to charge liquidated damages in the amount of five thousand dollars per day (\$5,000/day) per occurrence against the contractor until such time as the utility main is restored.

Any intentional or accidental disruption of any individual water or sanitary service caused by any of the contractor's operations without three days advance notice to the utility owner shall be cause for the Cabinet to charge liquidated damages in the amount of five hundred dollars per day (\$500/day) per occurrence against the contractor until such time as service is restored.

In the case of a main disruption, liquidated damages shall be charged at the main disruption rate only. Liquidated damages shall not be charged in addition for service disruptions when a main disruption is involved.

Utility Inspection

The Utility Owners will provide inspection when utility work is being performed by the contractor on their respective utility owner's facilities. It will be the road contractor's responsibility to notify the appropriate utility owner for inspection.

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NOTE: DO NOT DISTURB THE FOLLOWING UTILITIES LOCATED WITHIN THE PROJECT DISTURB LIMITS

Do not disturb any underground utilities marked on the road construction plan set. There is existing water and sanitary sewer facilities within the project limits. Additionally, utilities with ongoing relocation efforts underway at the start of road construction are not to be disturbed, as noted below.

The Contractor is fully responsible for protection of all utilities listed above

THE FOLLOWING COMPANIES HAVE FACILITIES TO BE RELOCATED/ADJUSTED BY THE COMPANY OR THE COMPANY'S SUBCONTRACTOR AND IS TO BE COORDINATED WITH THE ROAD CONTRACT

Duke Energy Electric , Cincinnati Bell and Time Warner Cable will begin their relocation work in advance of the road construction. It is their intention to complete their so as not to interfere with the road contractor beginning construction. The utility companies listed will be working concurrently on their relocations and anticipate a clearance date of **May1, 2015.**

THE FOLLOWING COMPANIES HAVE FACILITIES TO BE RELOCATED/ADJUSTED BY THE ROAD CONTRACTOR AS INCLUDED IN THIS CONTRACT

Sanitation District No. 1 (SD1) has manholes that need to be adjusted and have one watertight frame and lid that will require installation. The necessary bid items have been included on the Roadway Summary Sheet in the roadway plans. The road contractor is to coordinate and cooperate with the utility owners until utility relocations are complete. It is expected that all utilities should be complete by **May 1, 2015.**

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The Department will consider submission of a bid as the Contractor's agreement to not make any claims for additional compensation due to delays or other conditions created by the operations of Duke Energy Kentucky, Cincinnati Bell Telephone, and Time Warner Cable. Working days will not be charged for those days on which work on Duke Energy Kentucky, Cincinnati Bell Telephone, and Time Warner Cable facilities delay road work as provided in the current edition of the KY Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction. Should a difference of opinion arise as to the rights of the Contractor and others working within the limits of, or adjacent to the project, the KYTC Section Engineer will decide as to the respective rights of the various parties involved in order to assure the completion of the Department's work in general harmony and in a satisfactory manner, and his/her decision shall be final and binding upon the Contractor.

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SPECIAL CAUTION NOTE – PROTECTION OF UTILITIES

The contractor will be responsible for contacting all utility facility owners on the subject project to coordinate his activities. The contractor will coordinate his activities to minimize and, where possible, avoid conflicts with utility facilities. Due to the nature of the work proposed, it is unlikely to conflict with the existing utilities beyond minor facility adjustments. Where conflicts with utility facilities are unavoidable, the contractor will coordinate any necessary relocation work with the facility owner and Resident Engineer. The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet maintains the right to remove or alter portions of this contract if a utility conflict occurs.

The utility facilities as noted in the previous section(s) have been determined using data garnered by varied means and with varying degrees of accuracy: from the facility owners, a result of S.U.E., field inspections, and/or reviews of record drawings. The facilities defined may not be inclusive of all utilities in the project scope and are not Level A quality, unless specified as such. It is the contractor's responsibility to verify all utilities and their respective locations before excavating.

BEFORE YOU DIG

The contractor is instructed to call 1-800-752-6007 to reach KY 811, the one-call system for information on the location of existing underground utilities. The call is to be placed a minimum of two (2) and no more than ten (10) business days prior to excavation. The contractor should be aware that owners of underground facilities are not required to be members of the KY 811 one-call Before-U-Dig (BUD) service. The contractor must coordinate excavation with the utility owners, including those whom do not subscribe to KY 811. It may be necessary for the contractor to contact the County Court Clerk to determine what utility companies have facilities in the area.
