National Historic Preservation Act

- Section 106 of the Act
 - Federal Agencies must consider effects of their actions on historic properties
 - Provides a mechanism for interested parties to consult
 - These participants are termed Consulting Parties
 - Typically notified by advertising and through project public involvement

The Commitment

- 2011 FHWA-KYTC-SHPO Section 106
 Programmatic Agreement
- Provide Opportunity for Consultation on "Small Projects"
- Web Based Application to Identify Projects and Request Consulting Party Status

FHWA - KYTC

Section 106 Handbook

Opportunities for public and consulting party involvement for "Small Scale" projects will be provided via a consulting party web page to be developed and maintained by KYTC through which project starts can be announced and interested parties may request inclusion in the consultation process. Through consultation with the SHPO, KYTC has identified parties and organizations statewide that may have an interest in developing projects and shall notify them of the availability of the site once created.

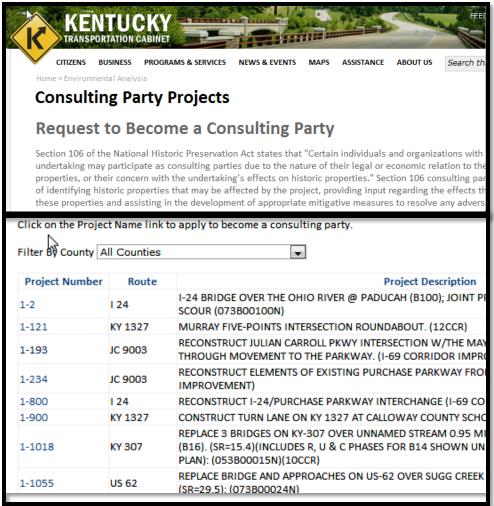

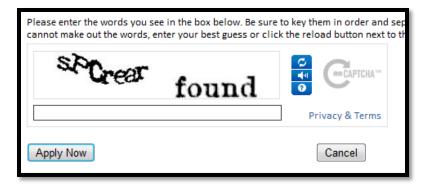
Application Process

 - Projects can be sorted by County
 - Click on Project Number to start

- Pre-Populated with Project Info
- Applicant Provides Contact Info
- Stated Interest
- Security





Application Review Process

- SharePoint Work Flow
- Automatic E-mail notification to KYTC/DEA
 Reviewers
- KYTC On-line Approval
- Automatic E-Mail notification to SHPO Reviewers
- SHPO eApproval Generates Notice of Acceptance to KTYC Reviewers

Data Management

- Does Not Generate Response to Applicant!!!
- Keeps Permanent Record for Approved Users
 (DEA and District Environmental Coordinators)
- Can Be Queried, Sorted, Exported
 - Track Application and Approval Dates
 - Create Mailing List

- Doesn't Address State-Funded Projects with other
 Federal involvement (Corps Permits, etc.)
- Complicated to filter through 6YP projects to keep
 Active Projects list up-to-date
- No elegant way to incorporate Consulting Parties already approved prior to July 2013

Benefits

- Useful for both large-scale and small scale projects
- Could apply on the spot if laptop and internet connection are available at a public meeting
- Applicant keys in information better accuracy
- Accelerated review times
- Robust record storage
