PURPOSE AND NEED	To improve the safety of US 231 to the traveling public and pedestrians. Improve traffic flow and increase capacity of US 231 from the Natcher Parkway to downtown Morgantown.
PROJECT LENGTH	1.70 Mile
METHOD OF DESIGN	The Selected Consultant shall utilize the CADD Standards for Highway Plans (version 2.0) policy in the development of the highway plans.
DBE REQUIREMENT	Consultant team should include a DBE participation plan with their response to announcement. An additional page will be allowed in the project approach in response to announcement to convey this plan. A maximum of 4 points will be considered in the evaluation factors to DBE participation.
