PROJECT DESCRIPTION	Widen and reconstruct US 27 to four-lanes from the Cumberland River Bridge south to the General Burnside Island entrance.

APPROXIMATE FEE	\$300,000 (Lump Sum)
PURPOSE AND NEED	Improve the safety of US 27 to the traveling public and pedestrians; Improve traffic flow and increase the capacity of US 27 from the bridge over the Cumberland River to the General Burnside Island entrance; Reduce traffic congestion in Burnside.
PROJECT LENGTH	1.6 Mile
PROJECT FUNDING	Federal Funds (STP)
METHOD OF DESIGN	The selected consultant shall utilize the CADD Standards for Highway Plans (version 2.04) policy in the development of the Highway Plans.
DBE REQUIREMENT	Consultant team should include a DBE participation plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed in the project approach in response to announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors for the DBE Participation Plan.

AVAILABLE KYTC STUDIES

Phase I preliminary plans with a preferred alignment will be available for review in the Division of Program Performance, 200 Mero Street, Frankfort, Kentucky between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. (EDT), April 11, 2006, until May 17, 2006. Copies will not be available, however a CD containing the alignment with topographic mapping in .dgn format will be available through the Division of Program Performance for \$20.00.

SCOPE

The selected consultant will be required to provide engineering services to perform Phase II final roadway design, including the preparation of any design studies, drainage design, right-of-way plans, construction plans, traffic control plans and cost estimates.

The Department reserves the option to modify the selected consultant's agreement to include any necessary engineering and/or related services for this project. The firm(s) will at that time be prequalified by the Department in the required area(s).
